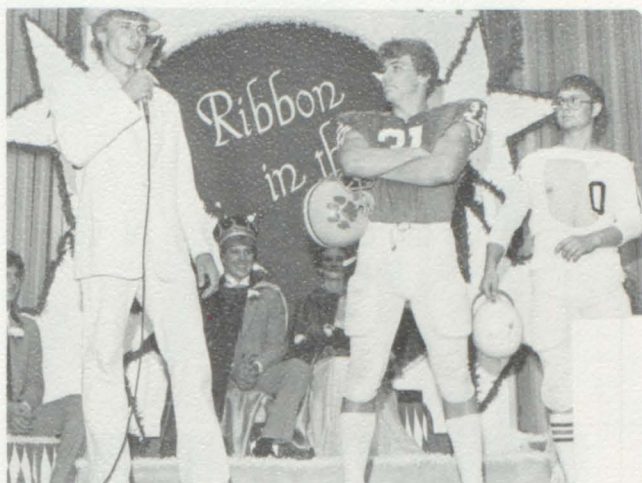

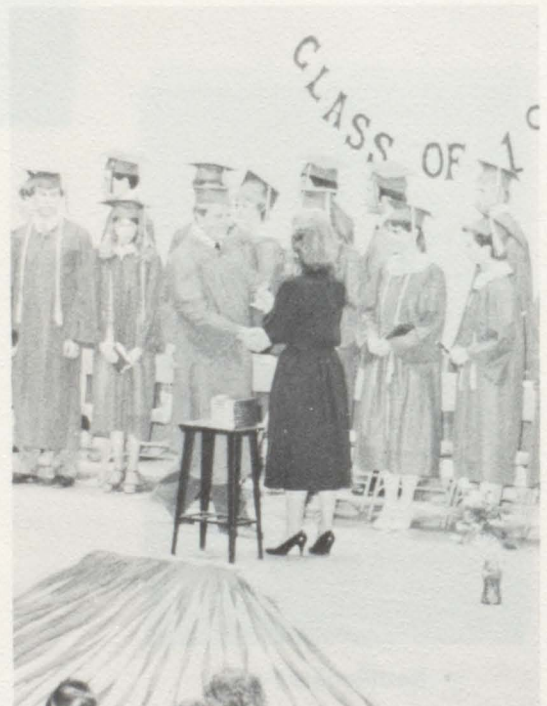
THE CLASS OF 1984....

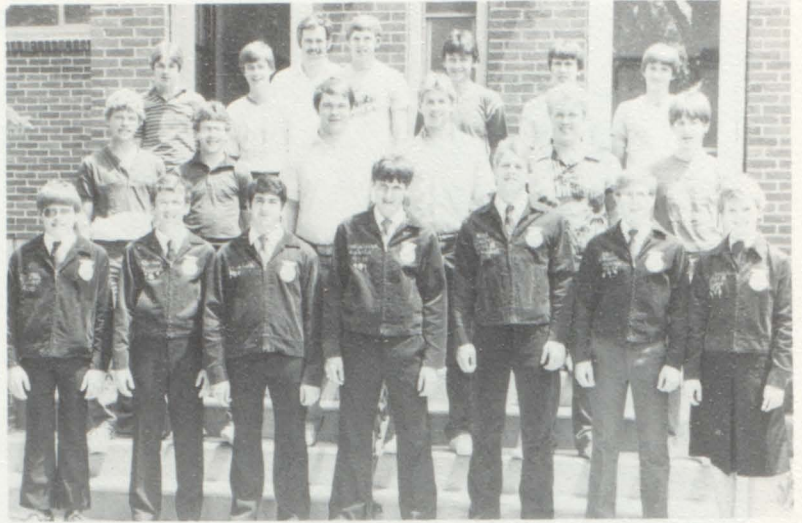

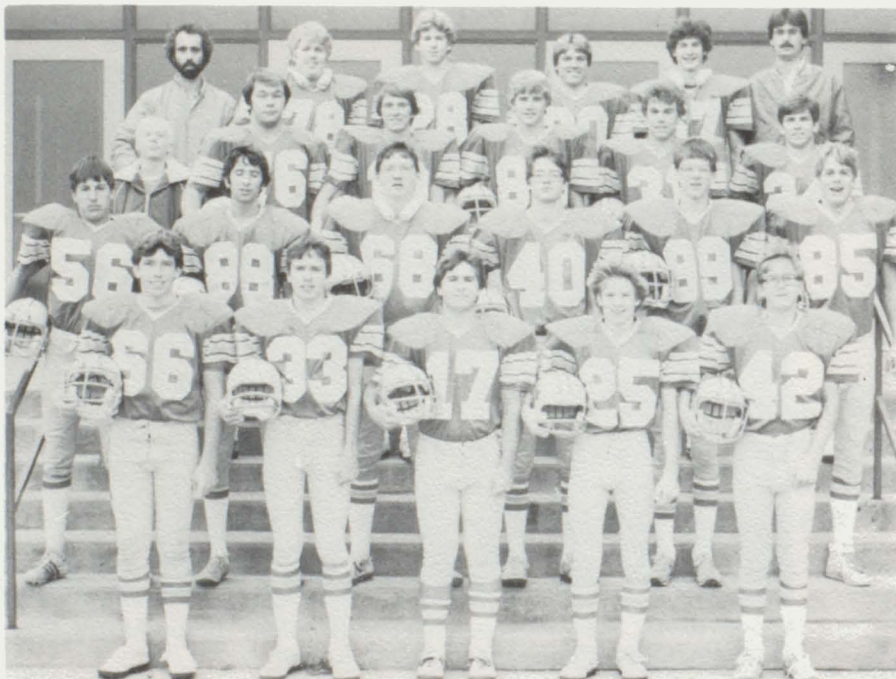

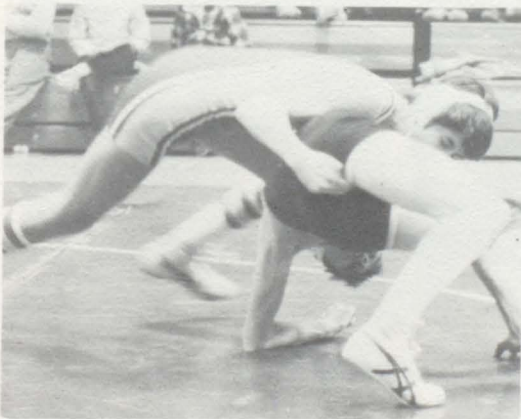

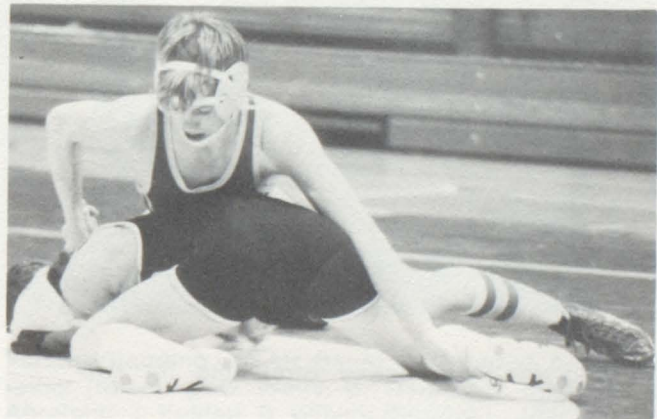
