We have contributed our thoughts, our plannings, and our efforts. We leave it in your hands--for your criticism, and we hope for your approval.






We, the annual staff of 1953, dedicate this yearbook to our Homecoming Queen, Joyce Anderson, who died of polio on October 7, 1952.

. . . May this tribute help preserve the ideals in which she believed and which she practiced.






STUDENT COUNCIL








