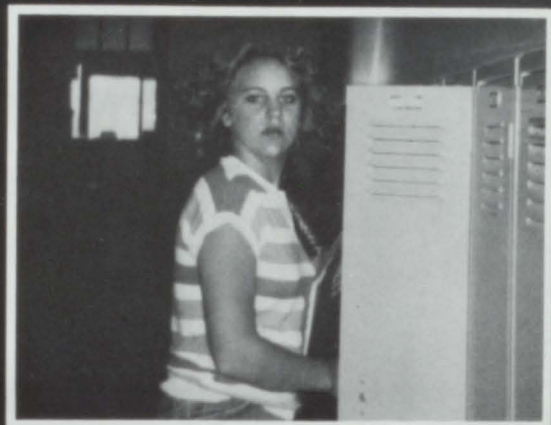

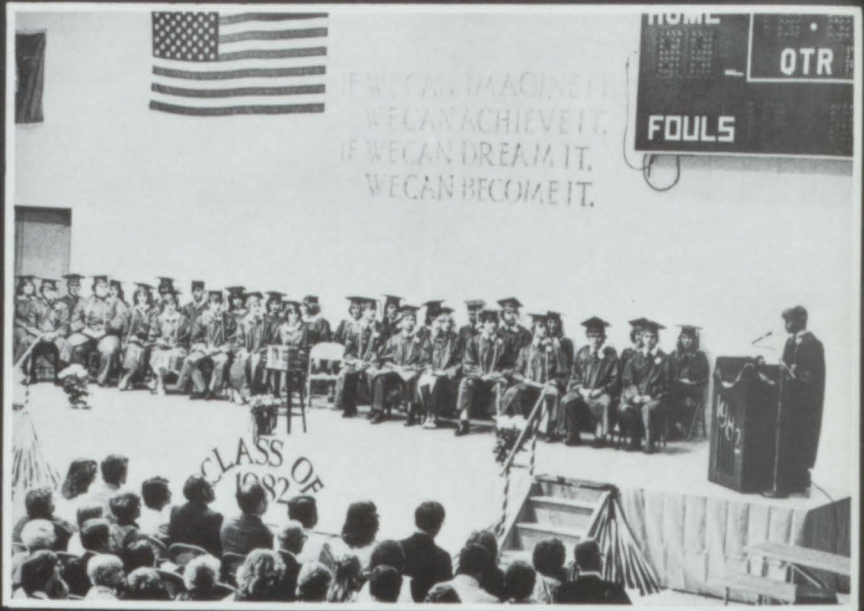


# A Sad Time A Happy Time Graduation 1982

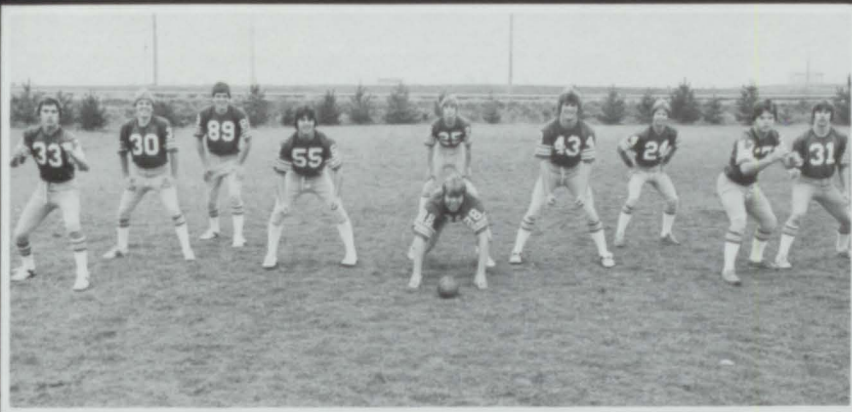

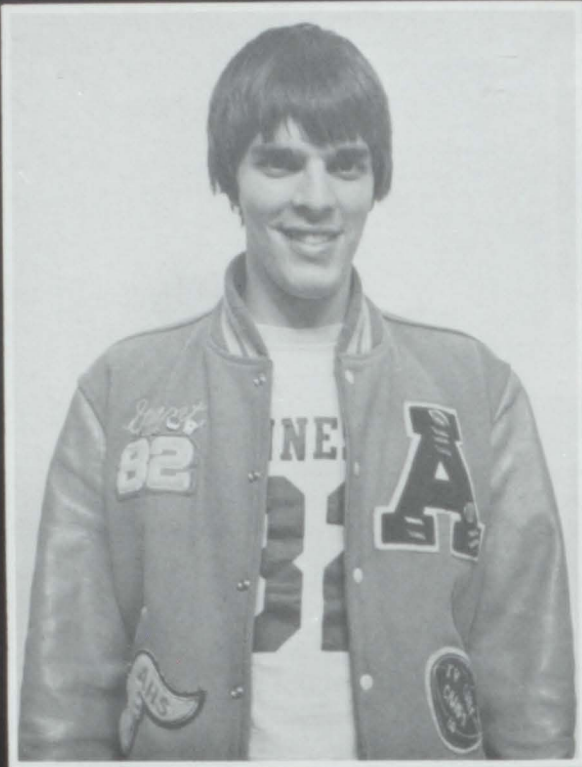

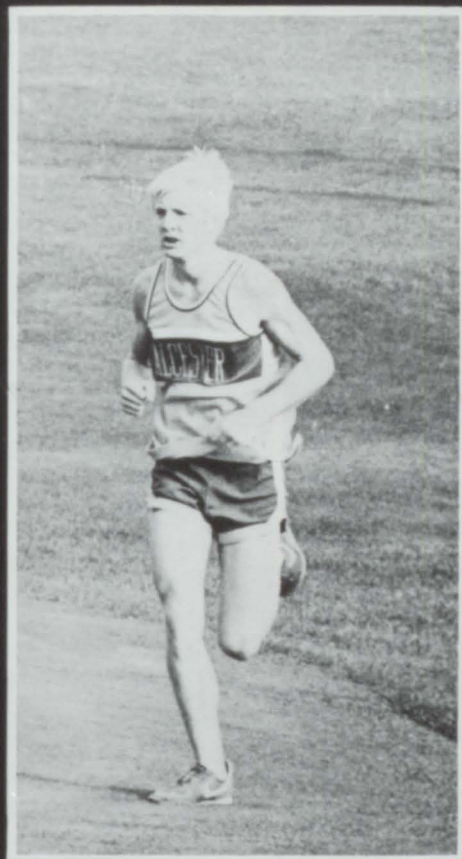
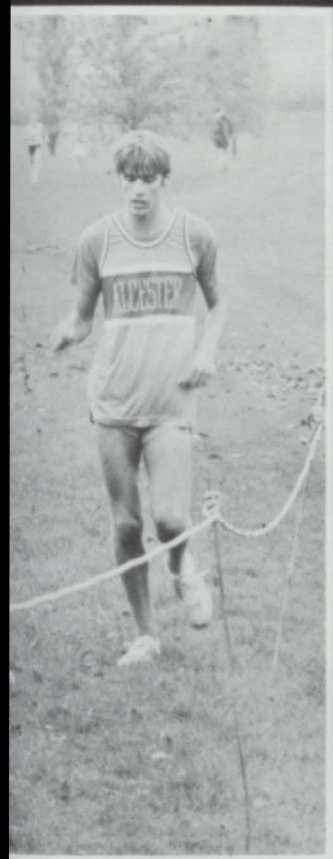
The Cross Country team had a good year, qualifying 3 runners for the State meet.

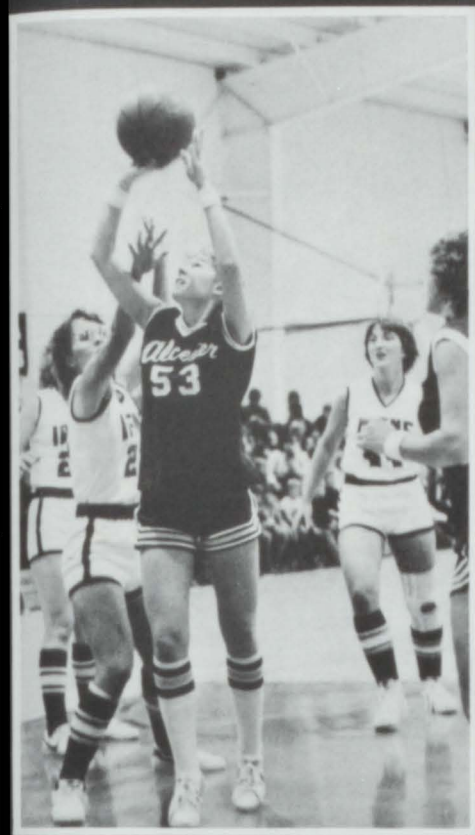
## Girls Gain Experience

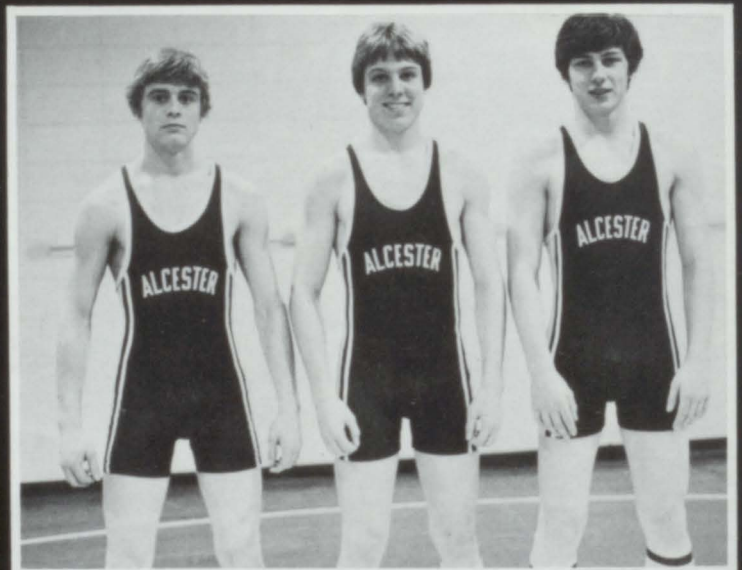

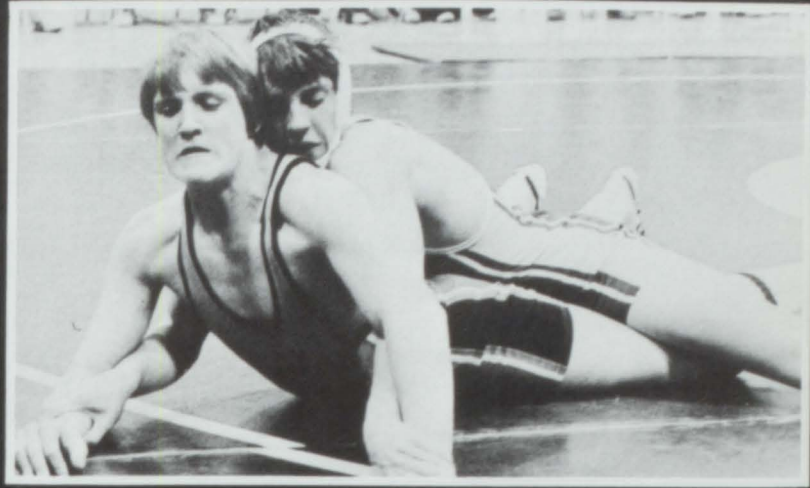

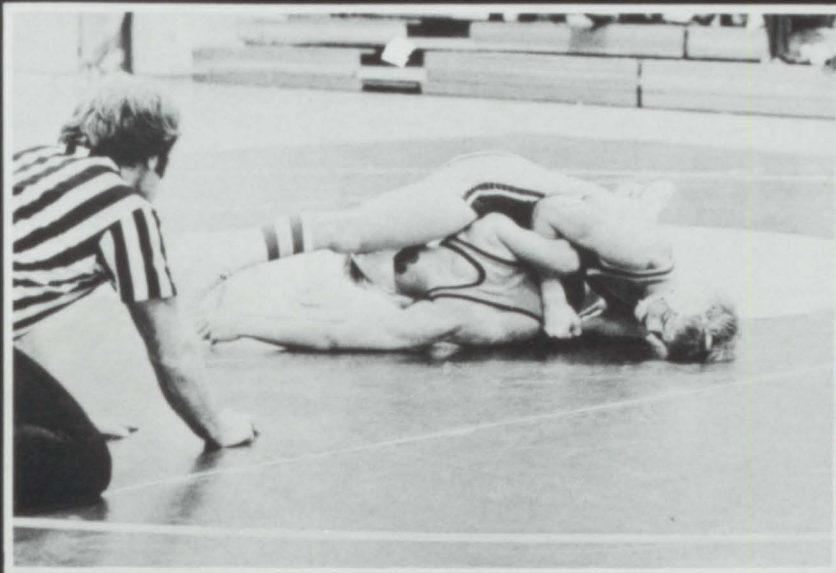

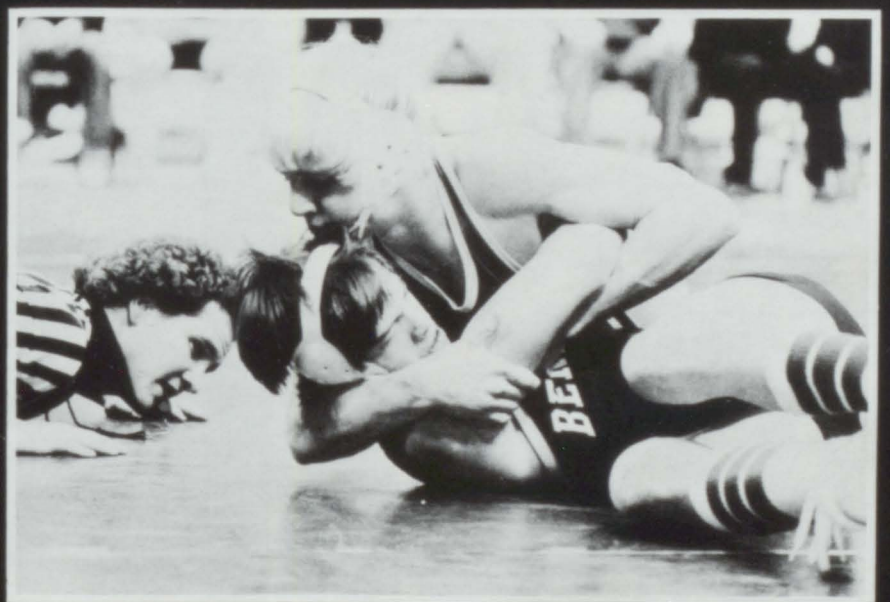

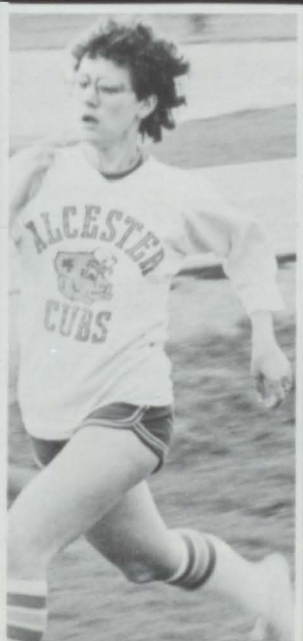

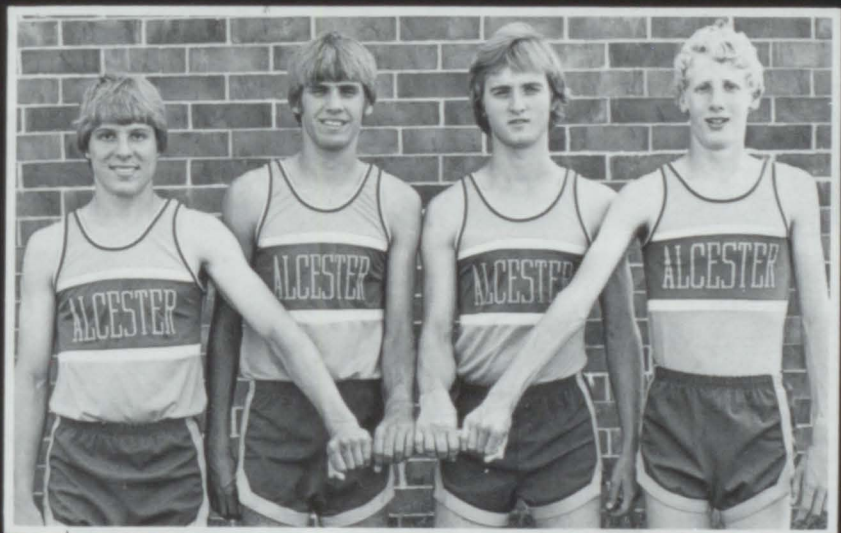

All the cheerleaders spent many long hours learning new cheers, planning pep rallies, and working on unique ways to show school spirit.

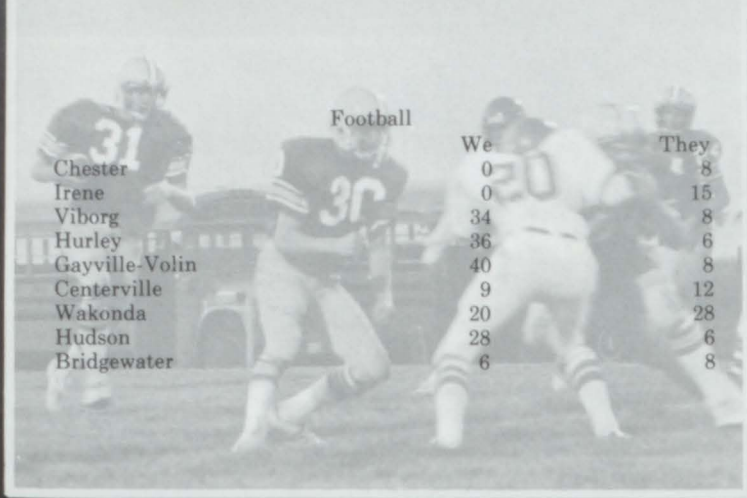
