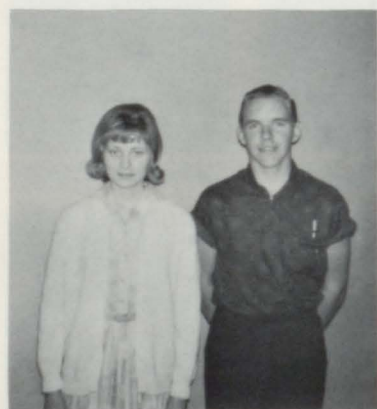
Top Leaders Reap Deserved Rewards

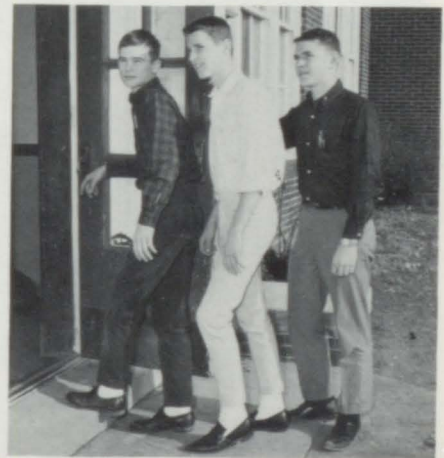

Mrs. Marble obtained a paper-back book library for the students this year. Anyone who was interested could buy the books.

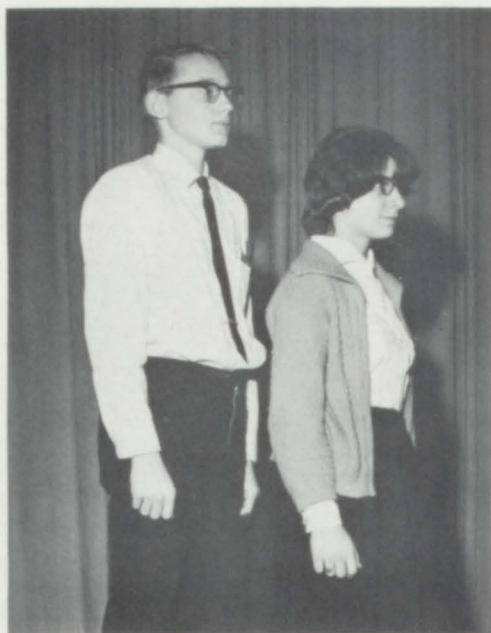
