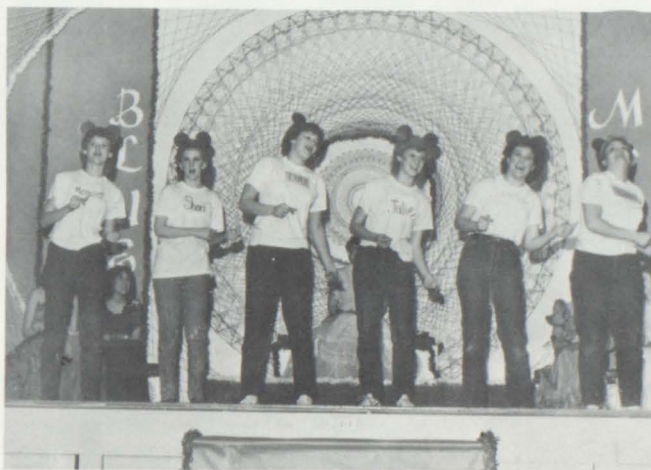
“Old-Fashioned” Sweetheart At AHS

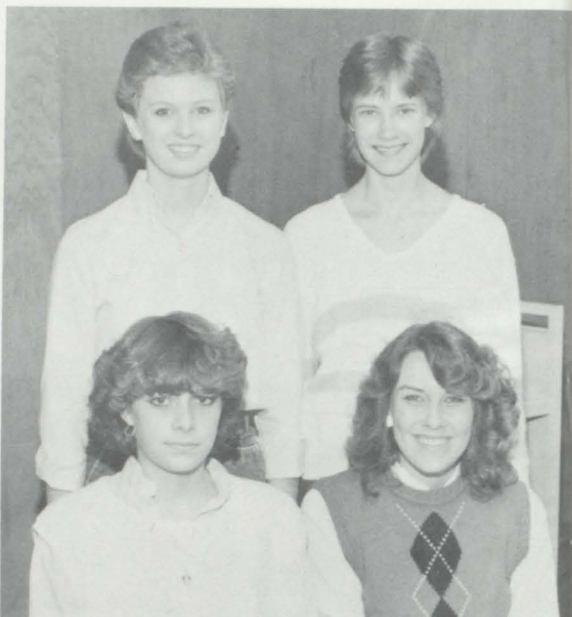

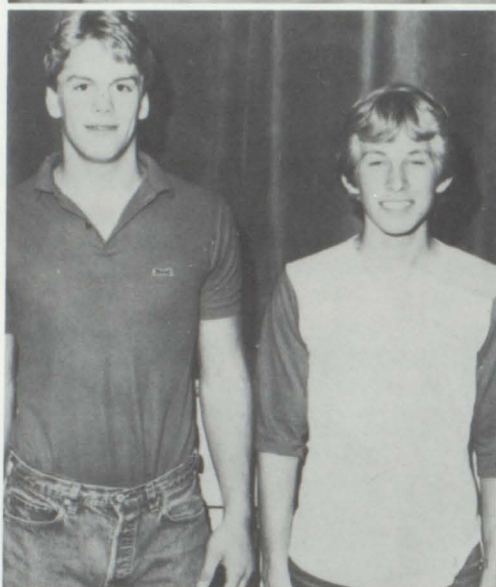

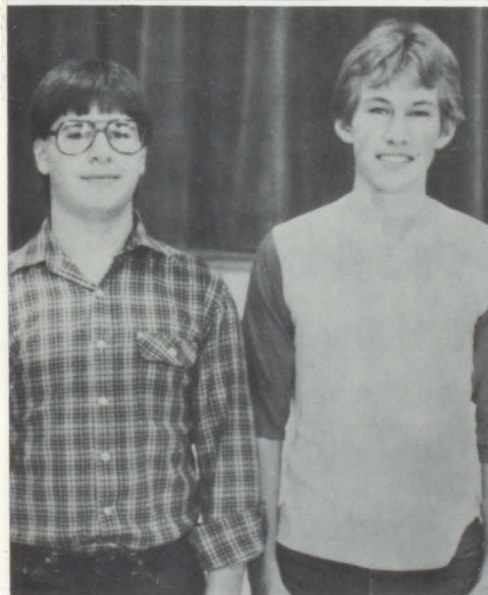

After Christmas there was a busy time getting ready for the Vocal Contest in Vermillion. Then the swing choir had another contest to attend which was specifically for them.

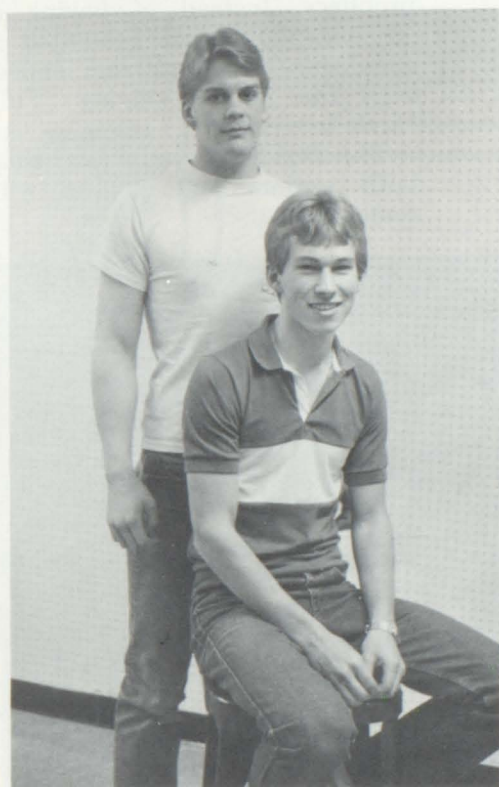

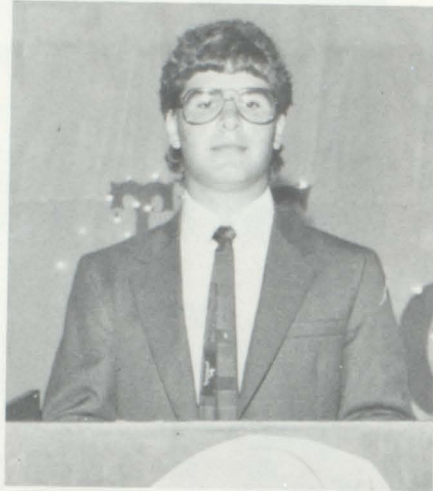

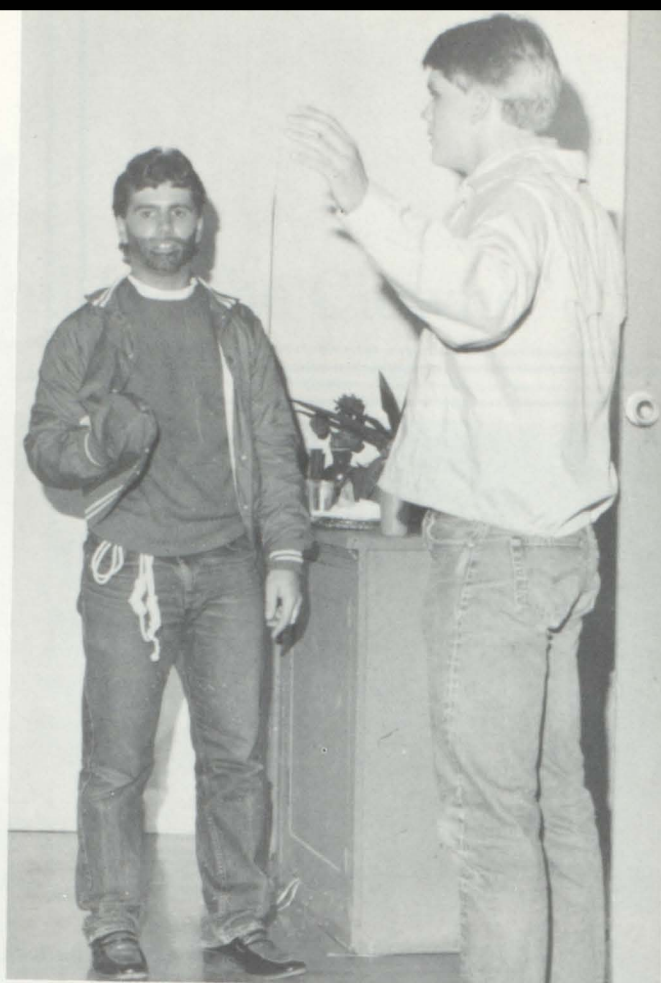
Magic! Magic! Is Everywhere!

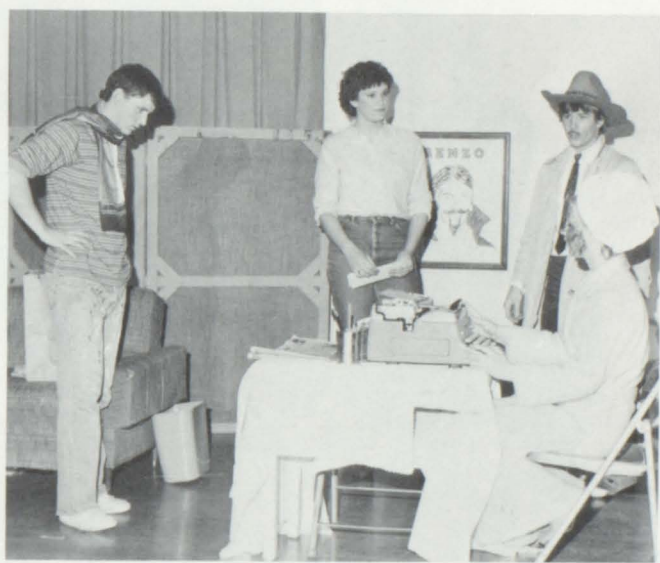

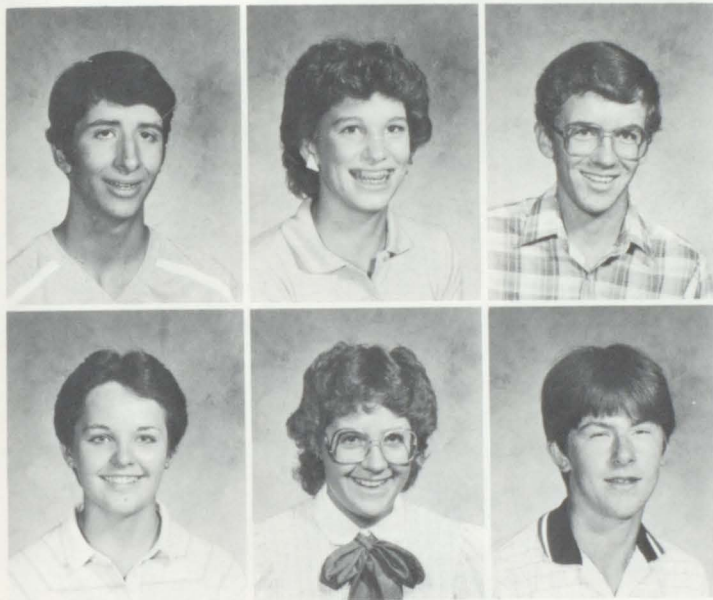
The juniors have one more year left, and although they have been anxious to become seniors, they kept busy with several activities.

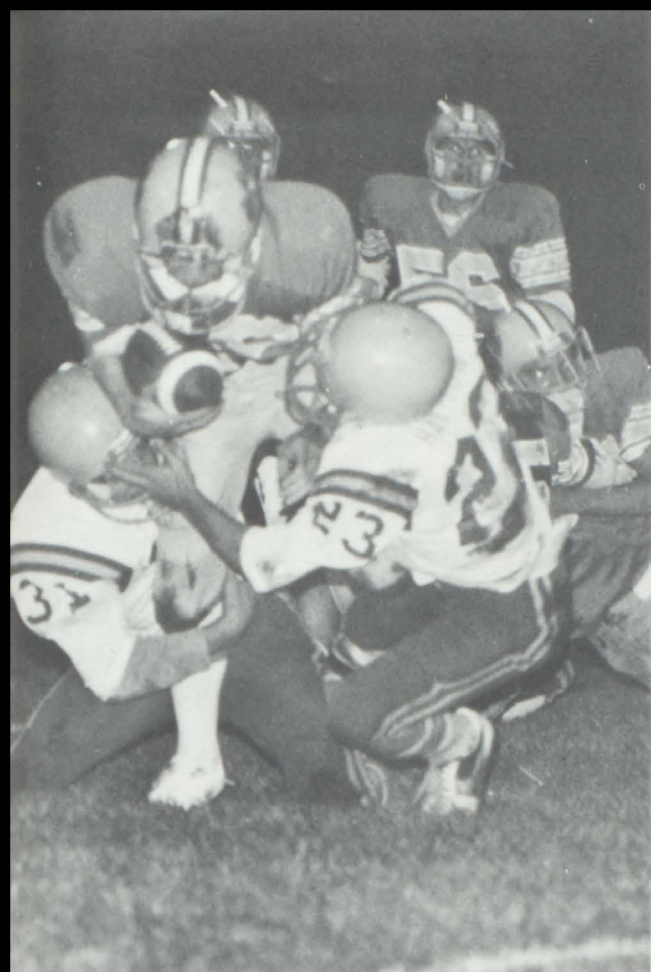

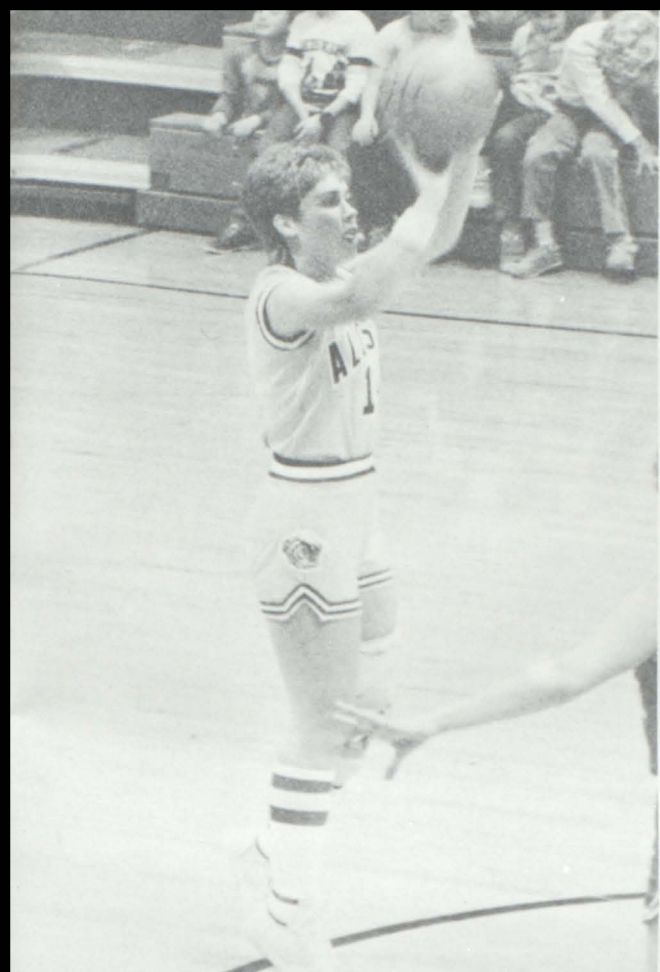
New Basketball Coach Comes To Alcester
