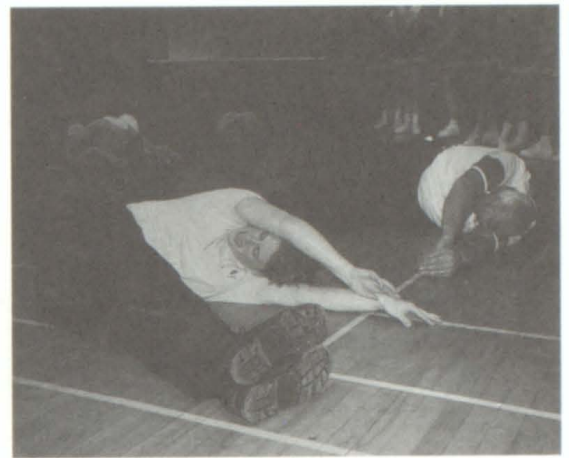

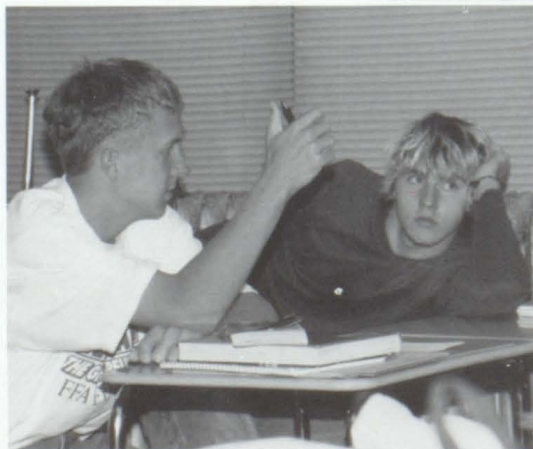

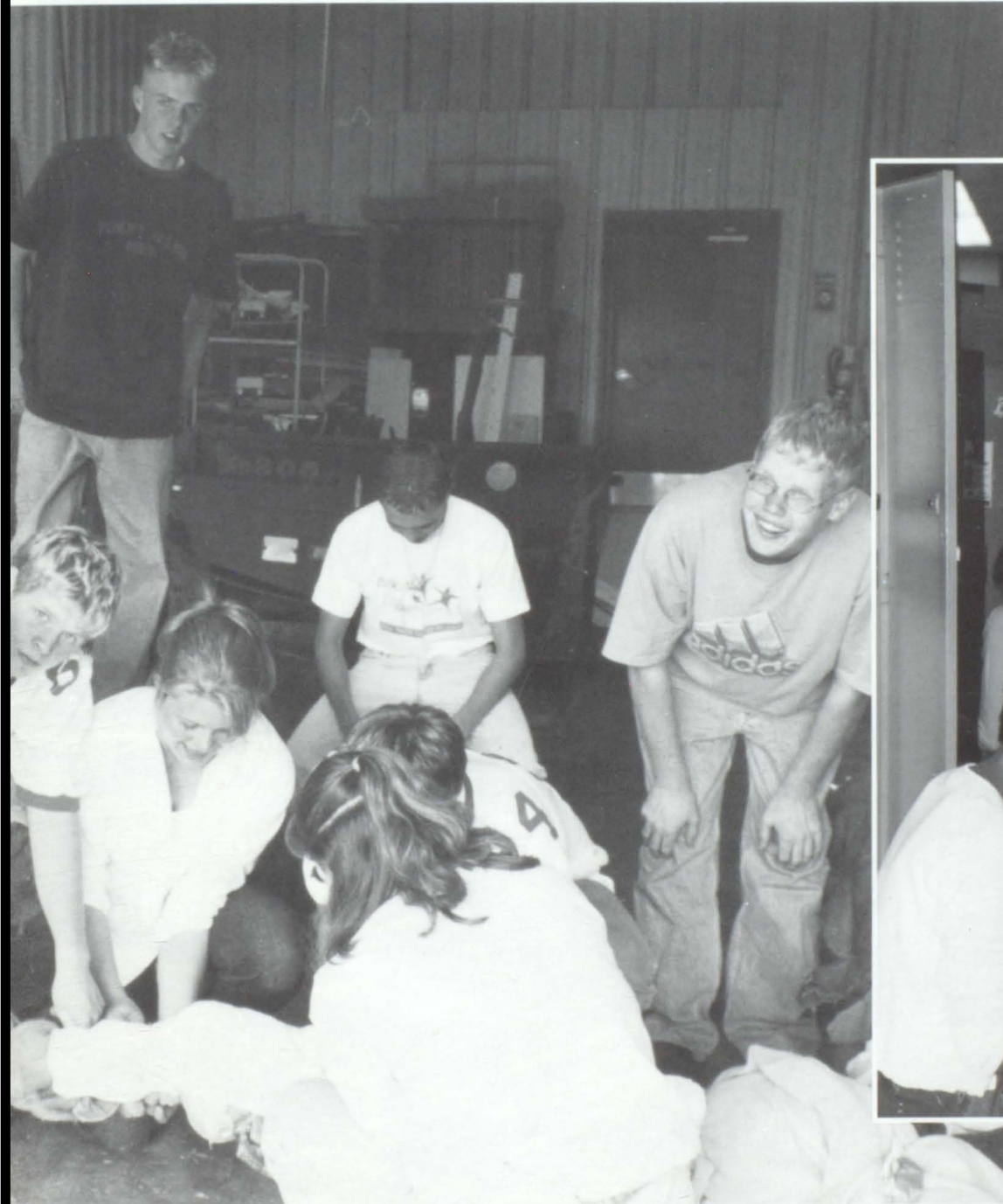

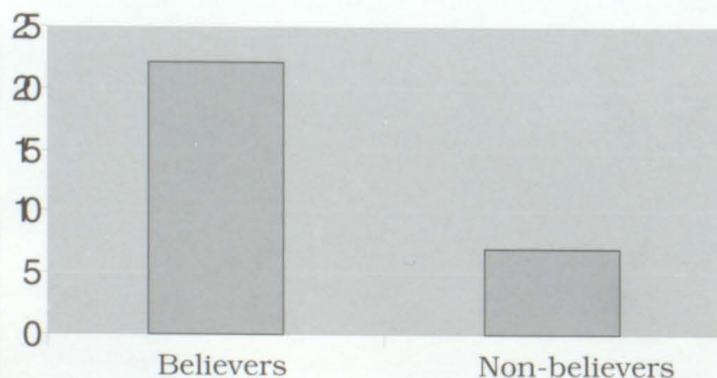
Close Encounters of a Third Kind

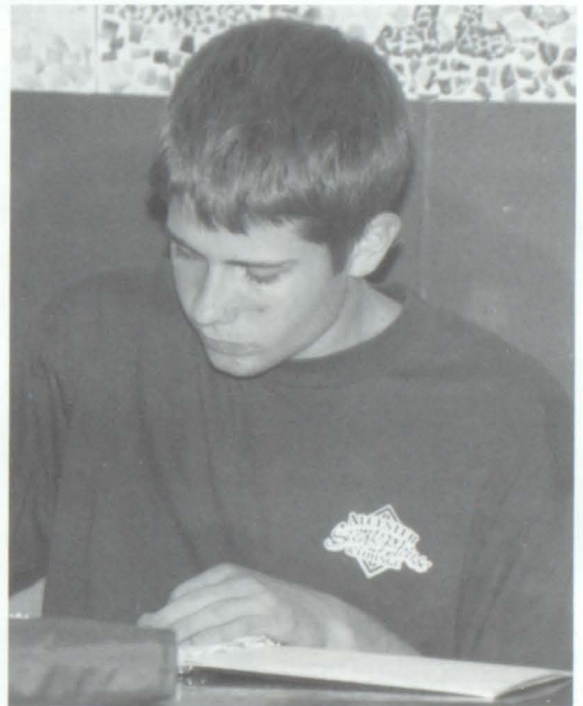
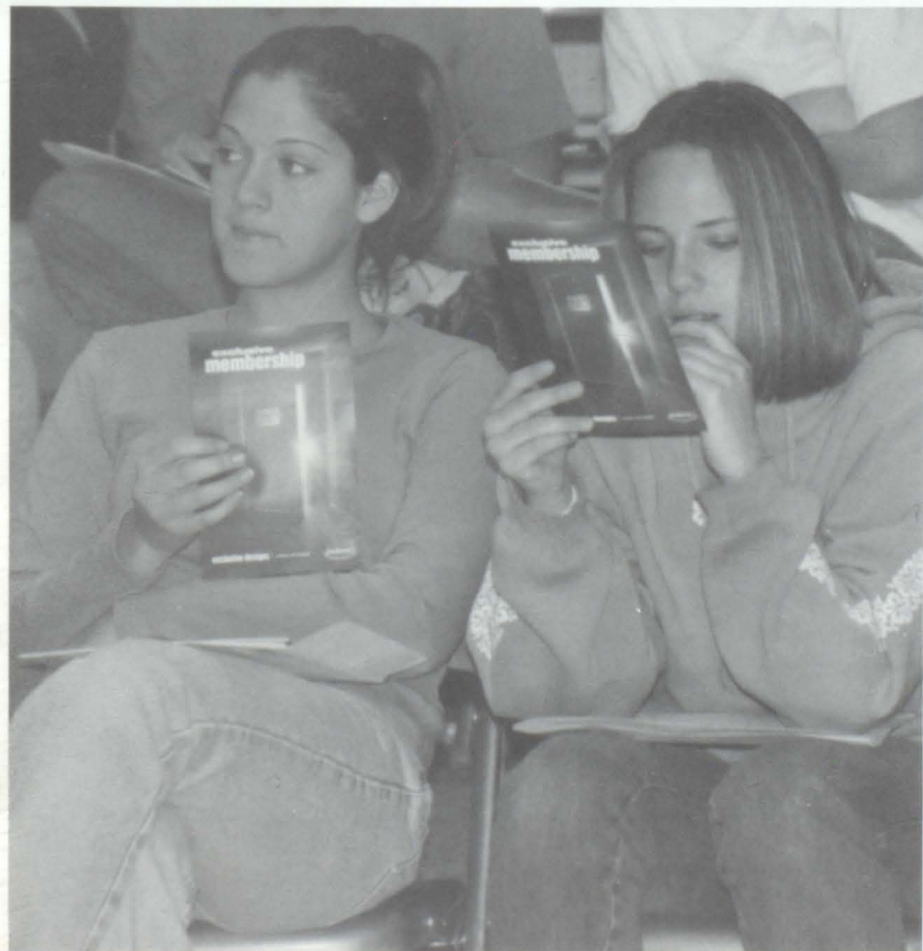

Upon returning home, prizes were handed out to juniors and seniors and all were sent home to rest after a long night of fun.

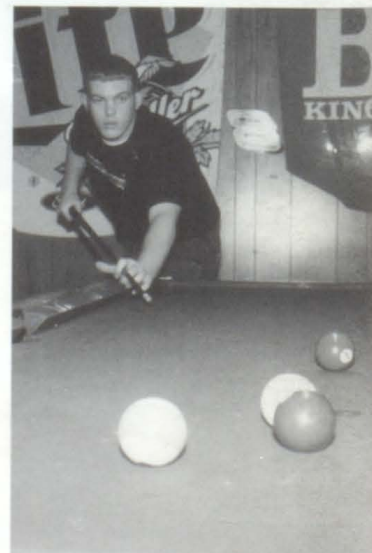

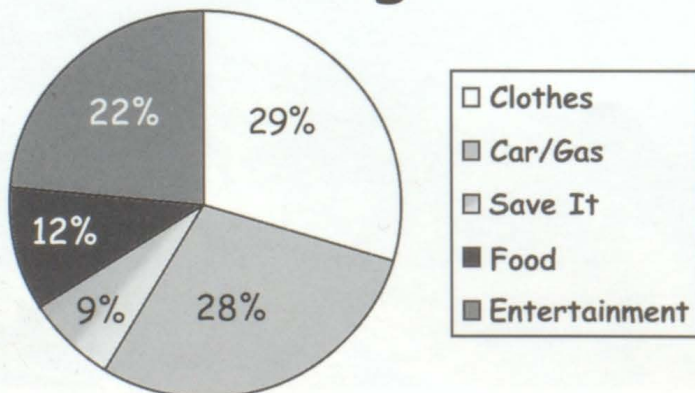
Would you spend your time working so you could save your money to buy a metal animal?

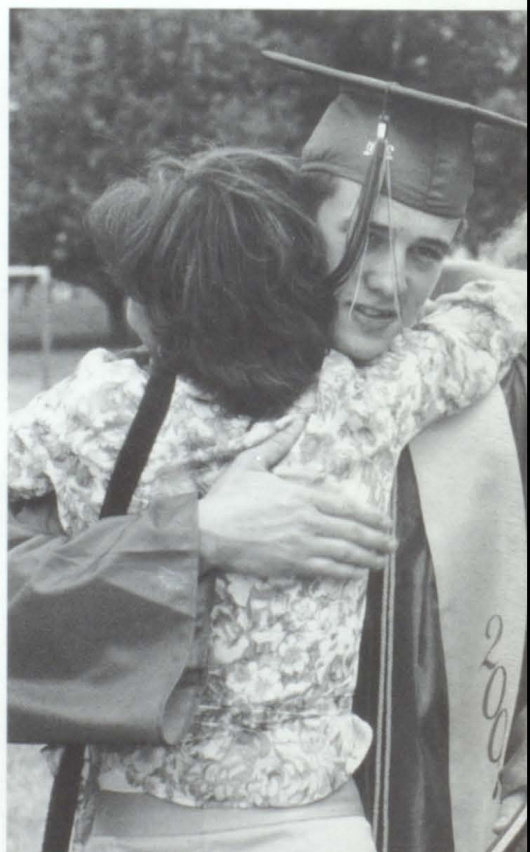

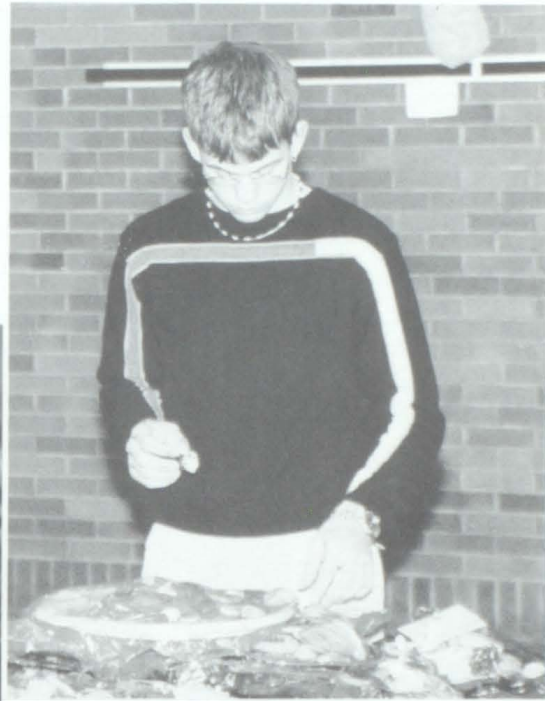

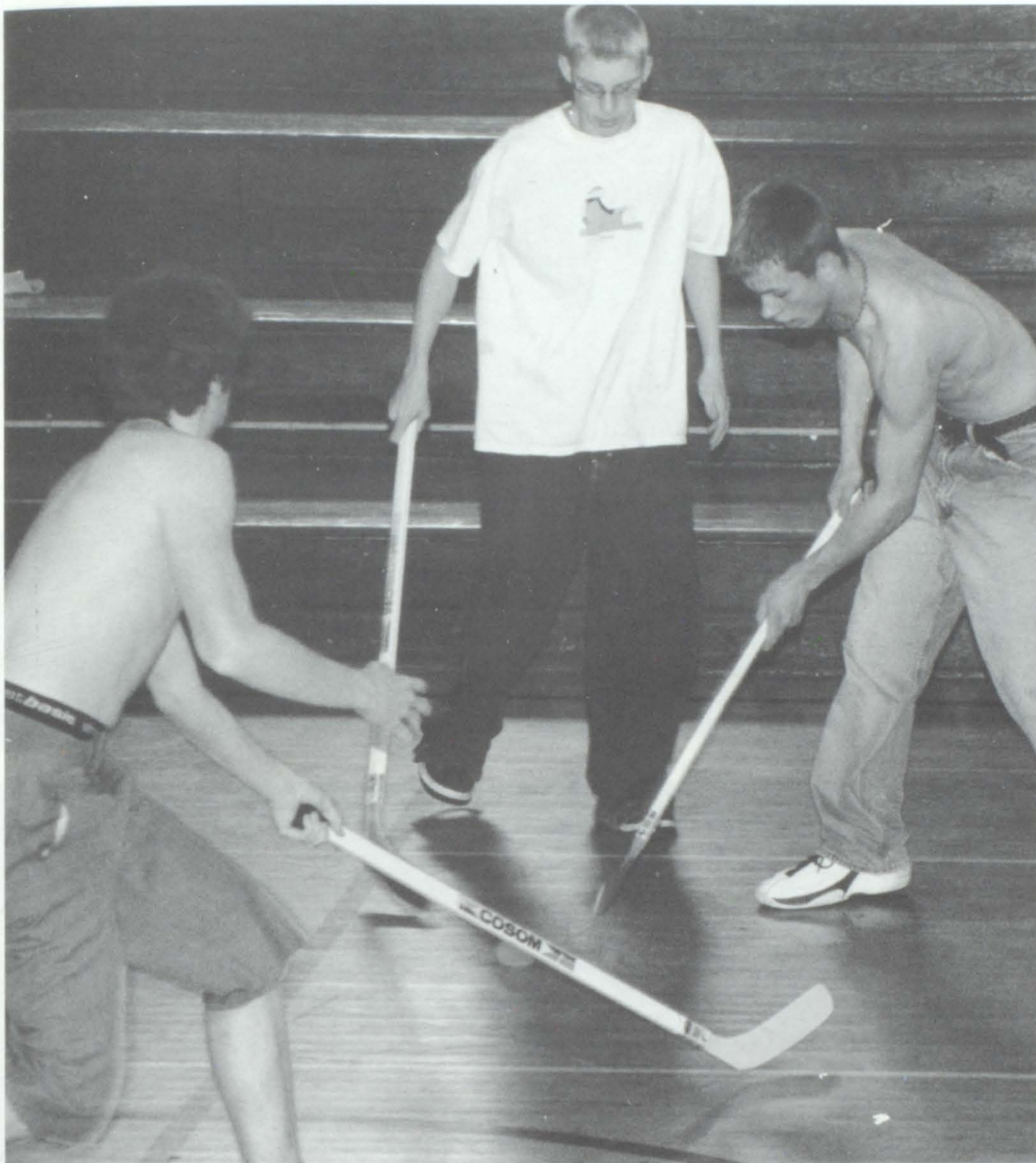

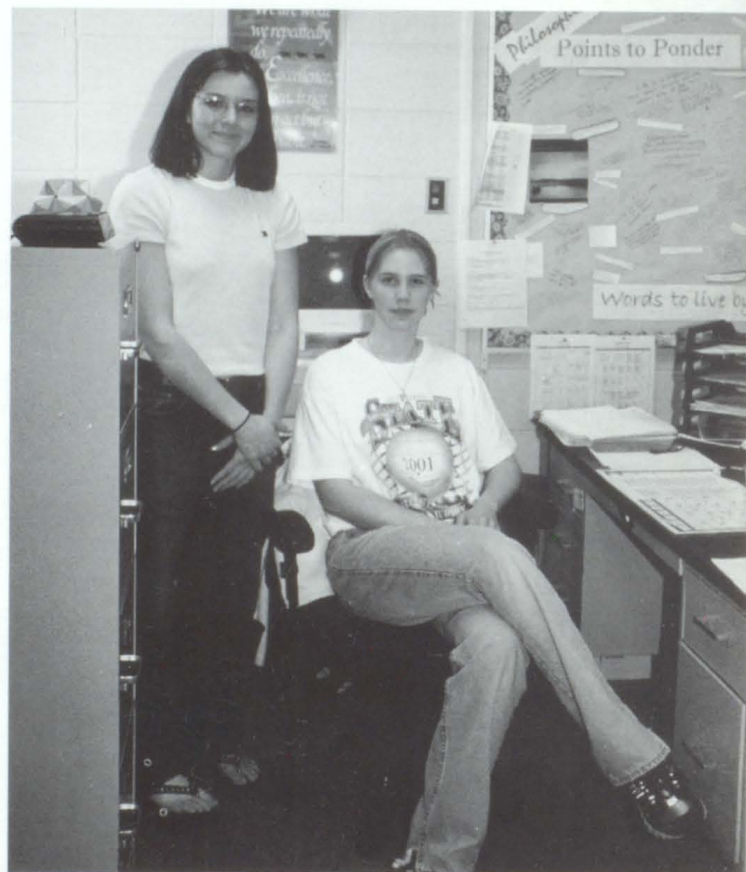


Girls State

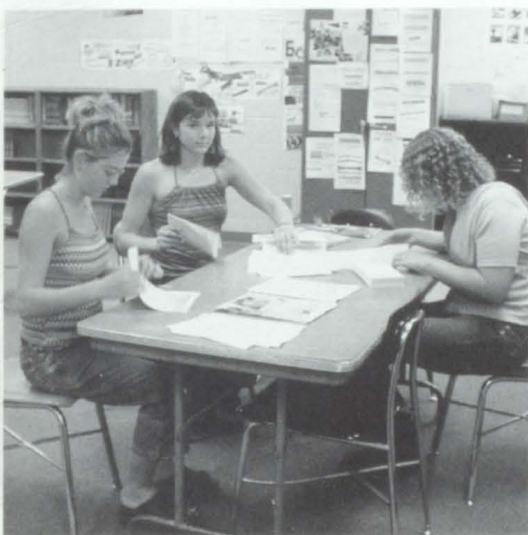

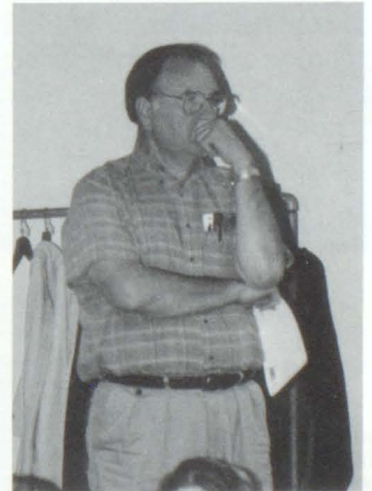
The jazz band contained fifteen members. They attended the Augustana Jazz Band Festival.

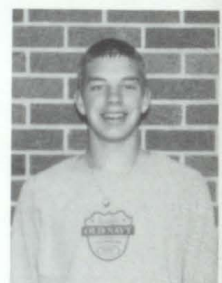

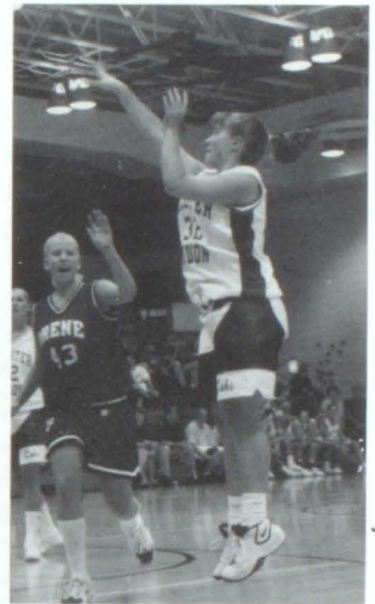

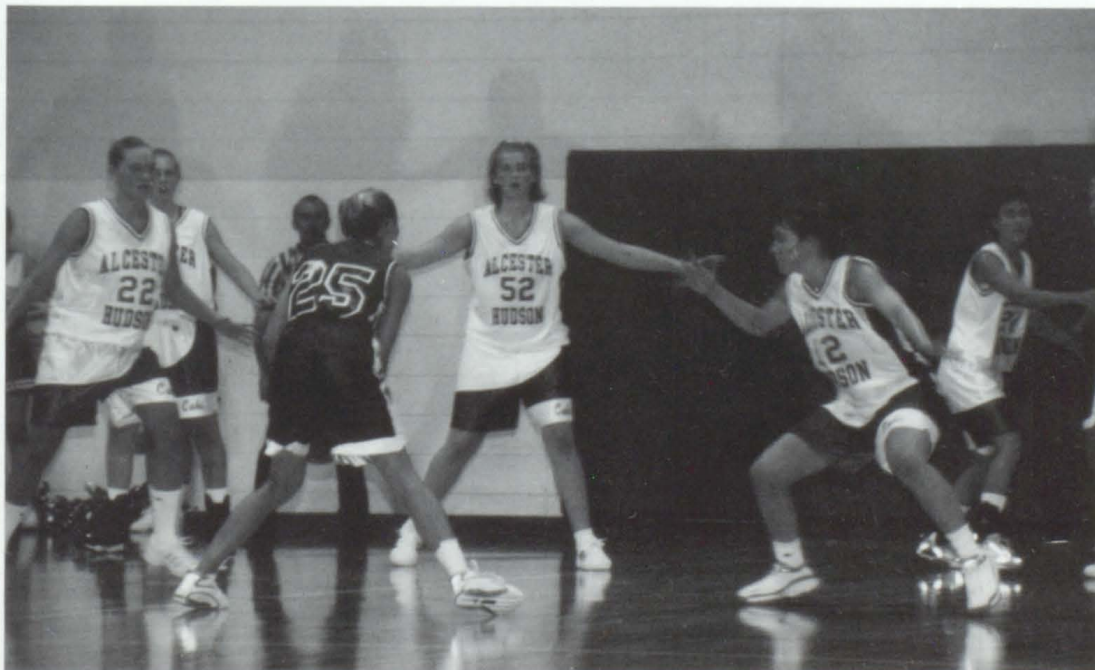

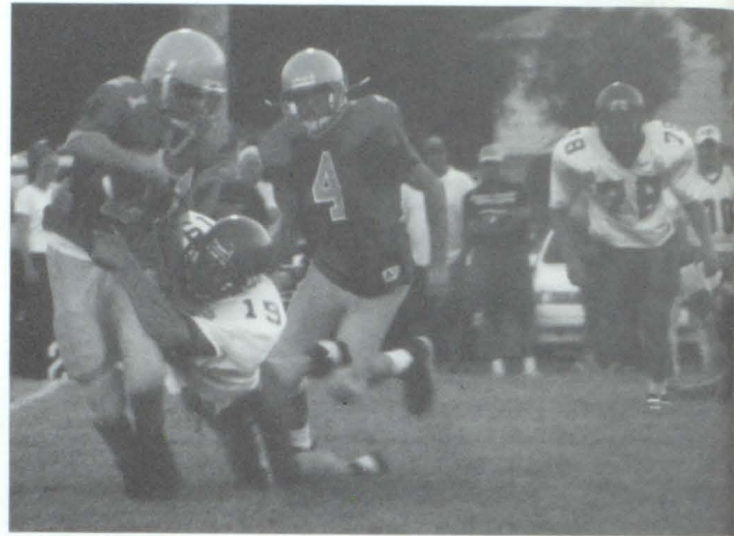
Varsity Blues

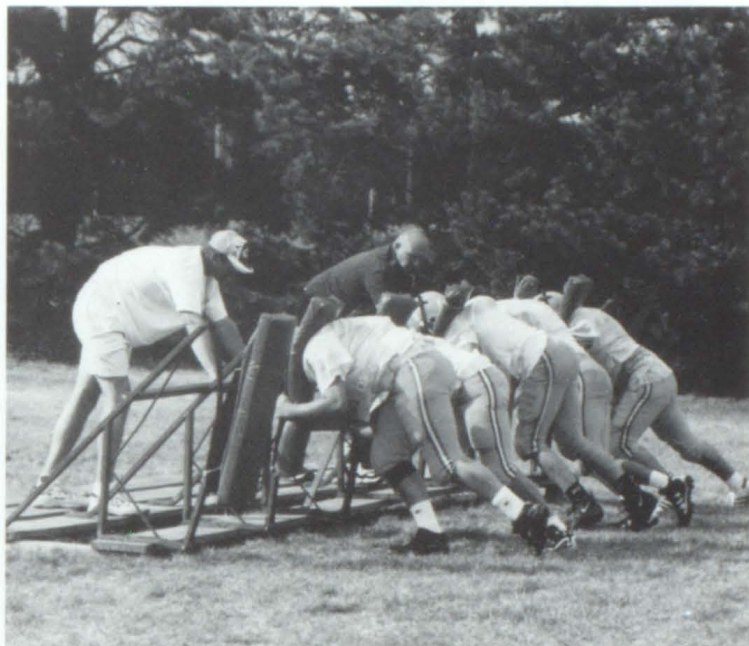

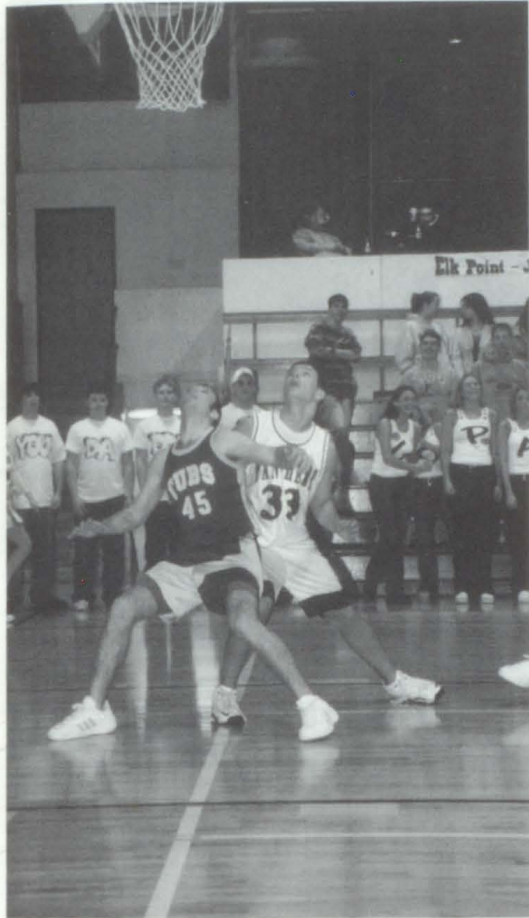

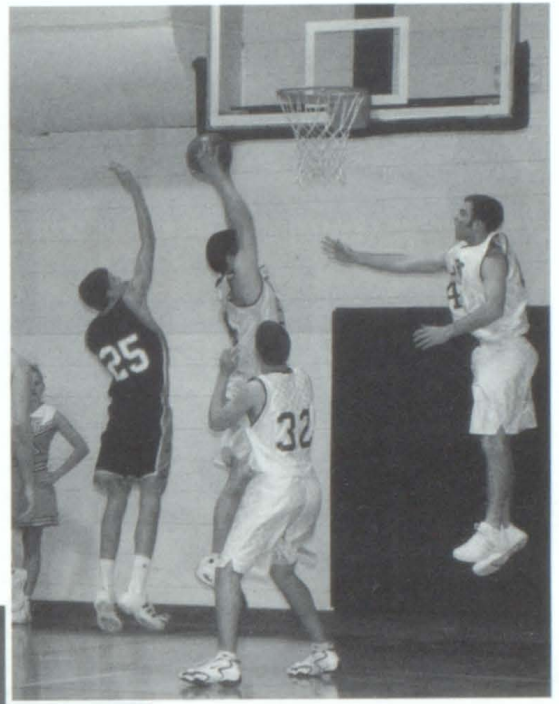

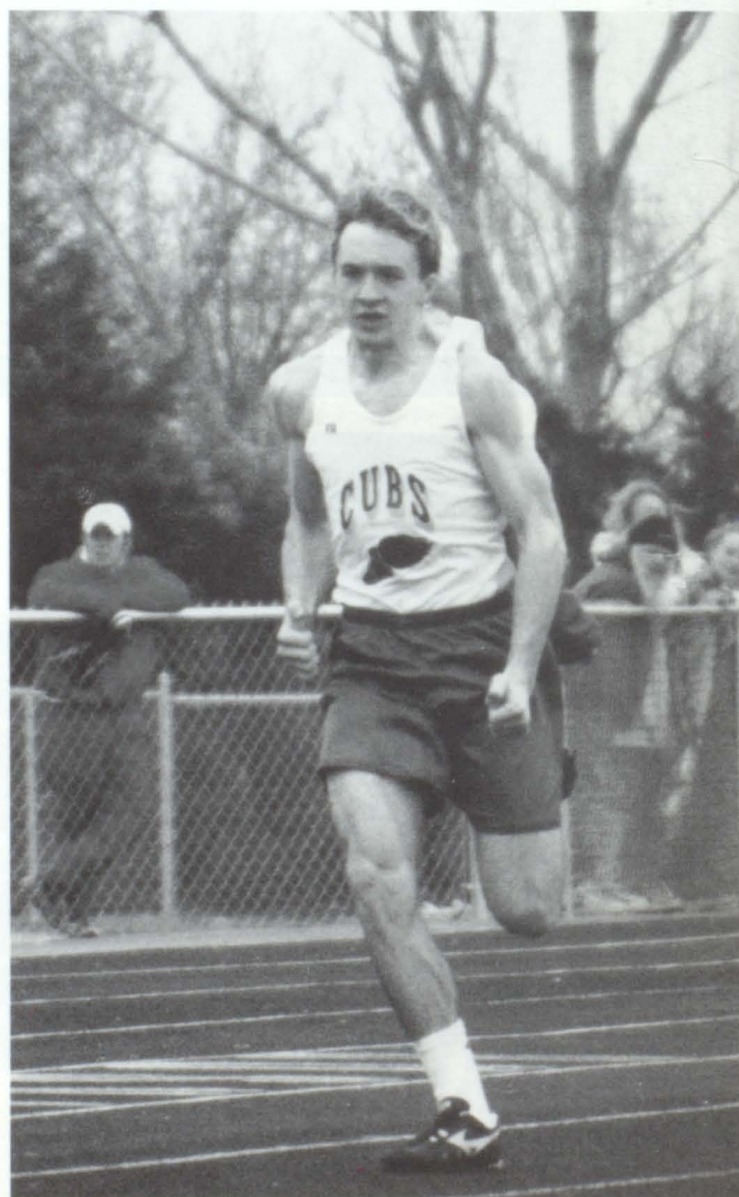

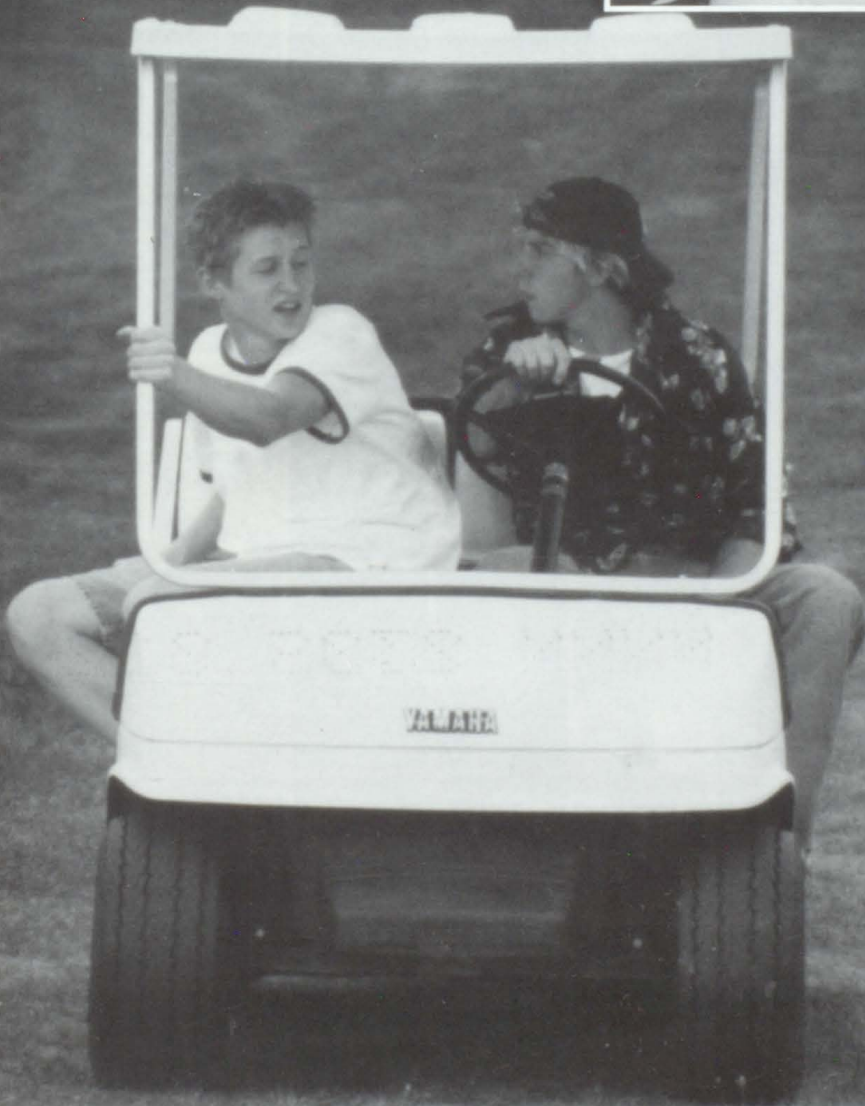
