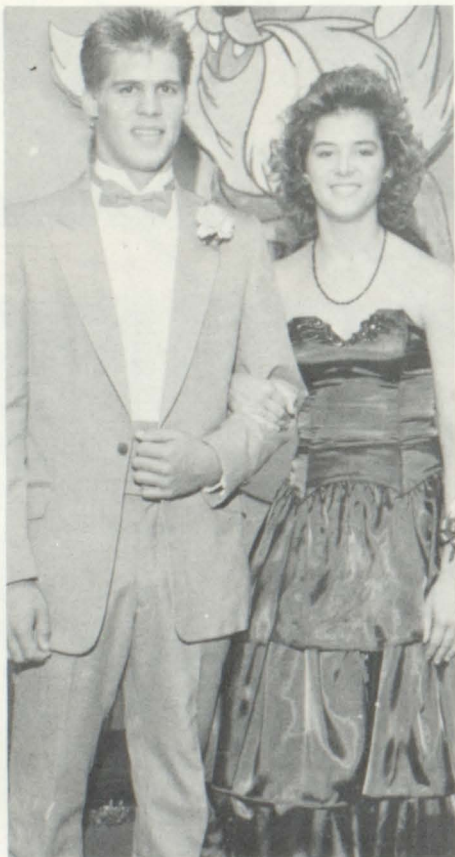
Fievel Brings Homecoming Spirit To A.H.S.

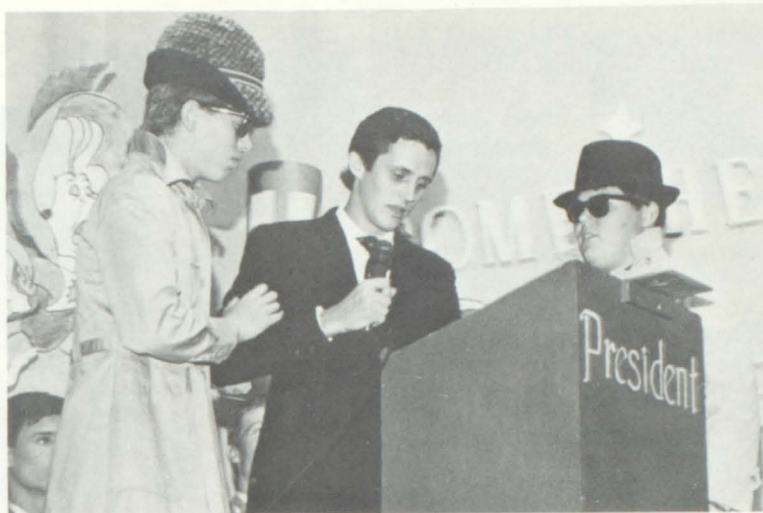

"Like The Wind" Leaves Sweetheart Memories

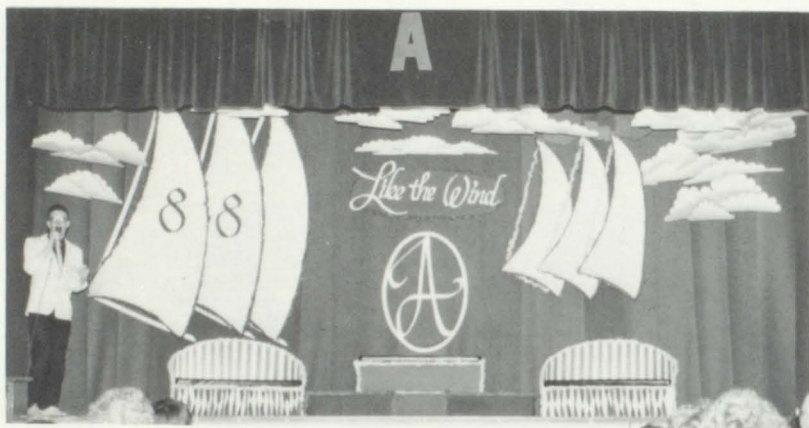

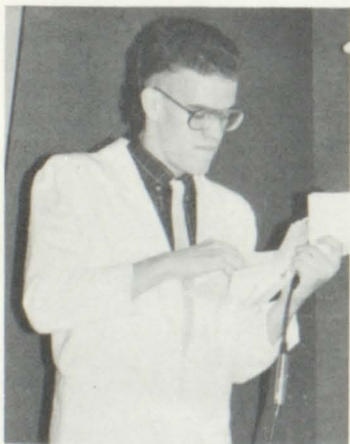

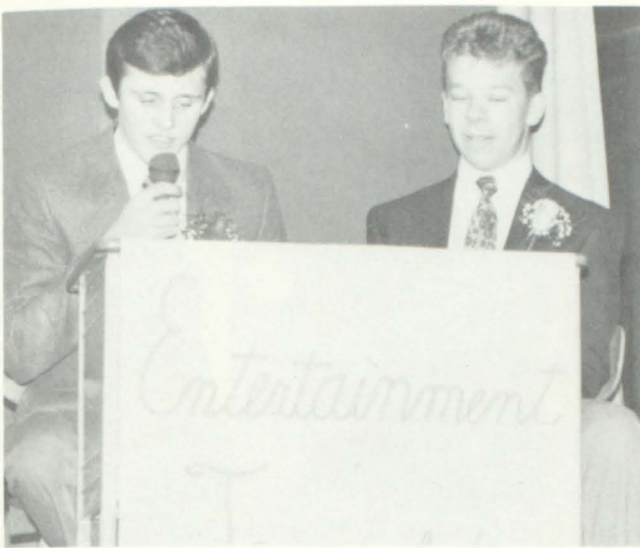

Principal Jerry Joachim presented the class as School Board President Jerry Kratochvil awarded the diplomas.

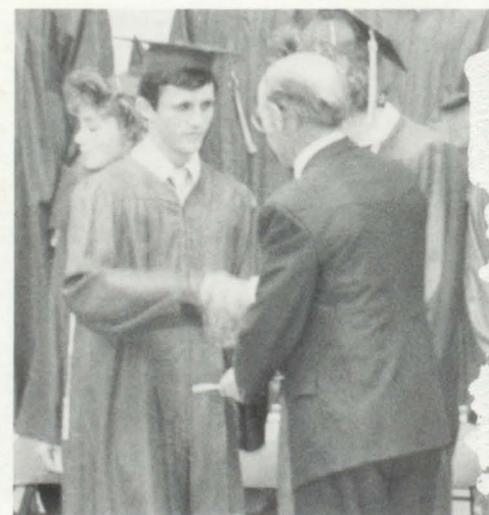

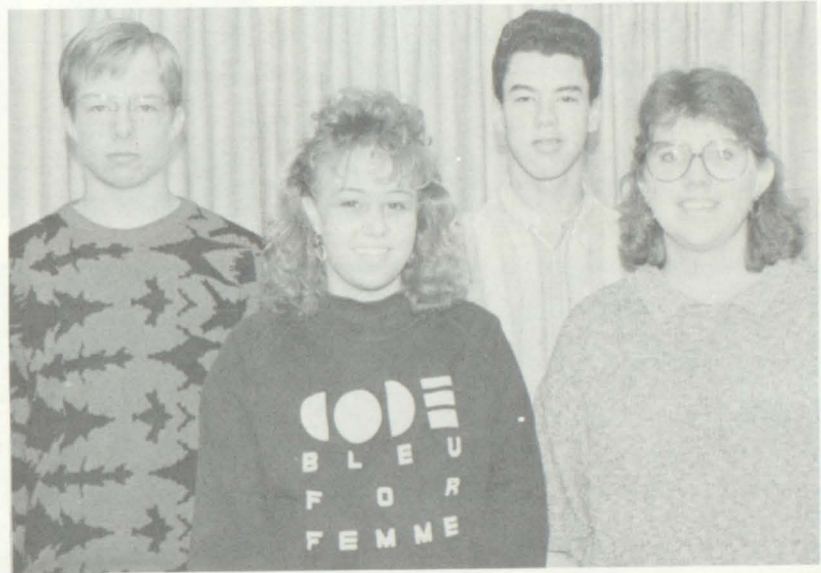

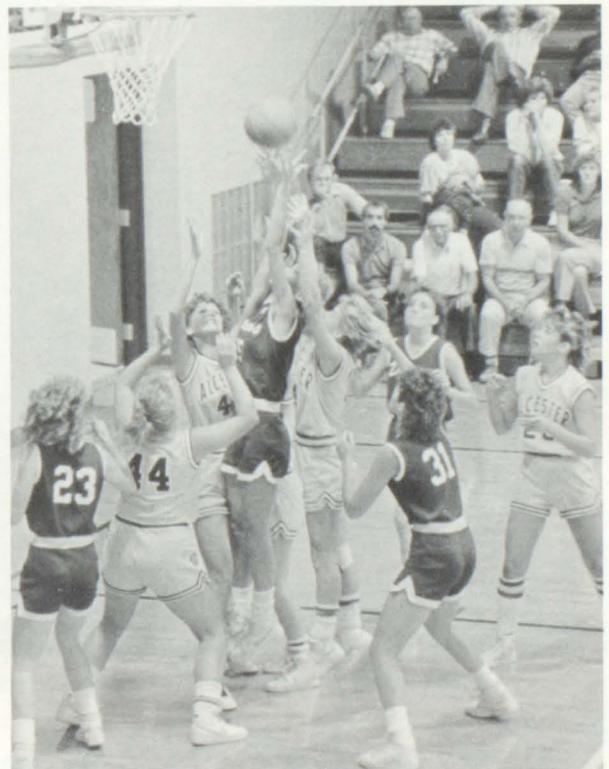

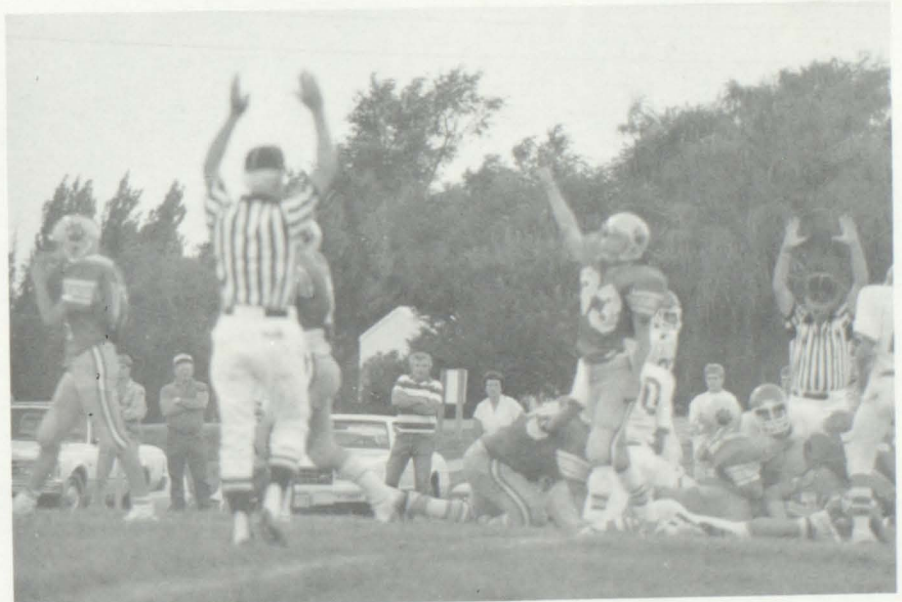

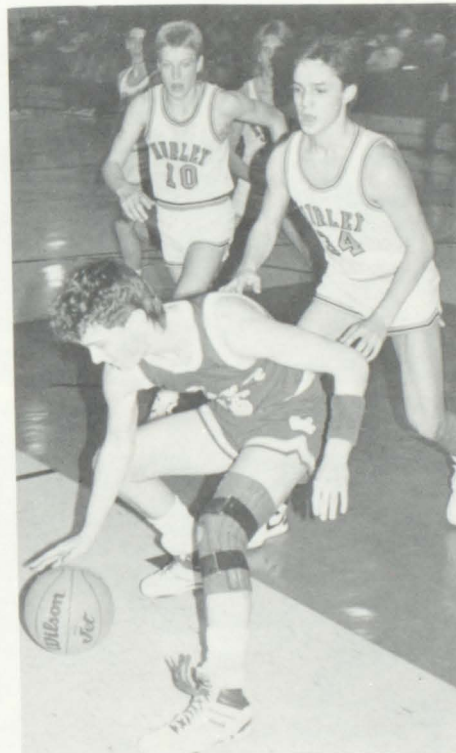

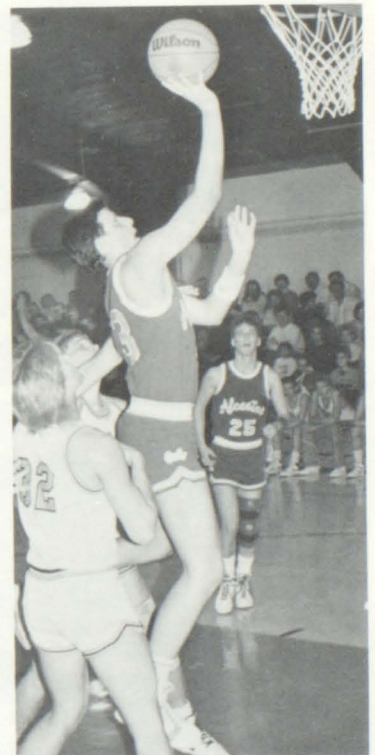

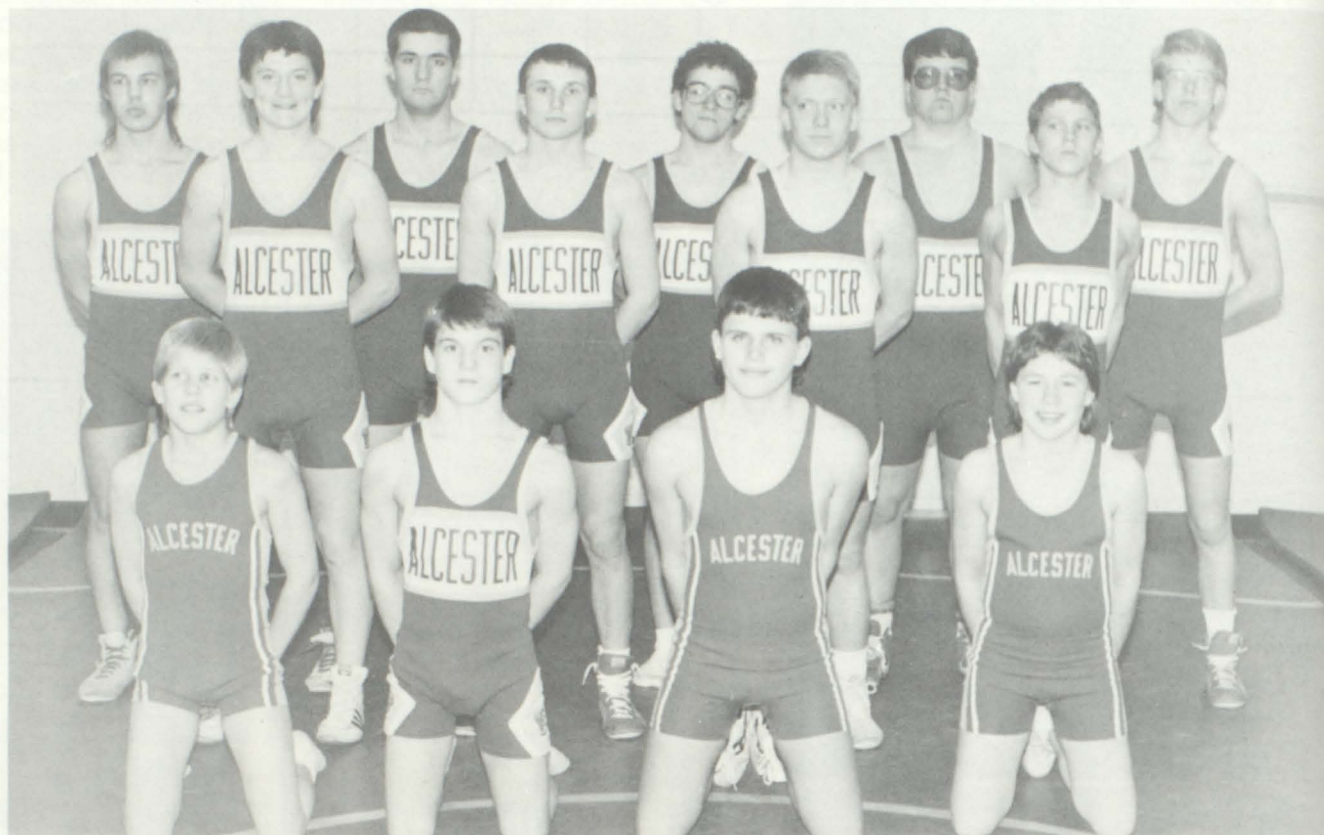

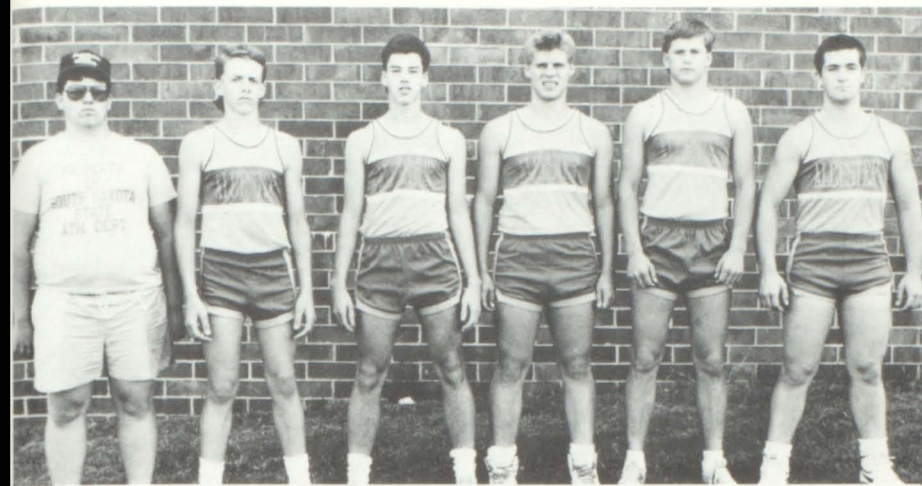

BLACK MONDAY — The Dow Jones industrial average plunged 508 points to an all-time low following the biggest one-day selloff in history October 19.

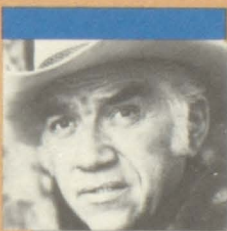


FAREWELL
