"With faith in each other and the experiences we've shared, we advance into our future building from what we have learned." This was the motto written by the graduating class of 1989, and was the theme for graduation.

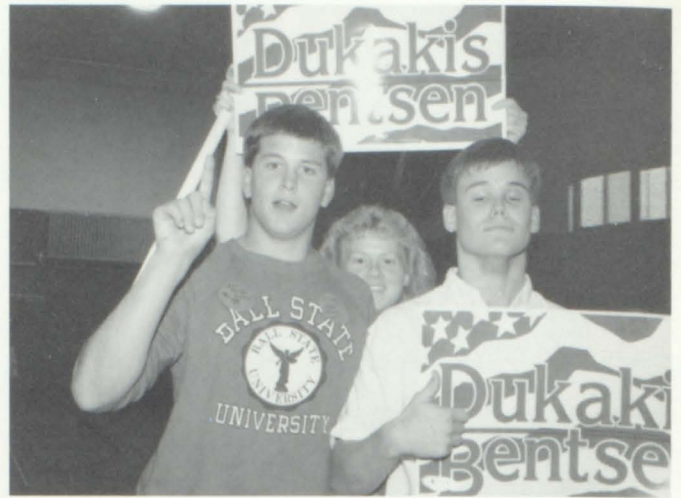

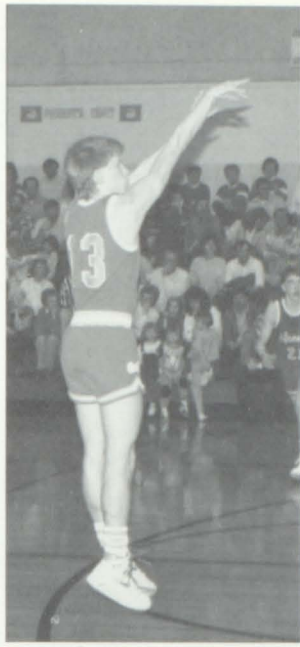
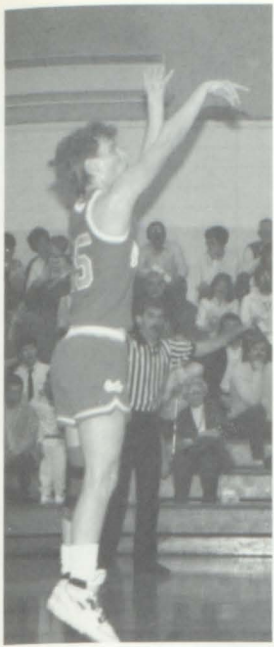


Girl's Basketball-A "Smurfy" Season

Natural Helpers Begin at AHS



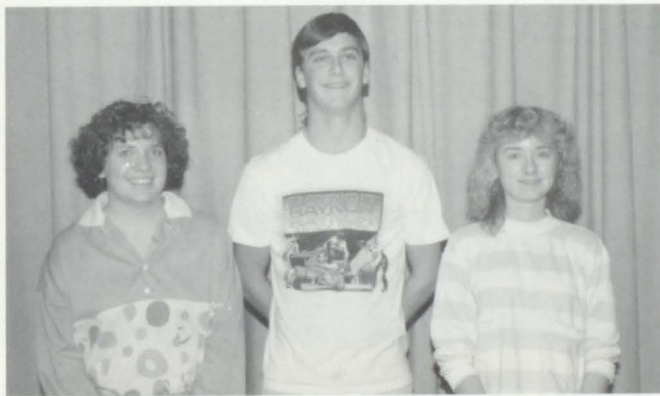
