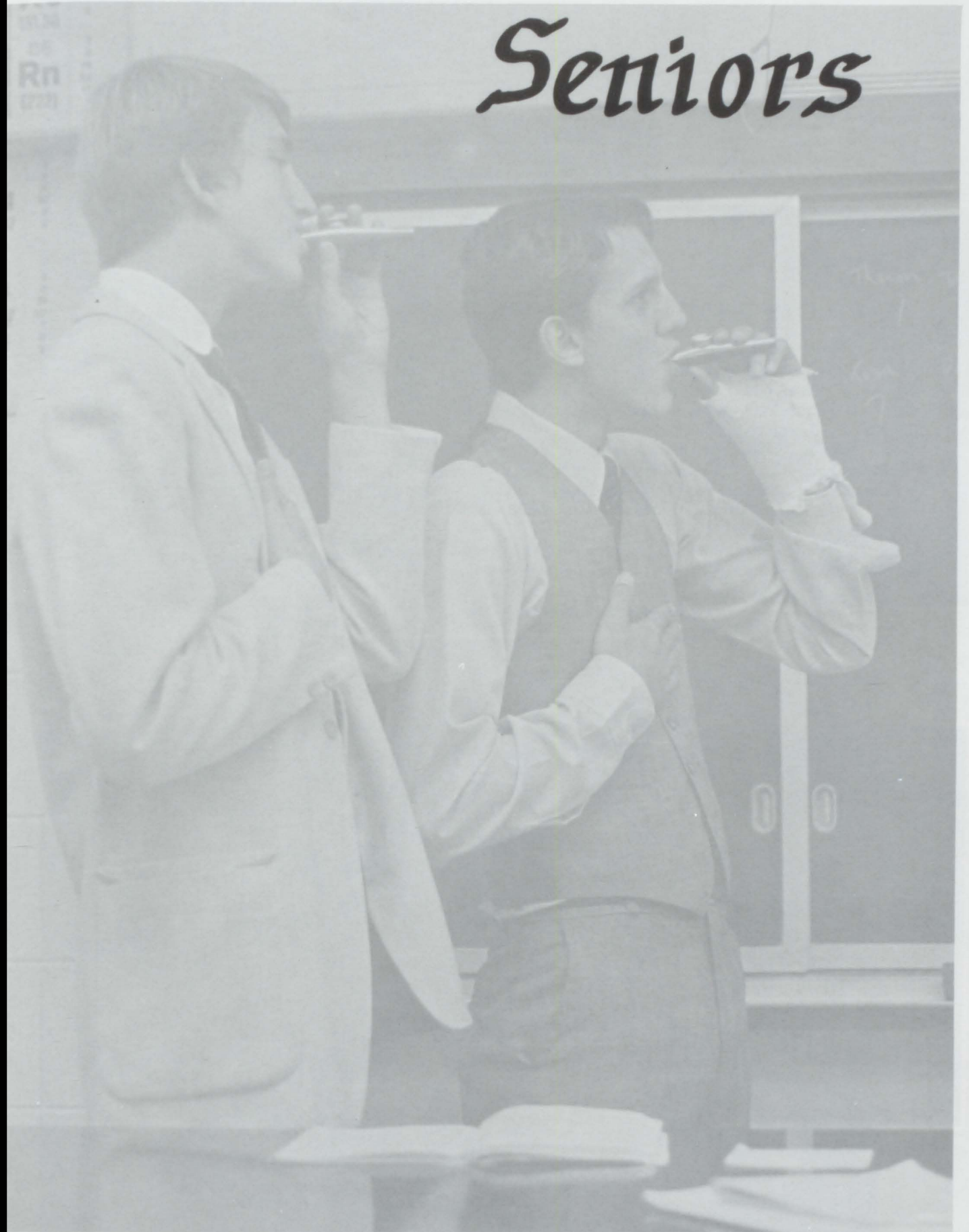
Some of the Cubette staff went to a workshop at SDSU, and they gained a lot of helpful information.

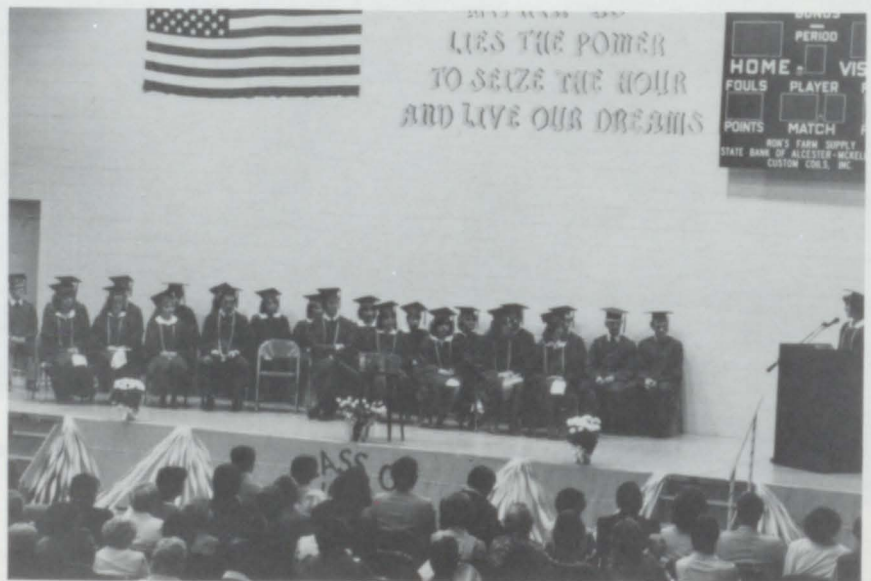

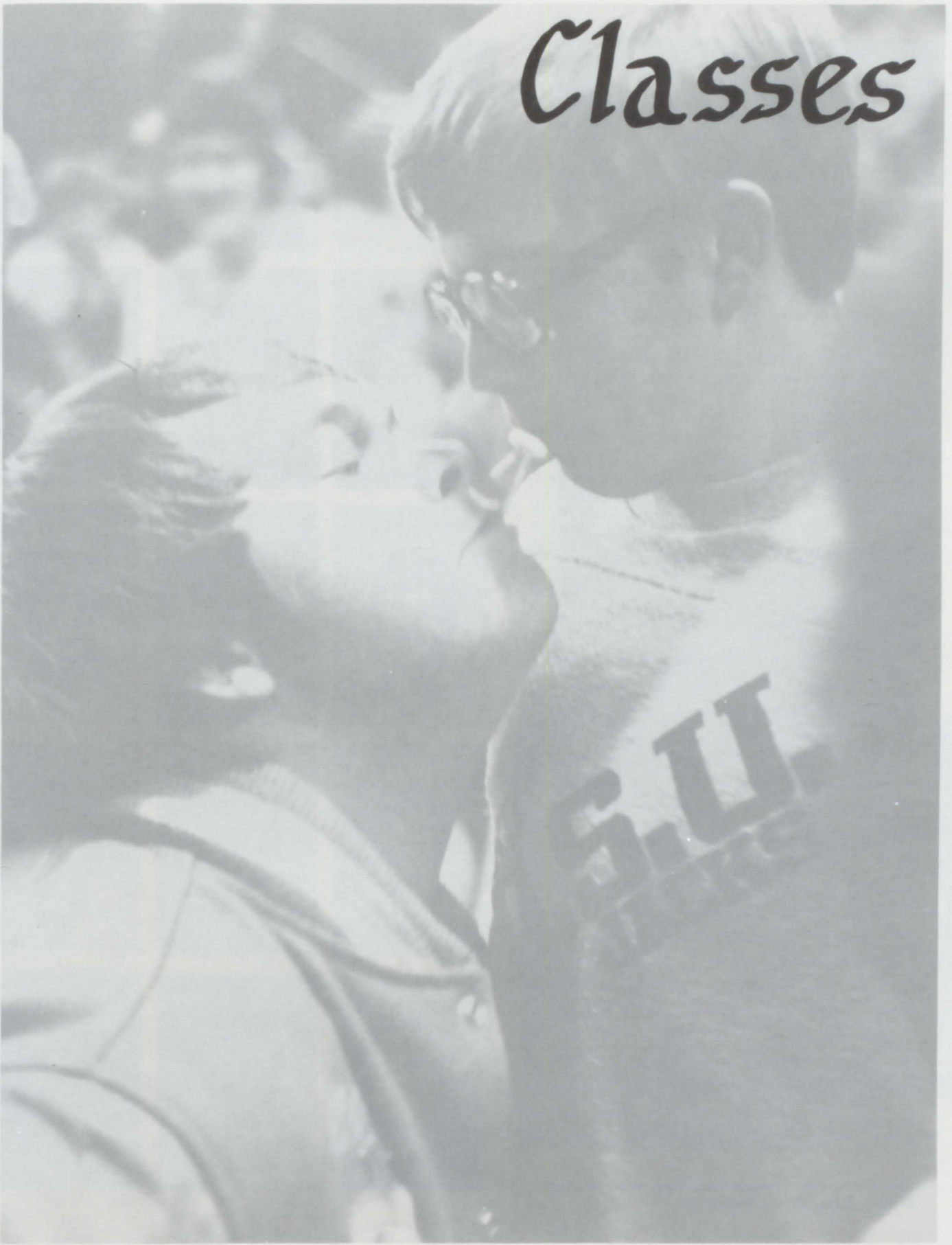

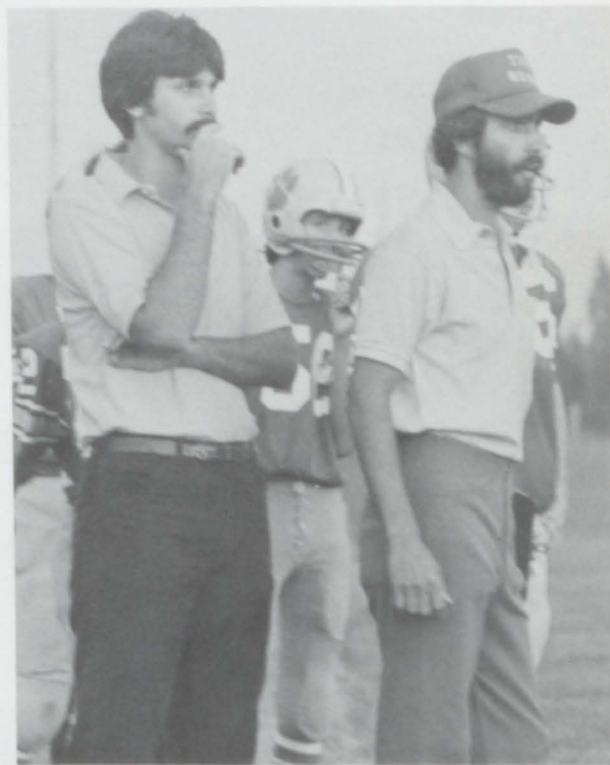


Young Team Strives For Winning Season

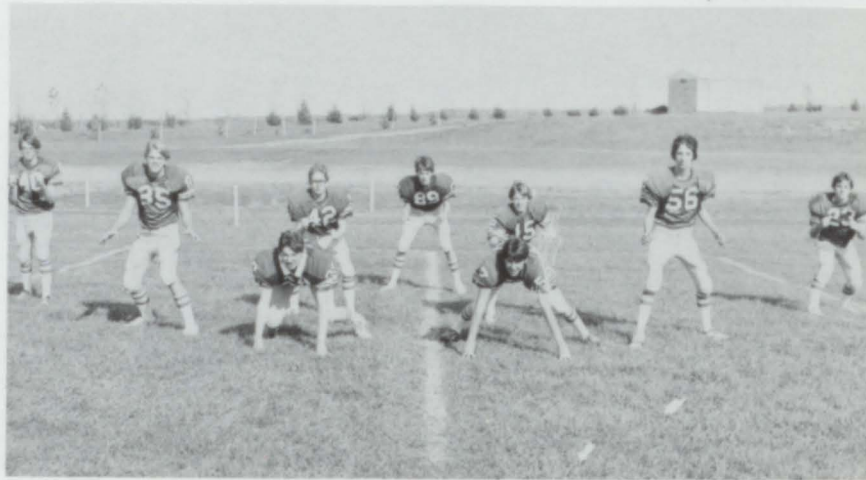

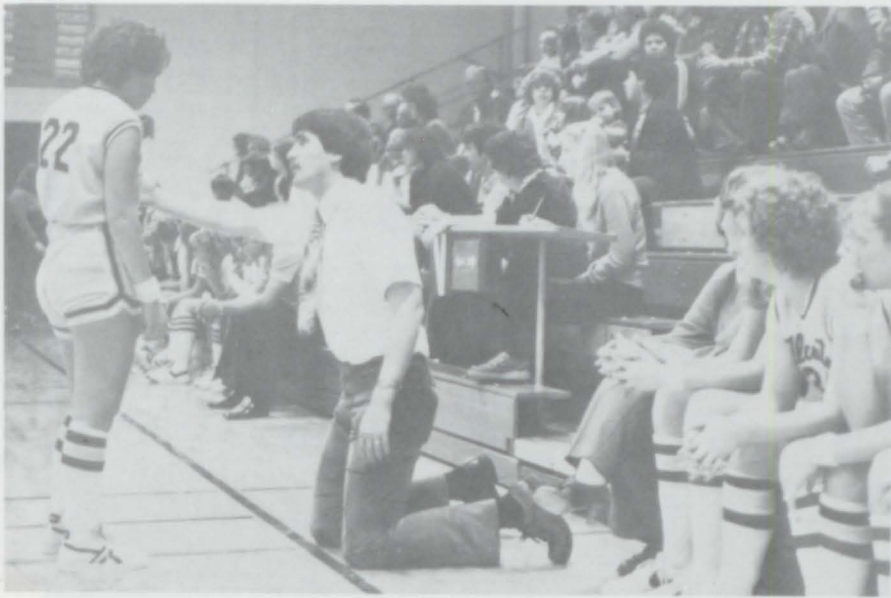
New Coach Comes To Alcester

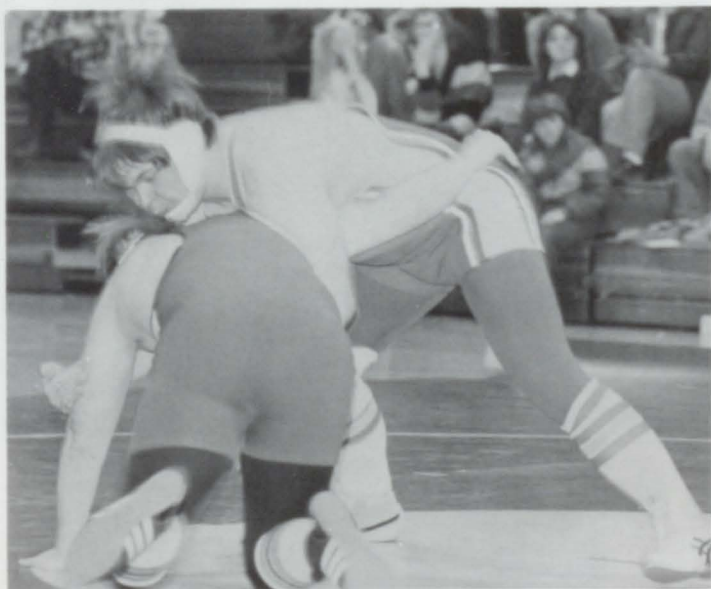
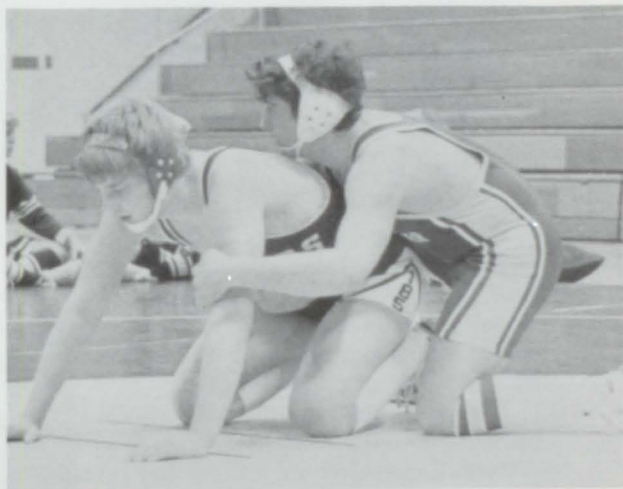
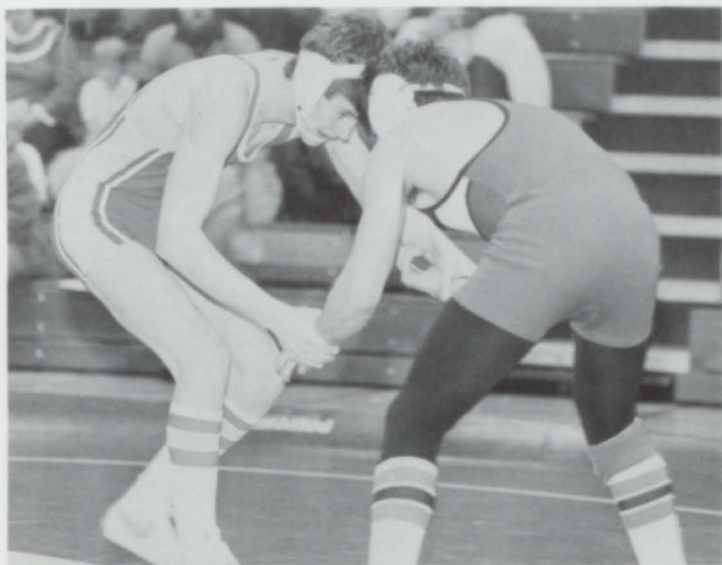
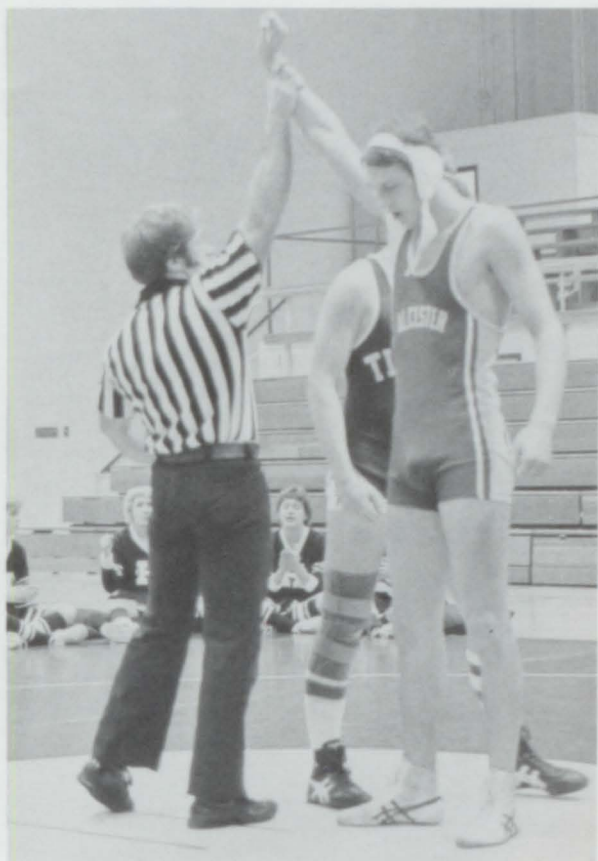
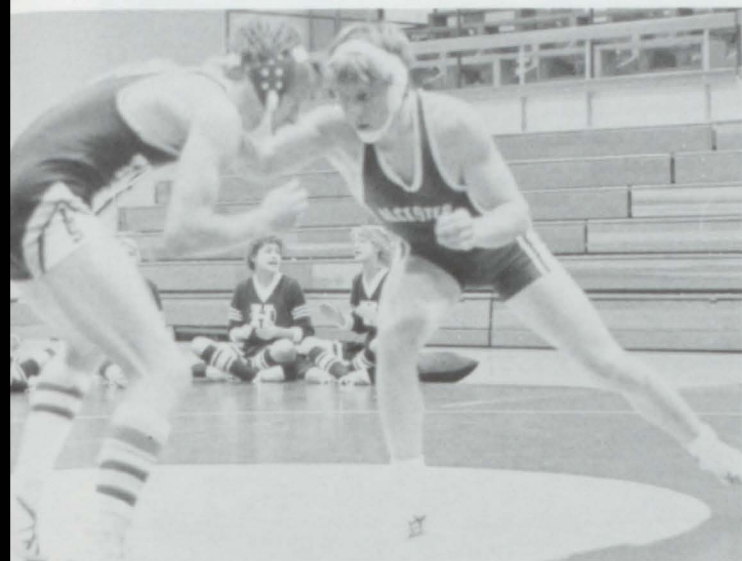
Wrestlers End Season Well

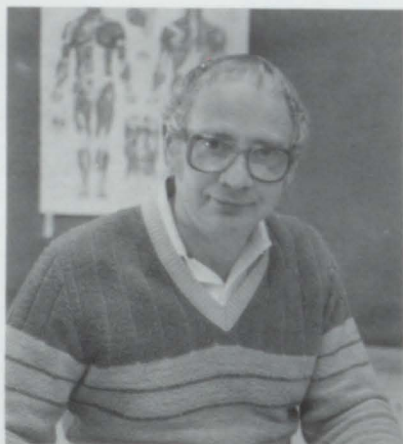

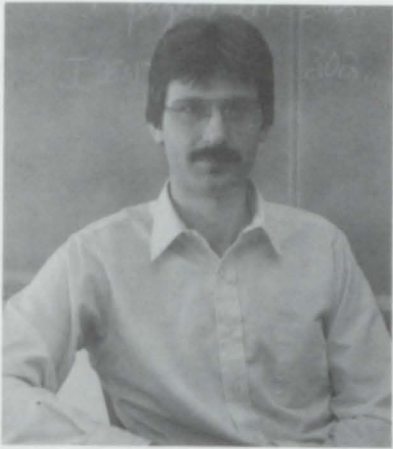

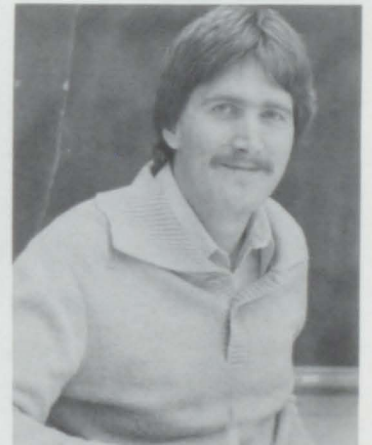
