With the last skit, the coro-

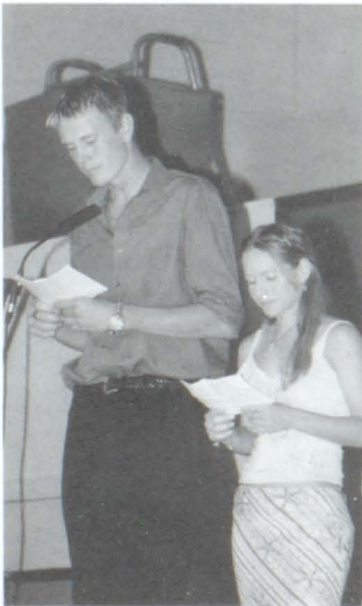
nation ceremony came to a close and the crowd followed the Homecoming Royalty out to the football practice field and watched the burning of the AH.

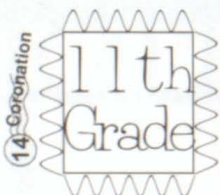

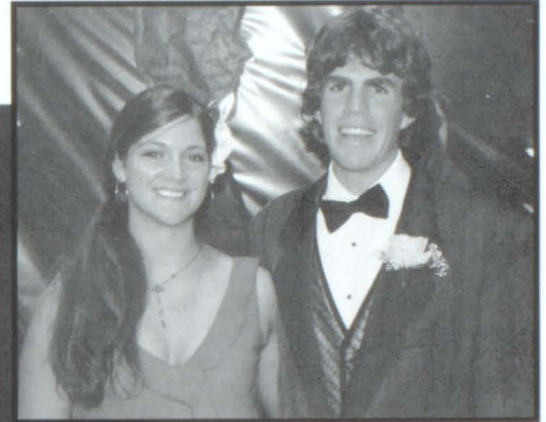

barbeque for the student body. We ended homecoming week with Blue and Gold Day. The students prepared their class floats in the morning for the afternoon parade.

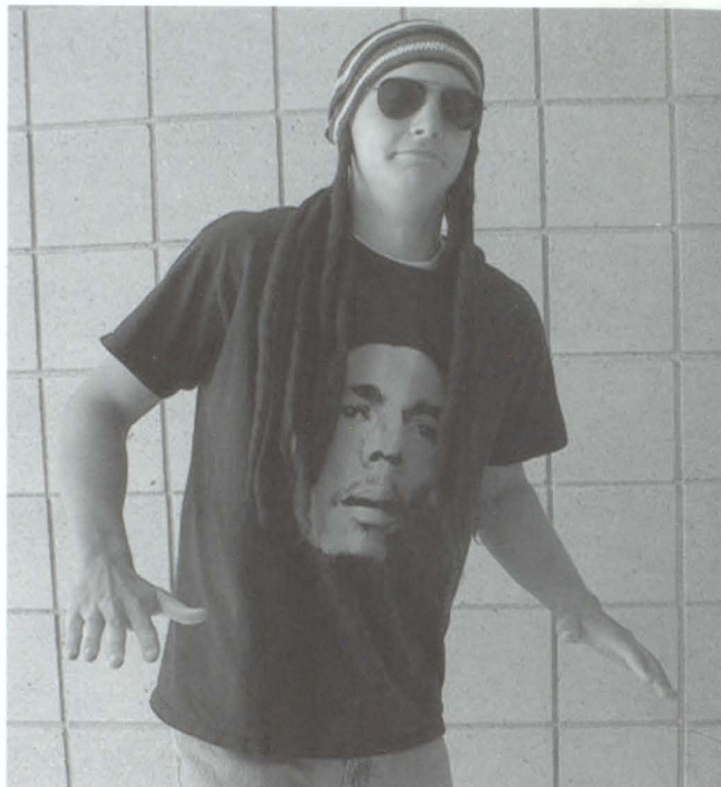
Friday night was the big football game against the West Sioux Falcons. We ended up with a much needed victory against one of our biggest rivals.

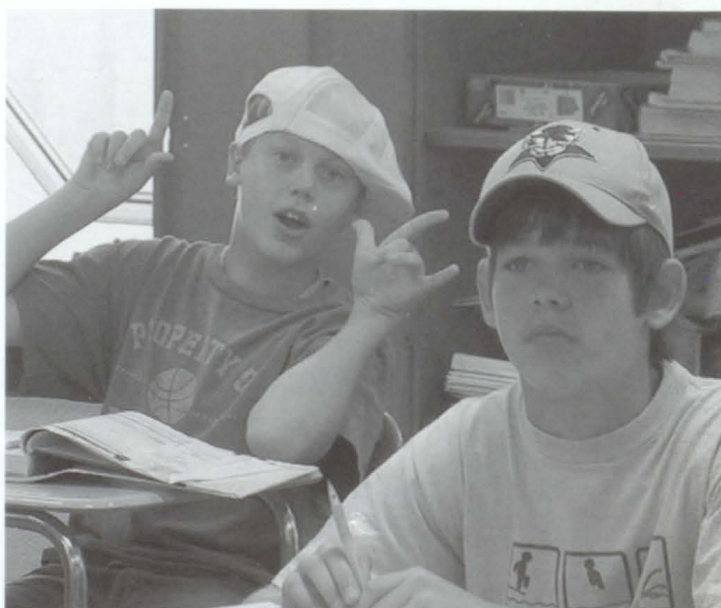

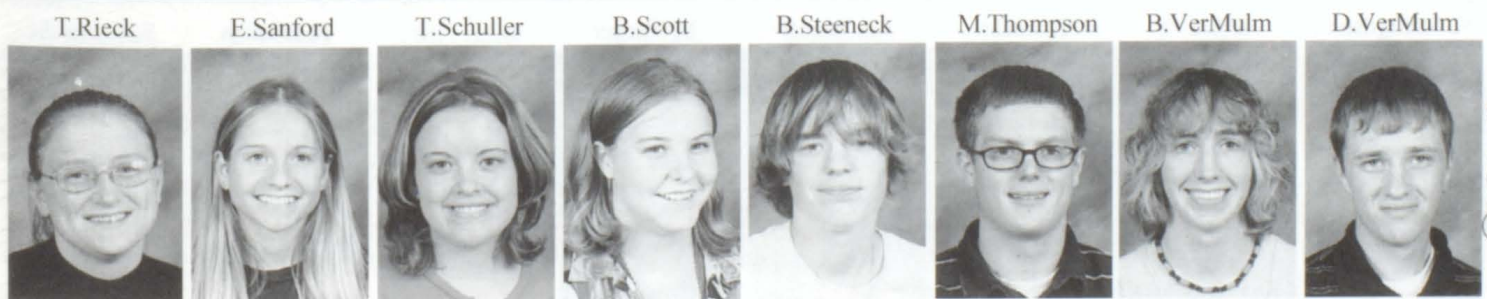

As the summer break came to an end, the volleyball and football players started their practices in the heat of August to get ready for the fall sports season.

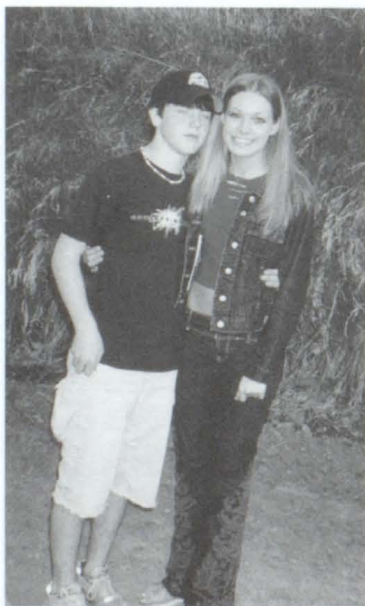

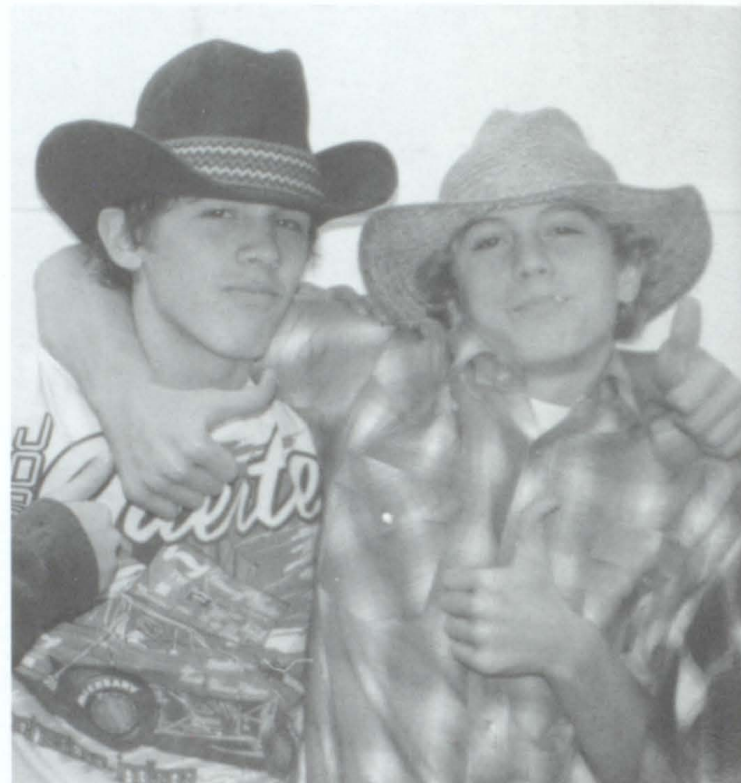

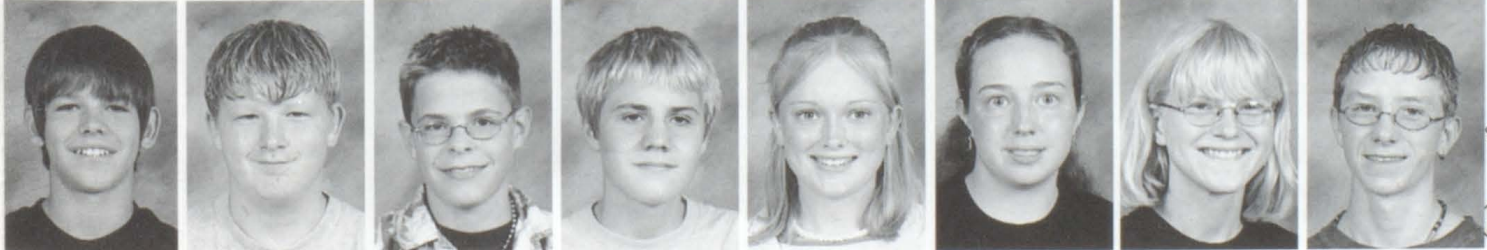

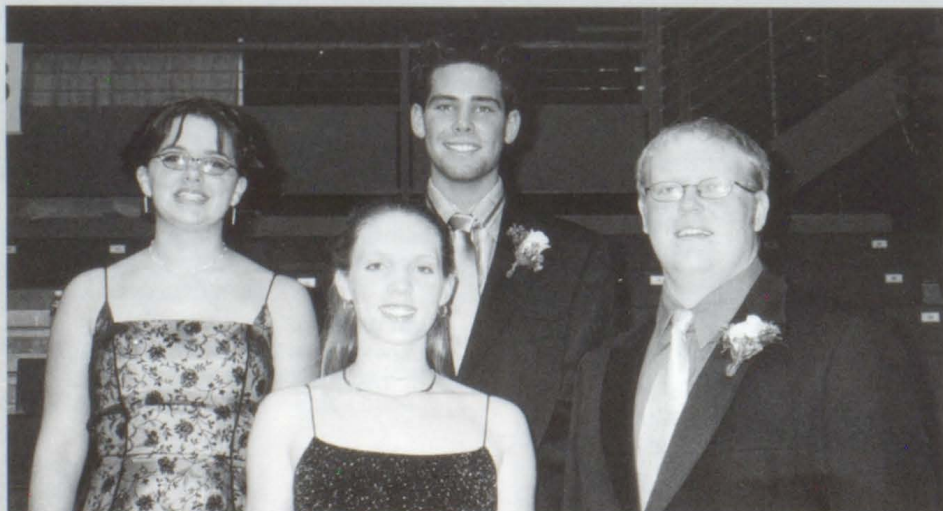
All State Chorus Quartet

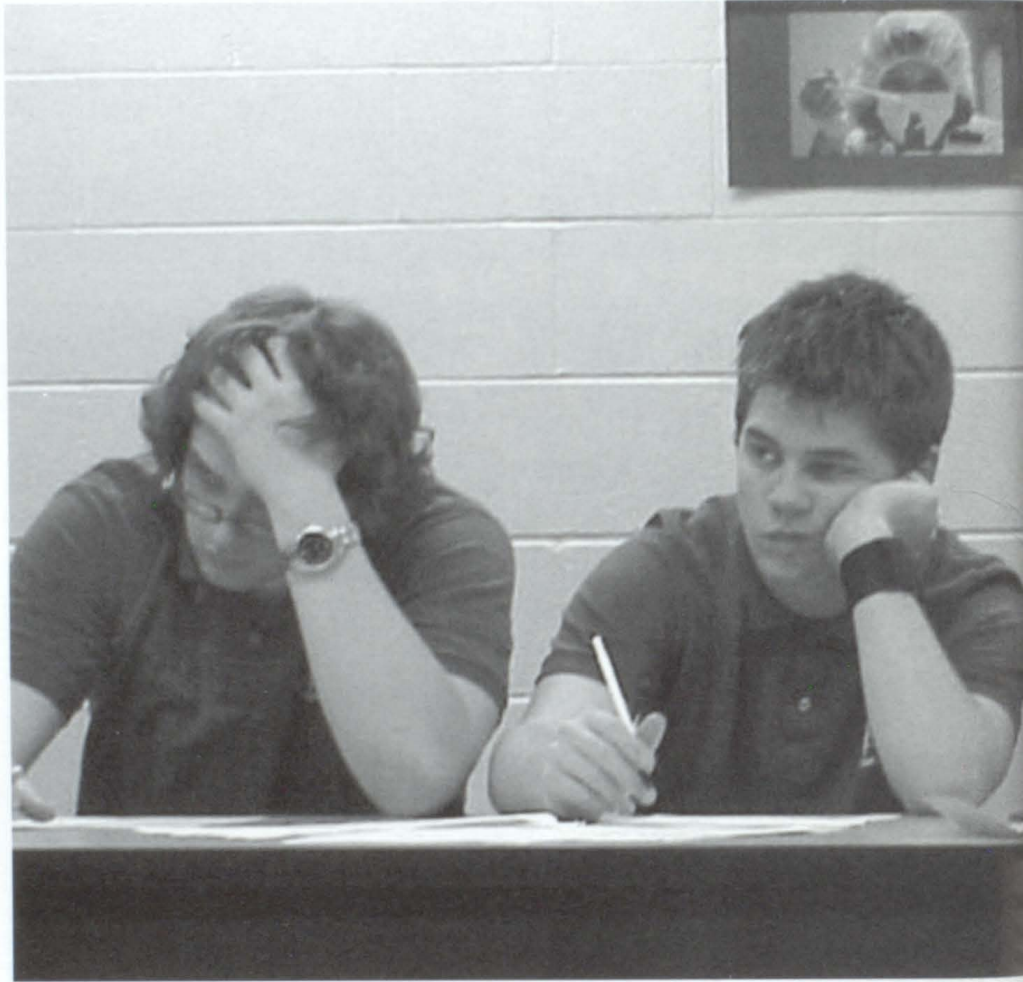

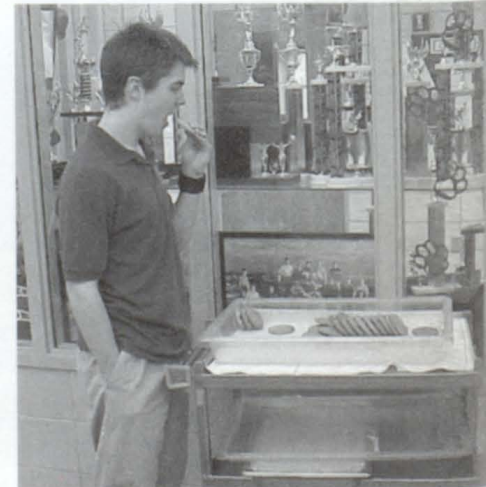

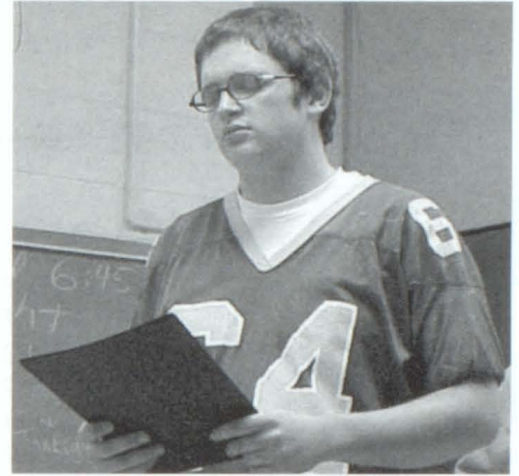

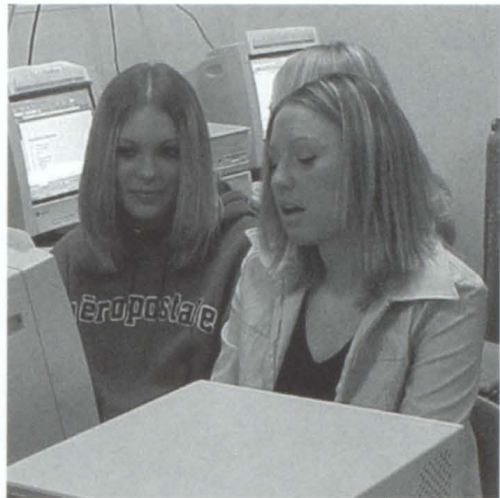

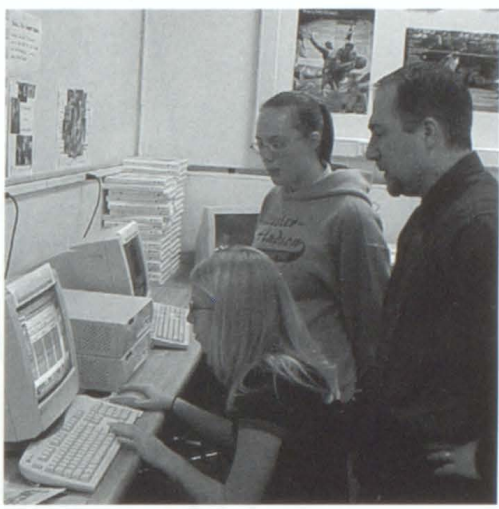

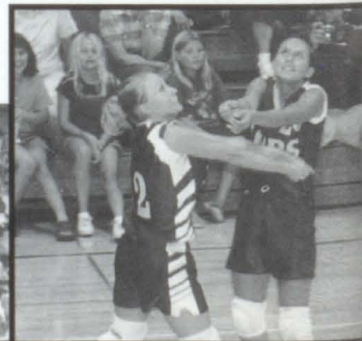

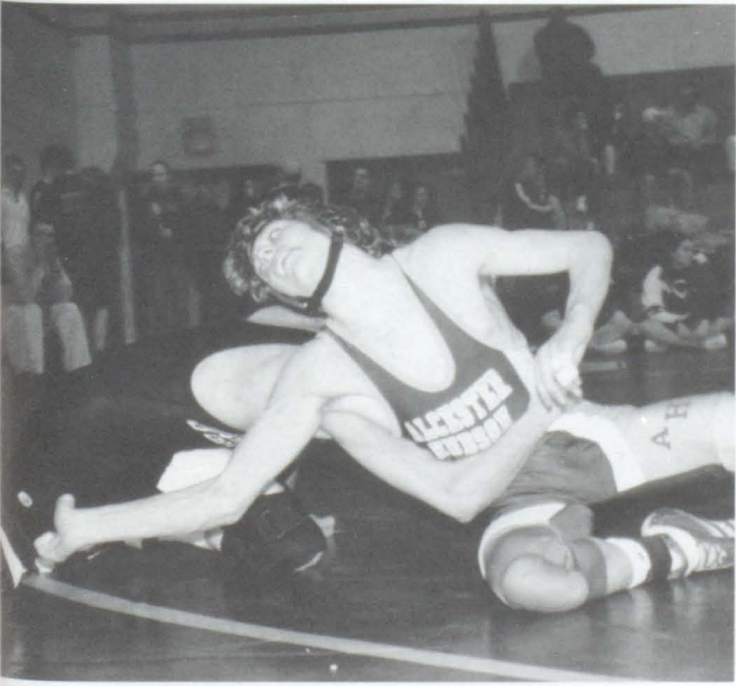

Overall, it was a great season. We hope to see you there again next year!

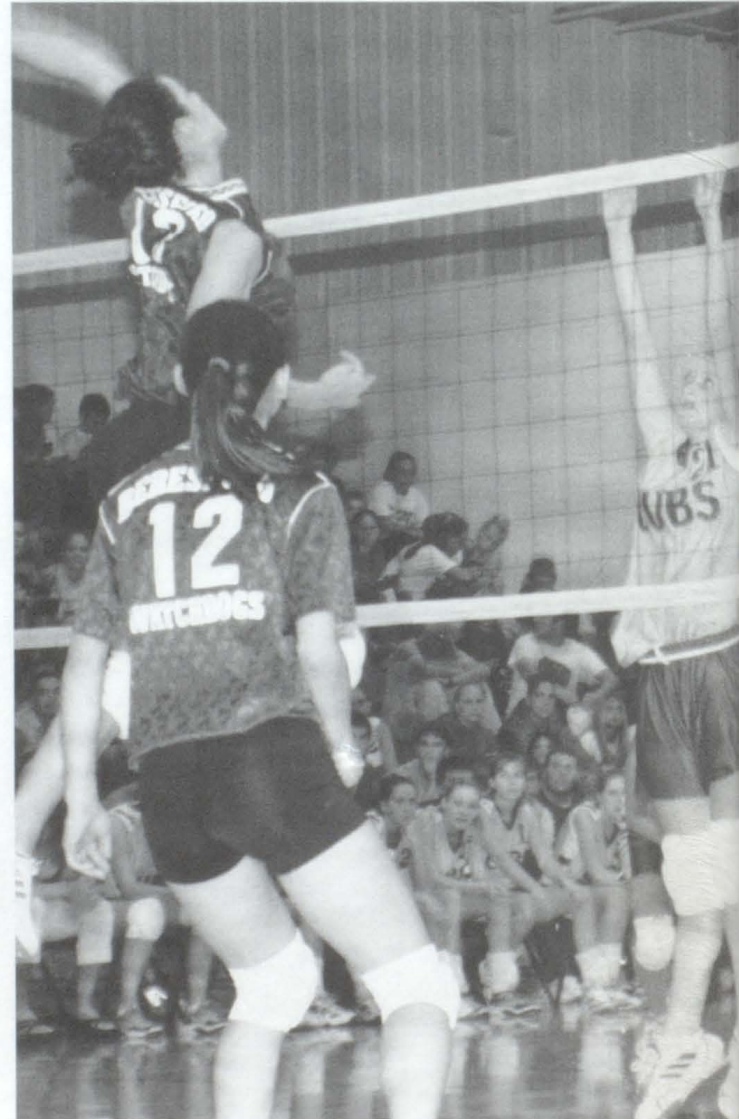

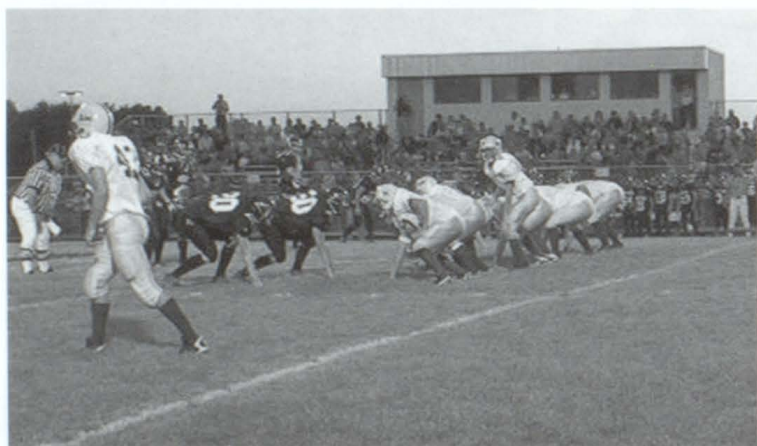
their freshmen year.

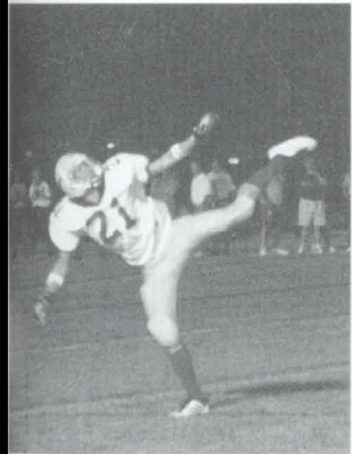
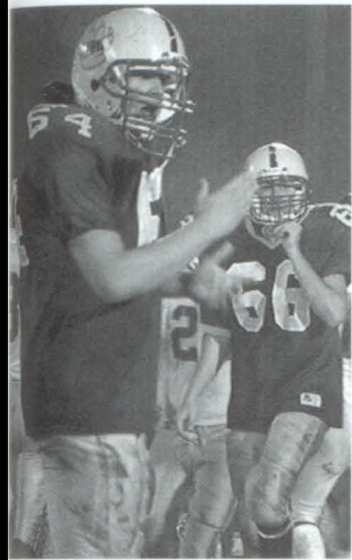

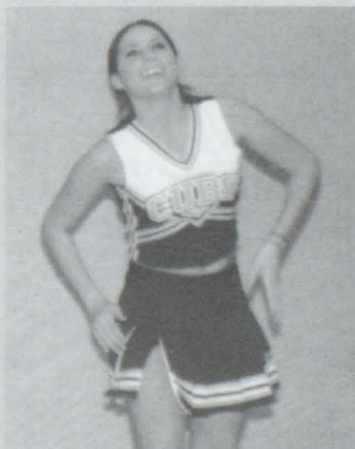

They started the season off with the Chester Invitational, where a majority of the boys placed. Zack and Lowell both finished in first place. Nathan and Chad both placed second.

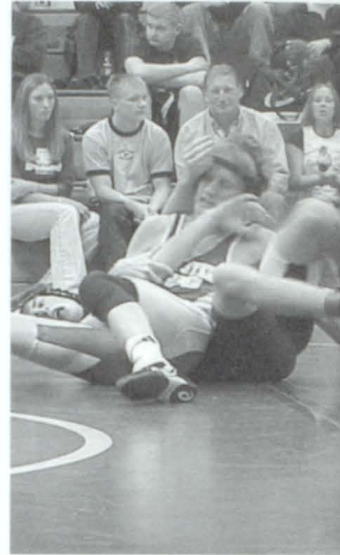
Third place winners were Brian and Carl, and finishing with fourth place was Joe Kezar.

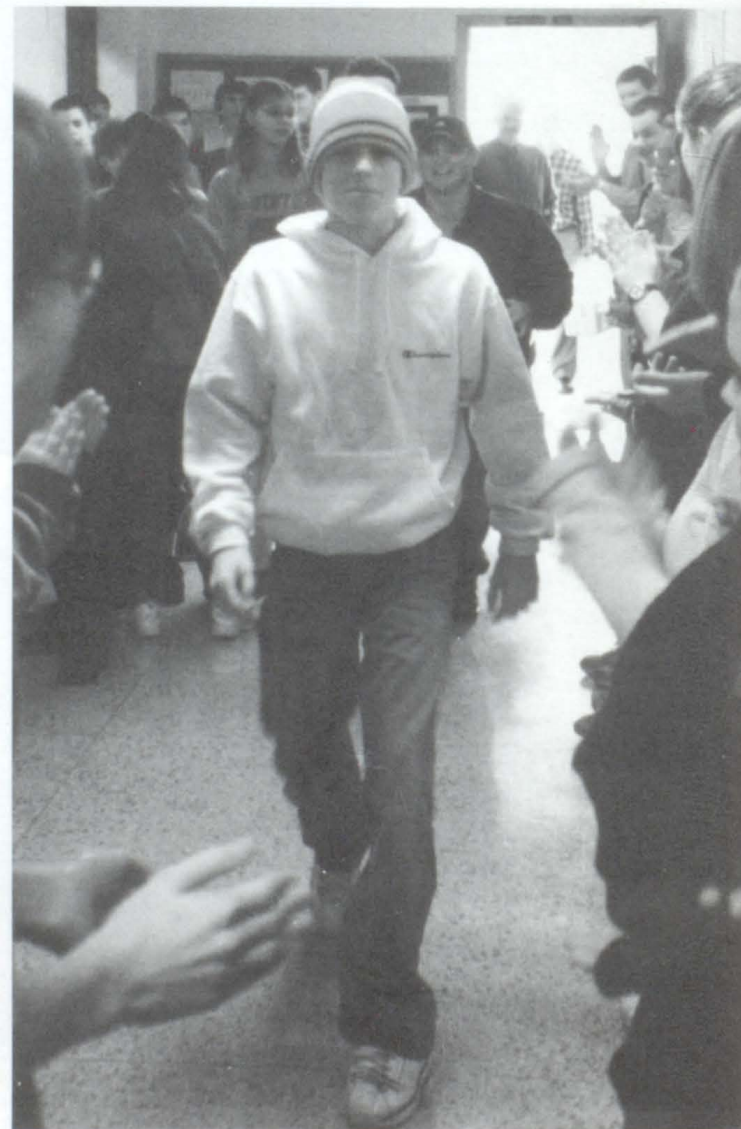

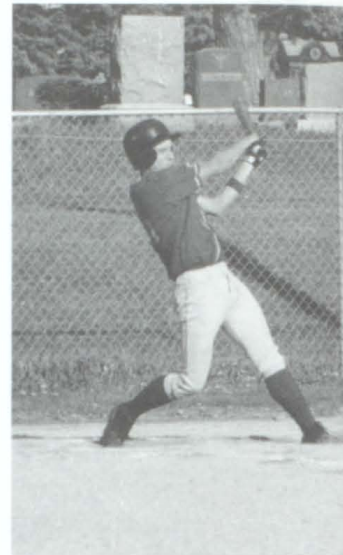
The Cubs started the season shaky, losing to Lennox, but soon turned the season around.
