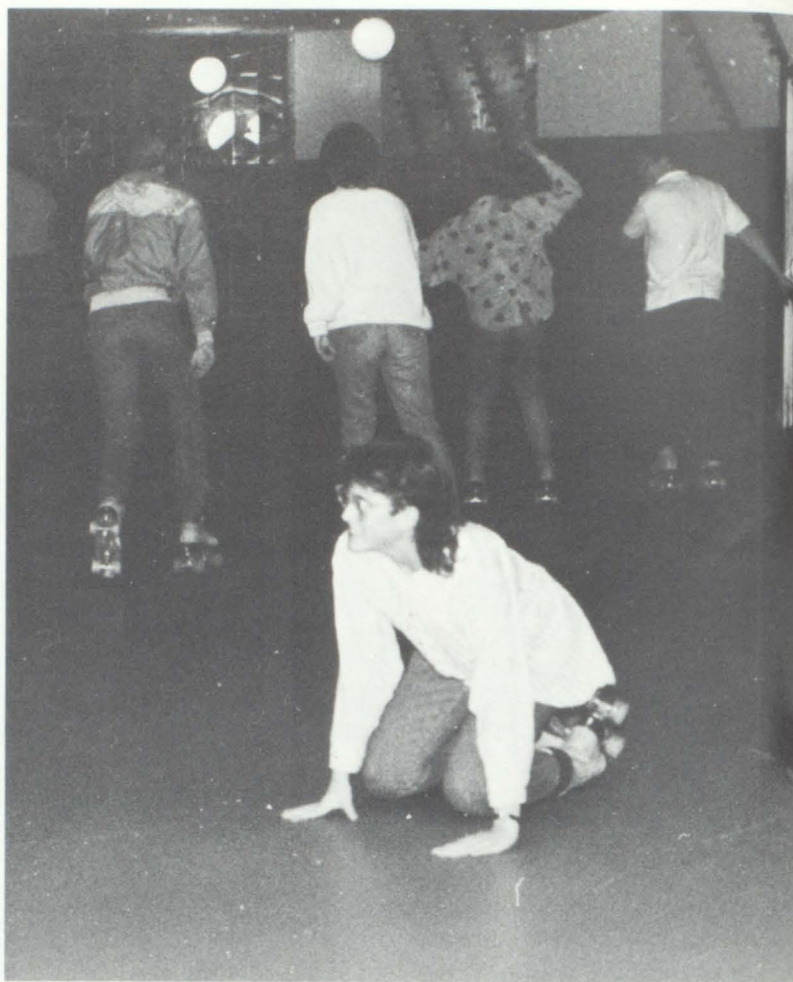

Homecoming 1986

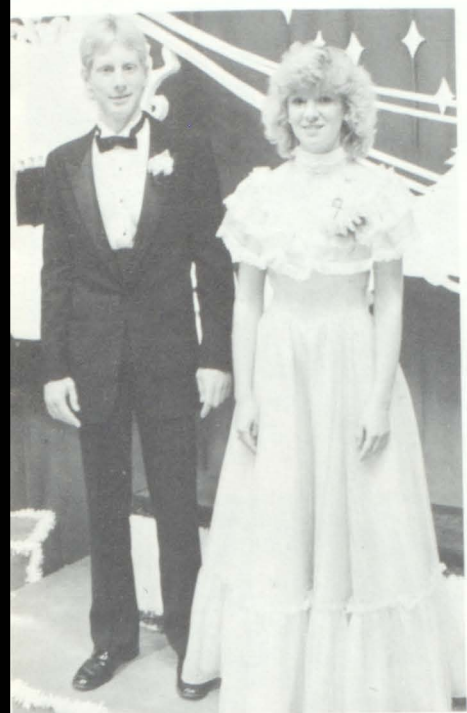

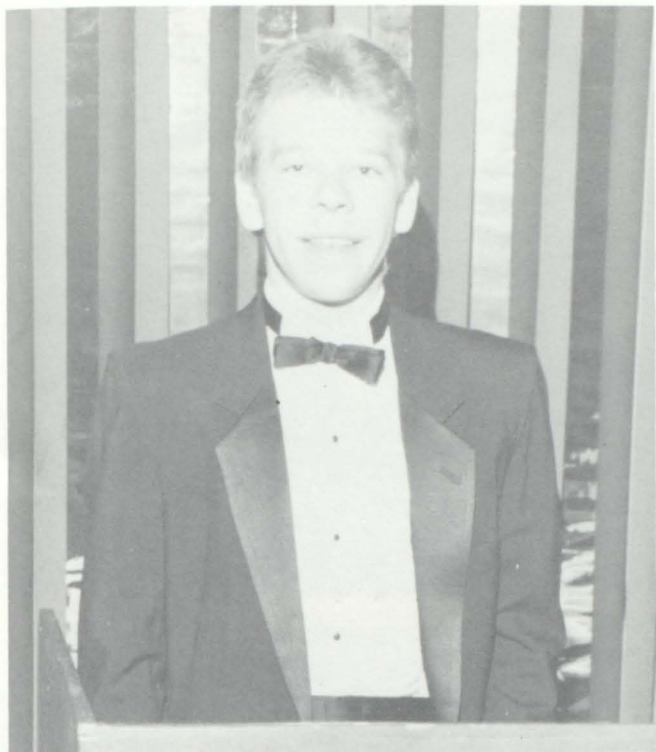


Prom '87! In The Air Tonight

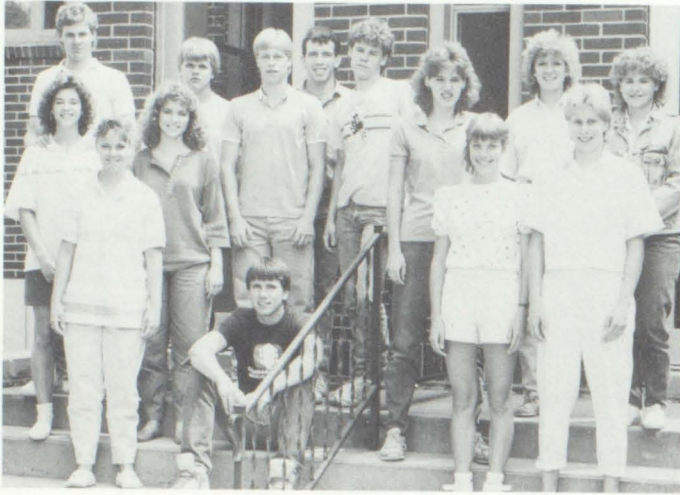

Getting The Job Done

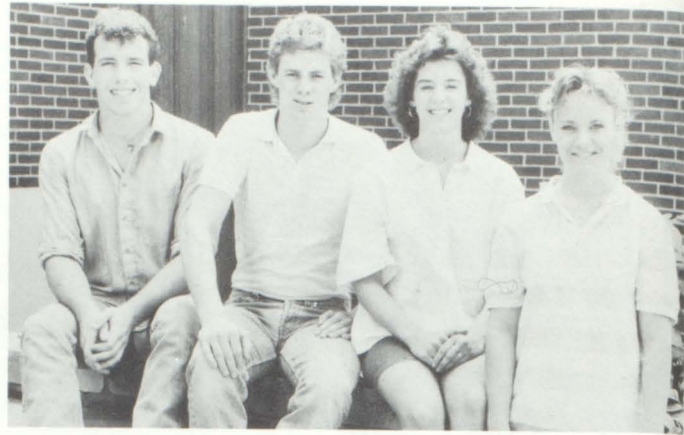

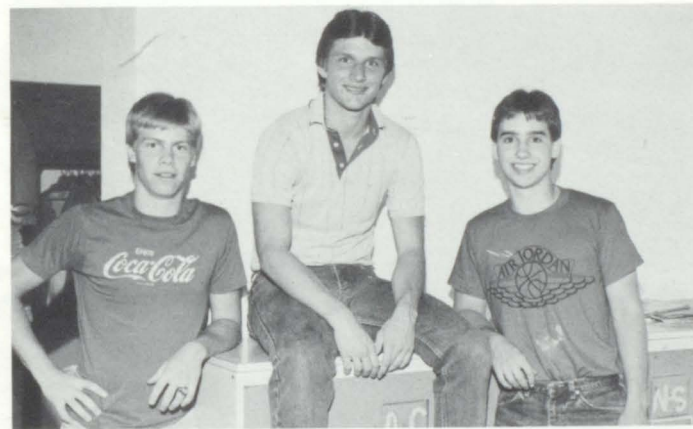

The FFA held its annual slave auction and they served breakfast to the faculty and the school board.

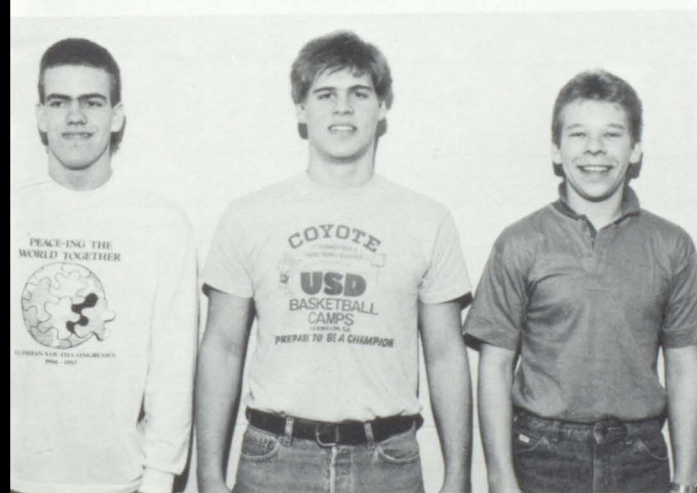

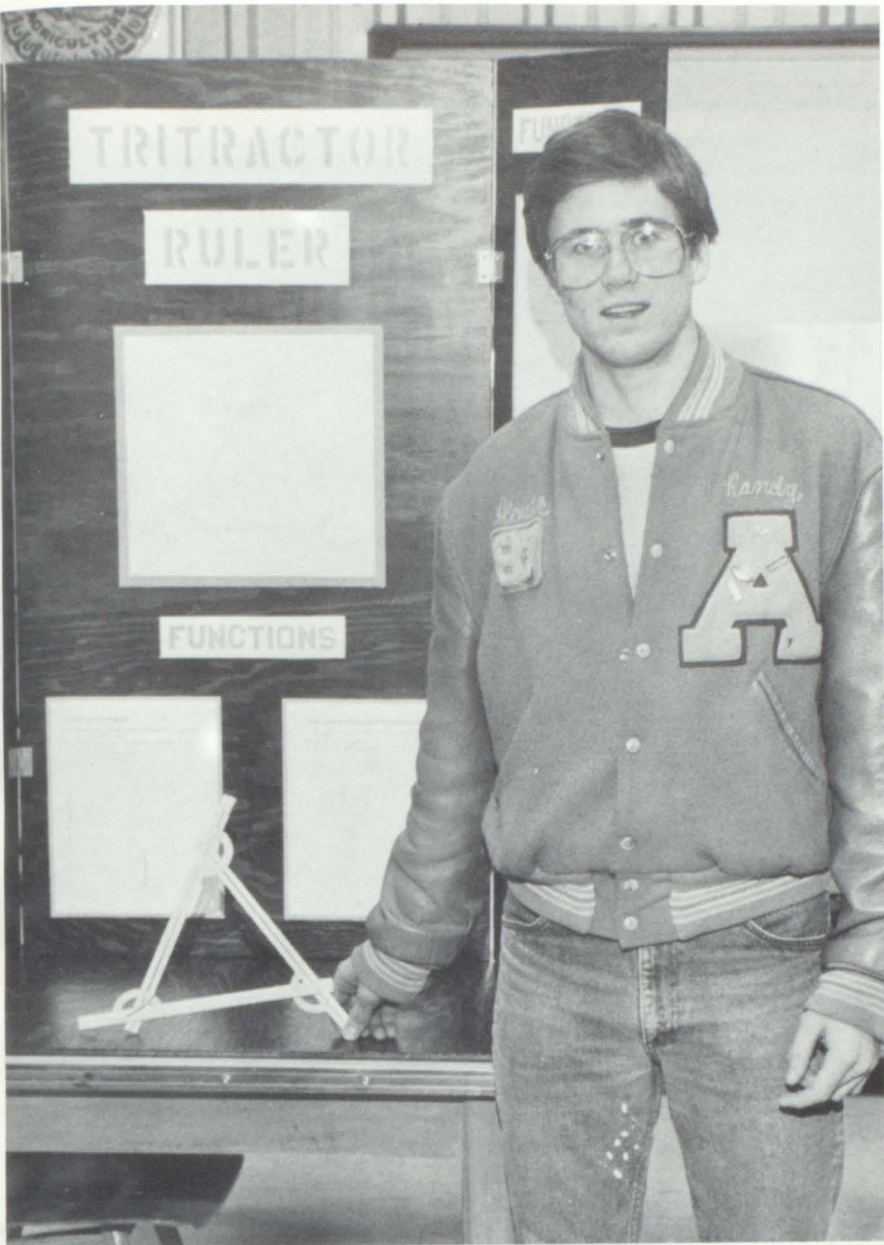

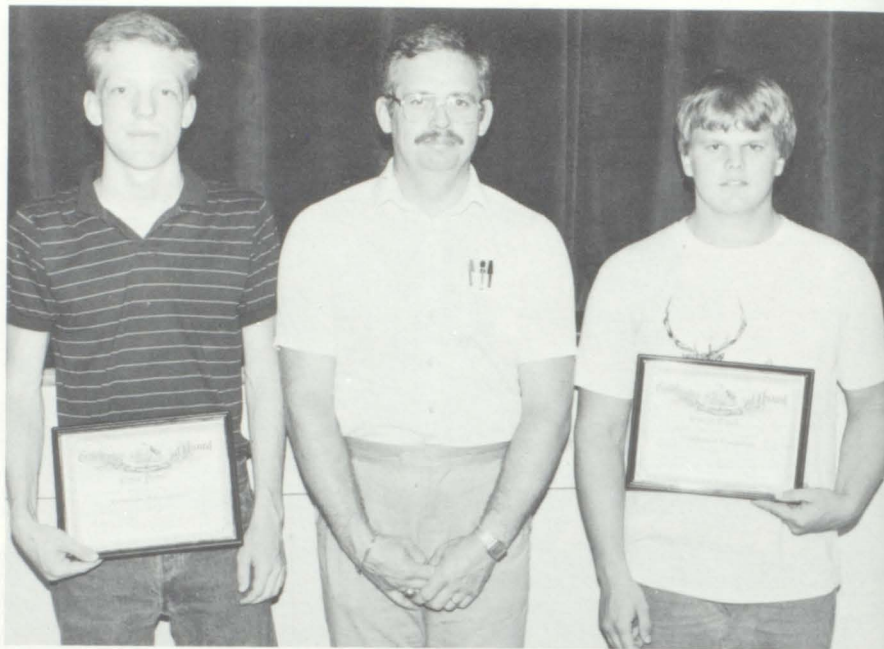

On May 31, 1987, excitement, happiness, and even sadness filled the Alcester Gym, as the class of 1987 joined together for the last time.

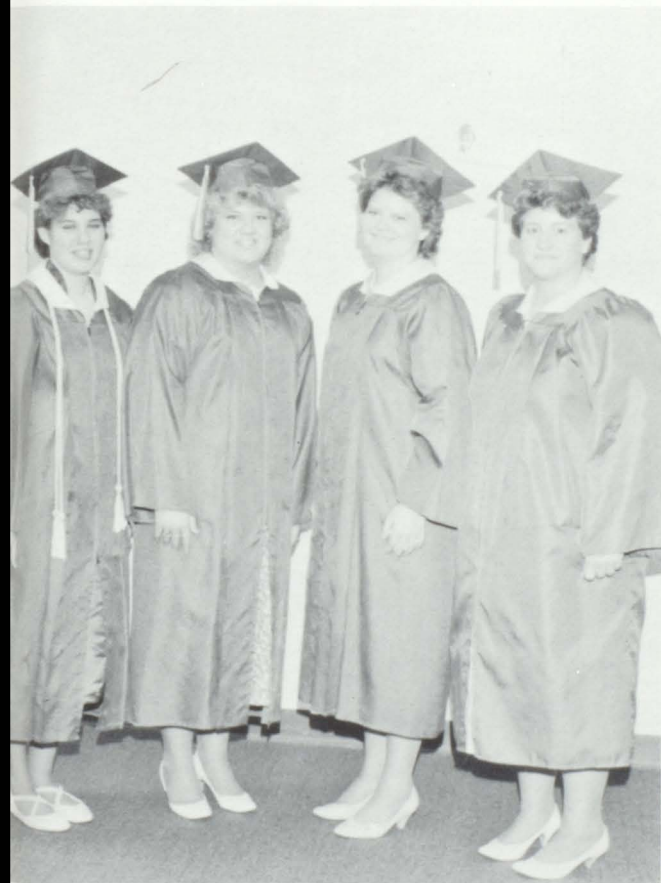

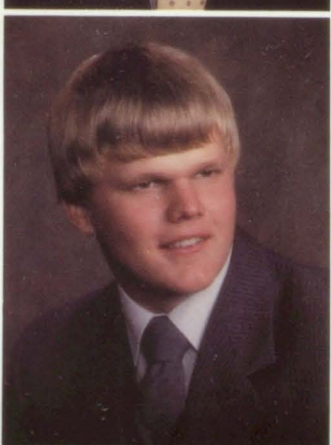

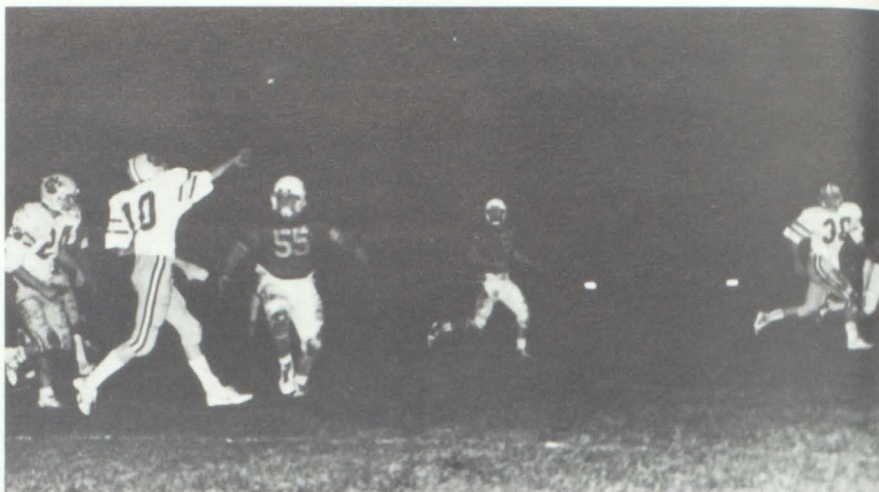

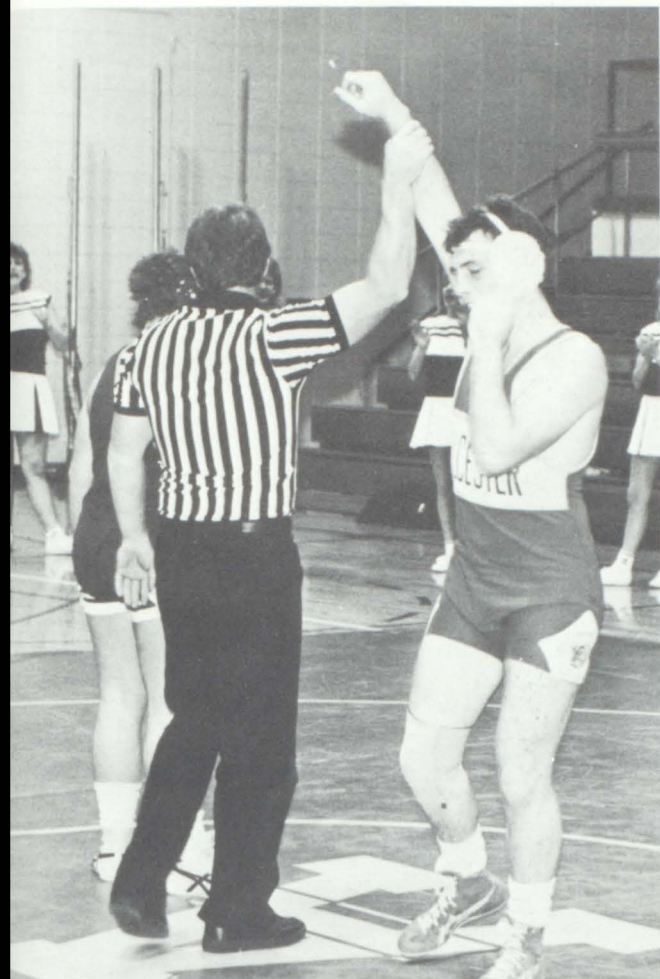

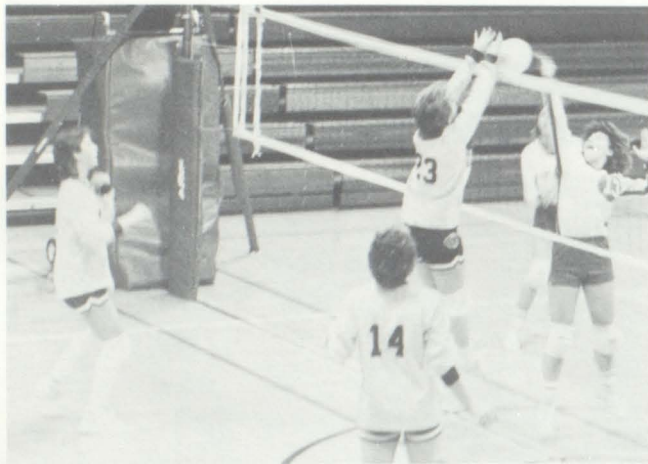
