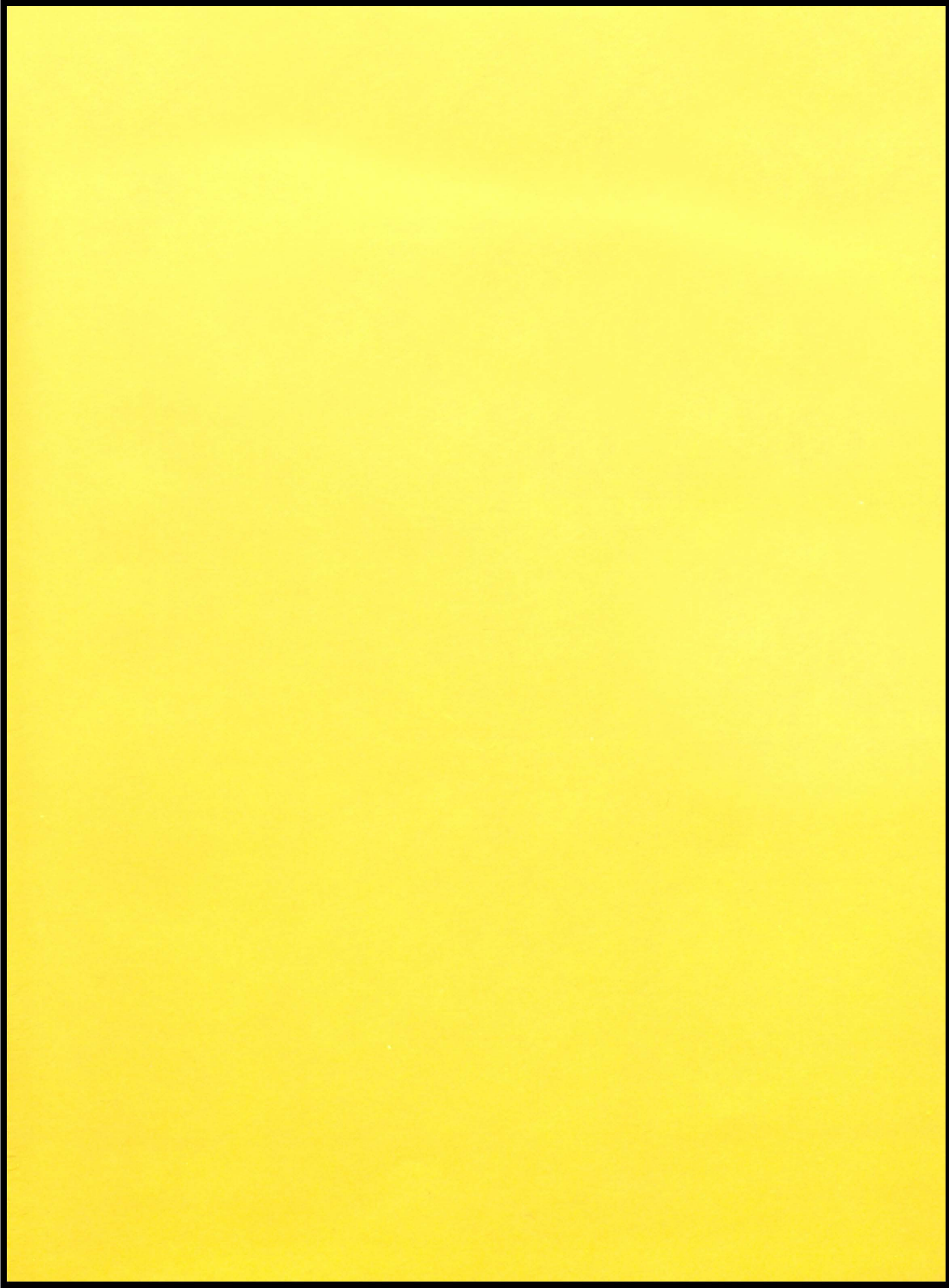


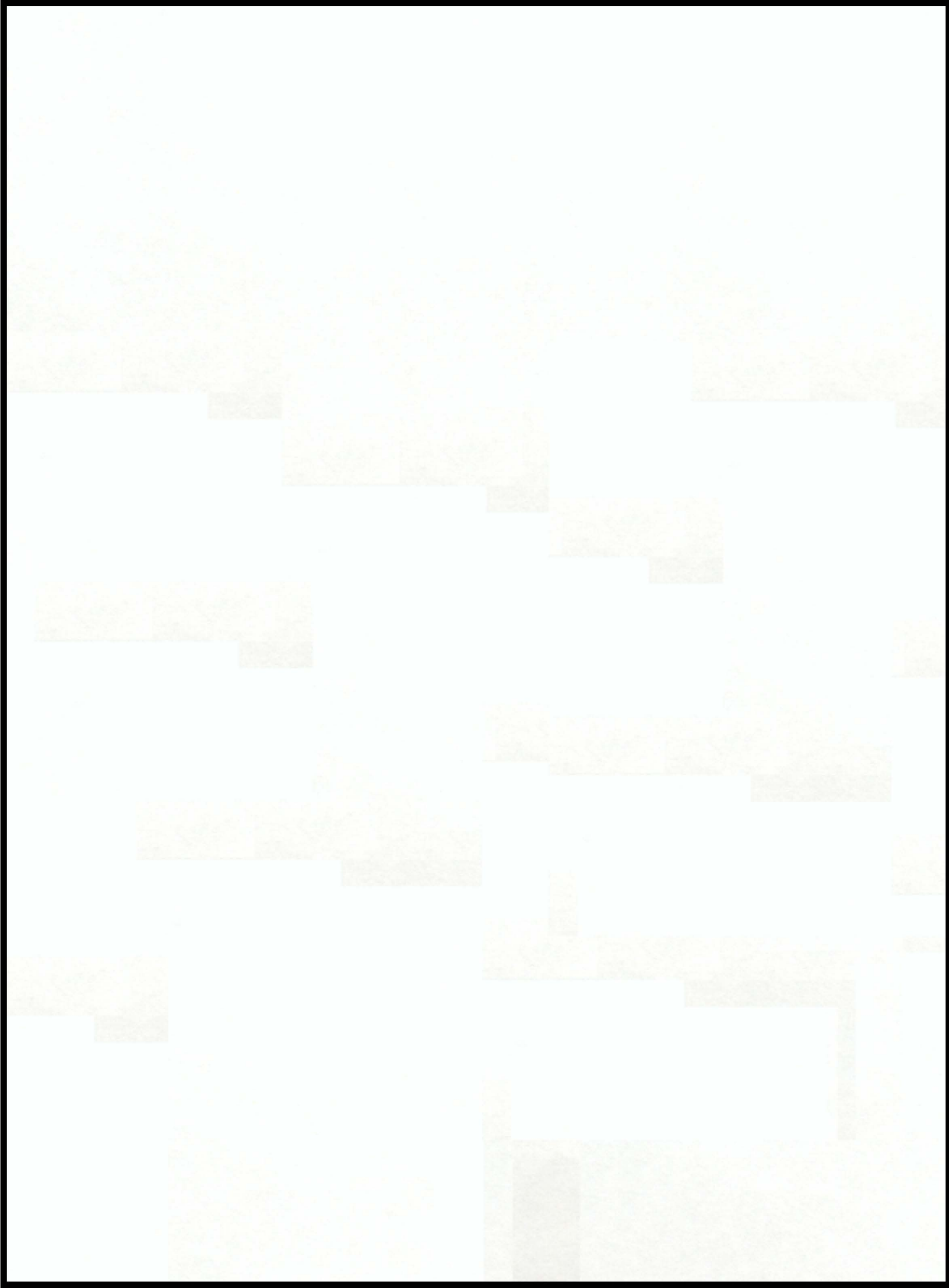

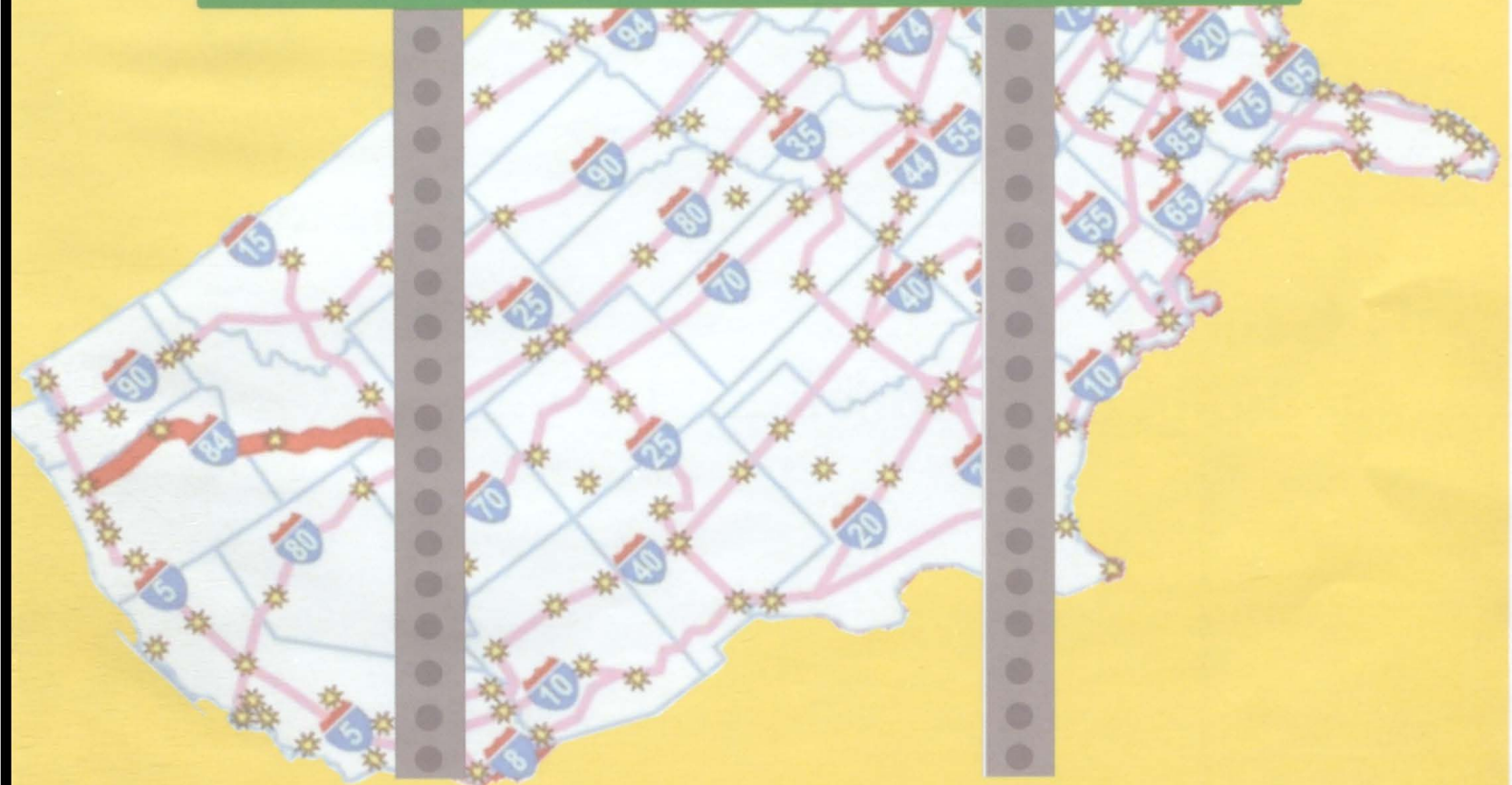

ROAD TRIP

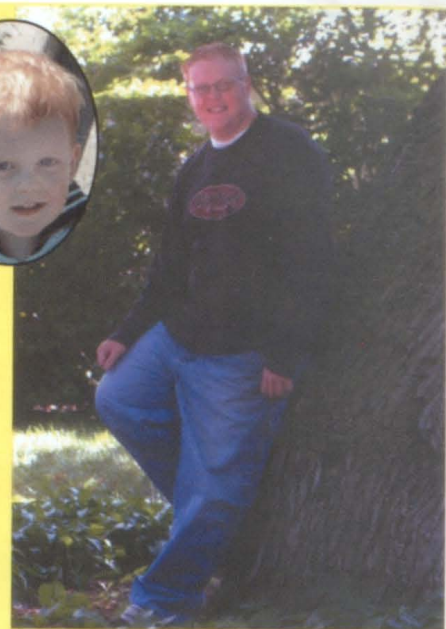

Michael Thompson Sheep Expert

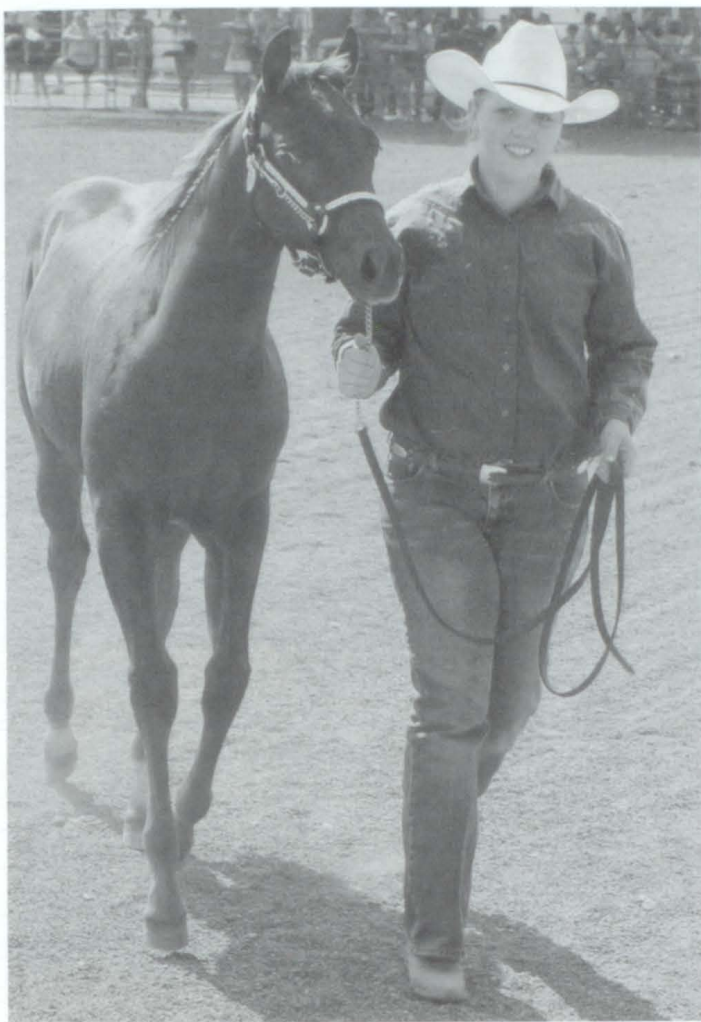

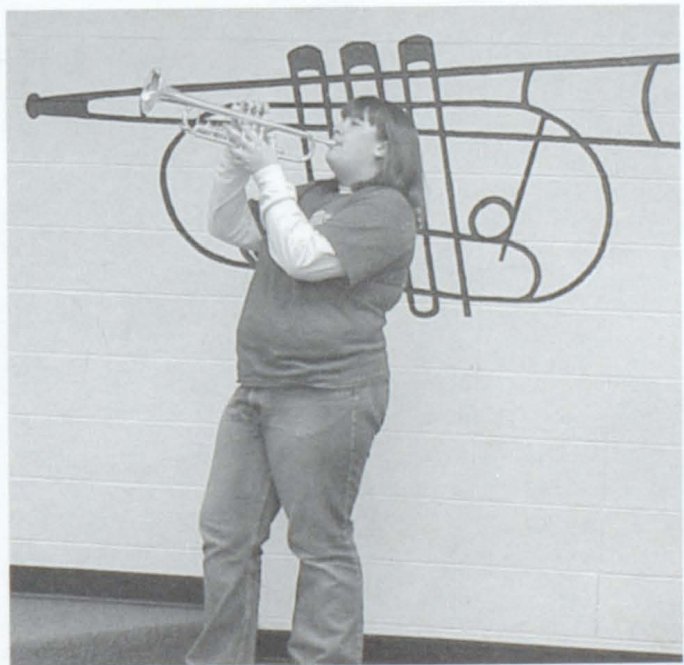
Tricia Schuller Pilot

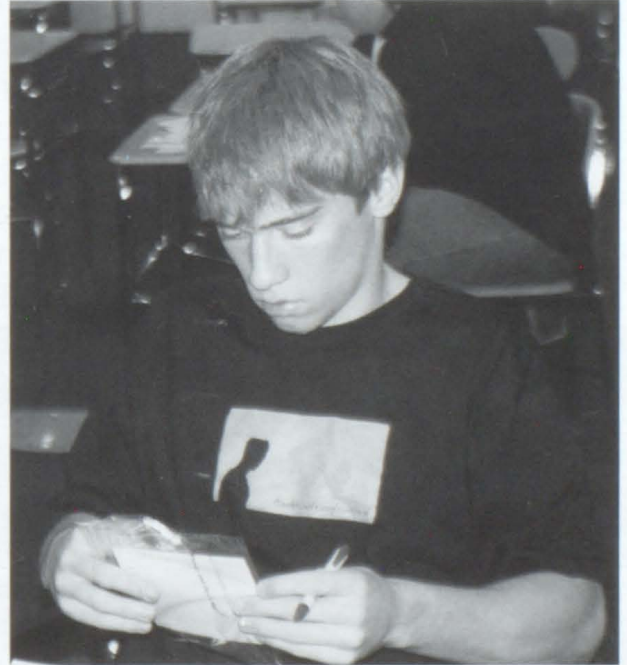

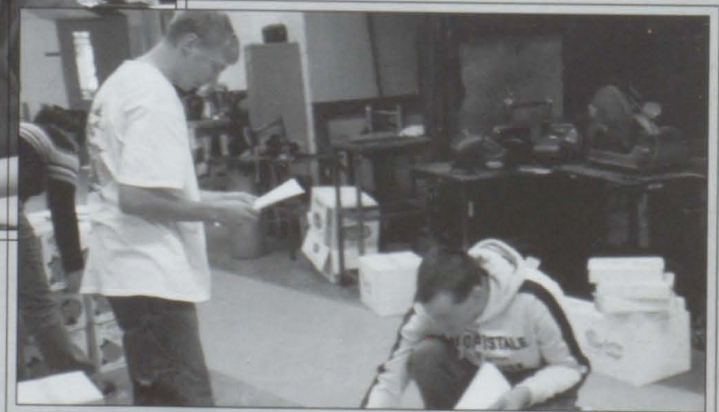

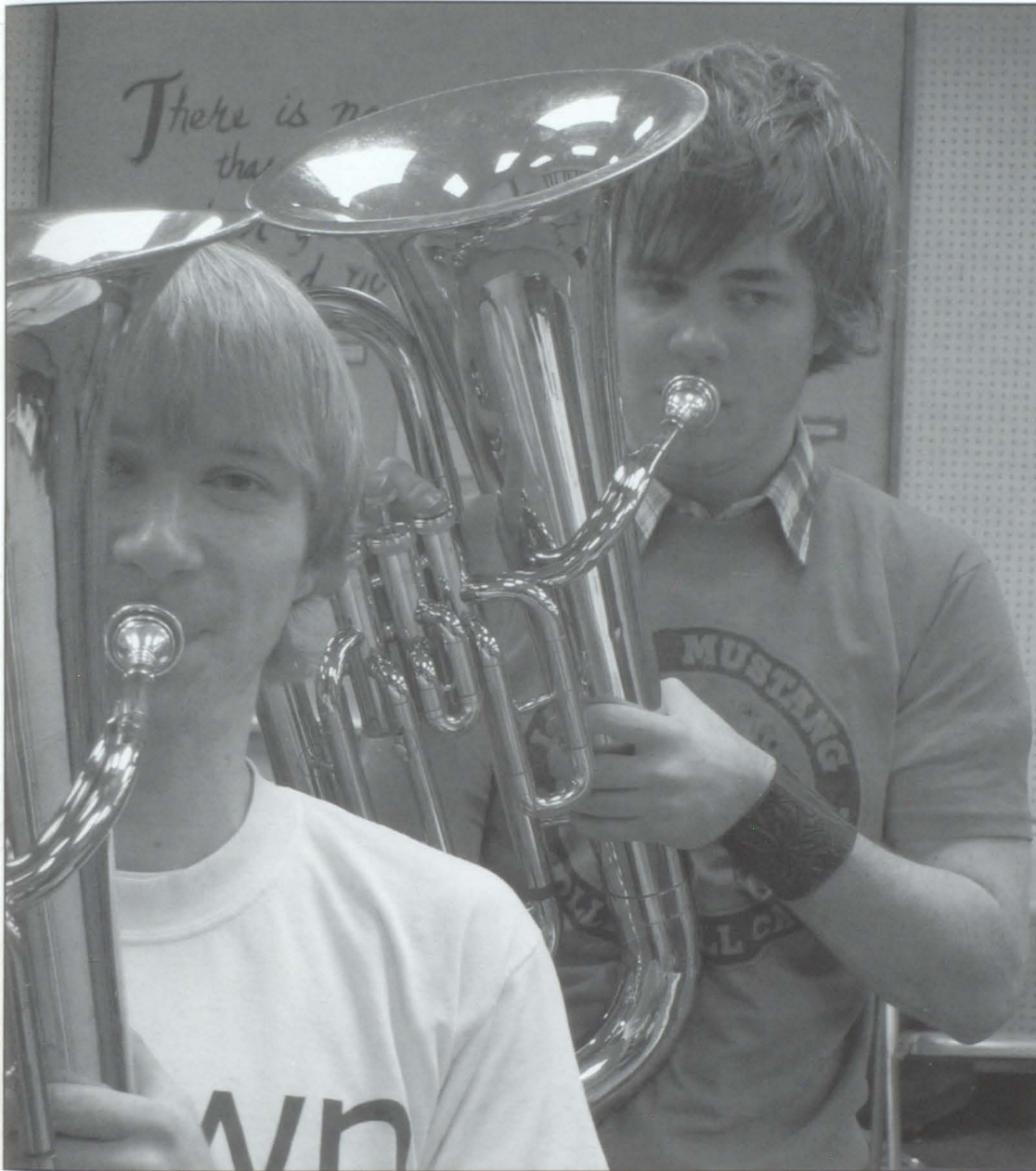

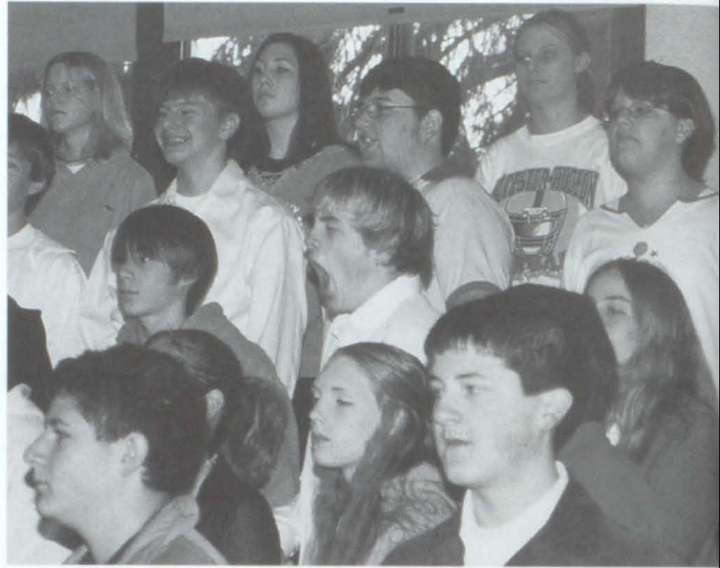

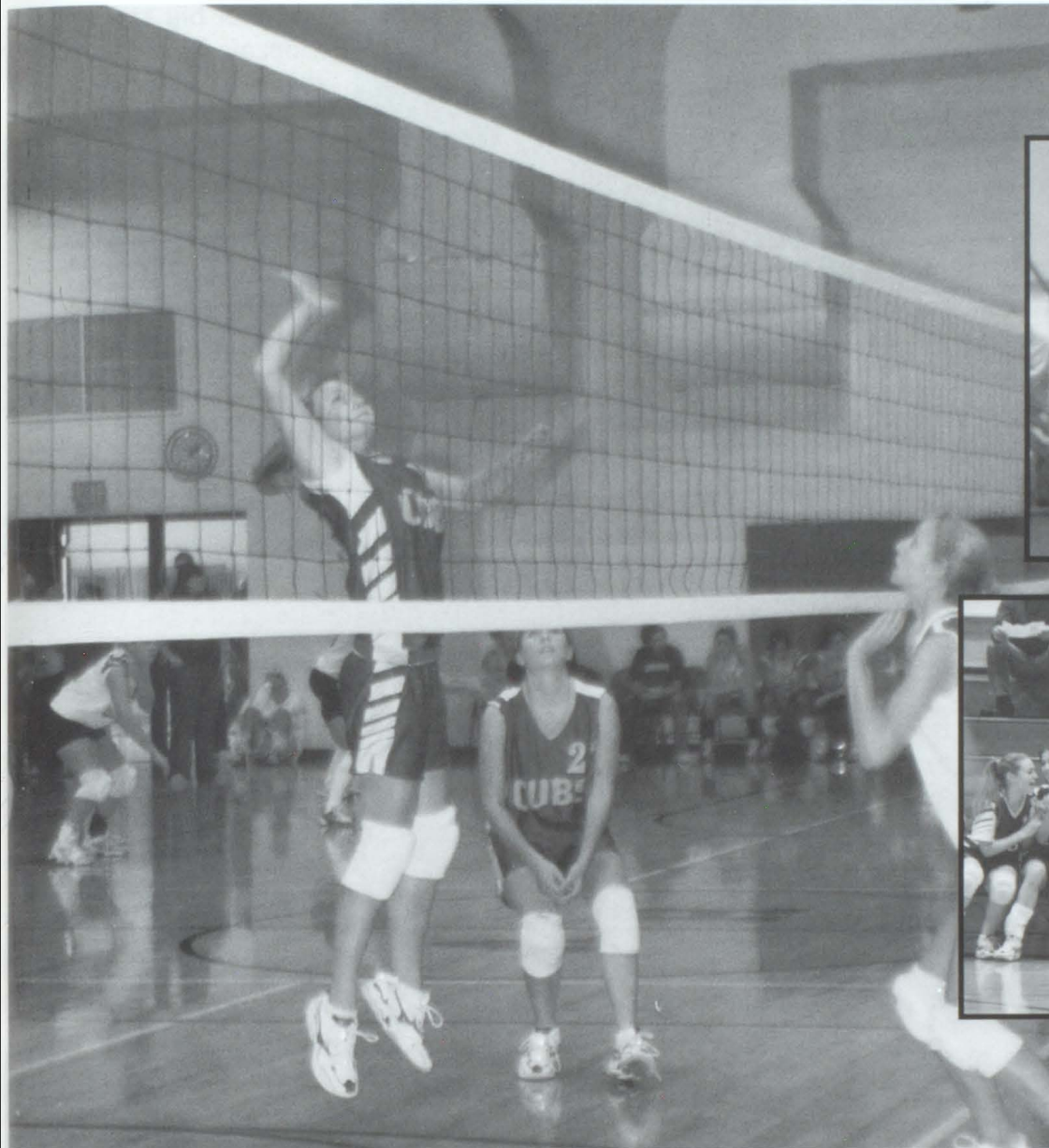

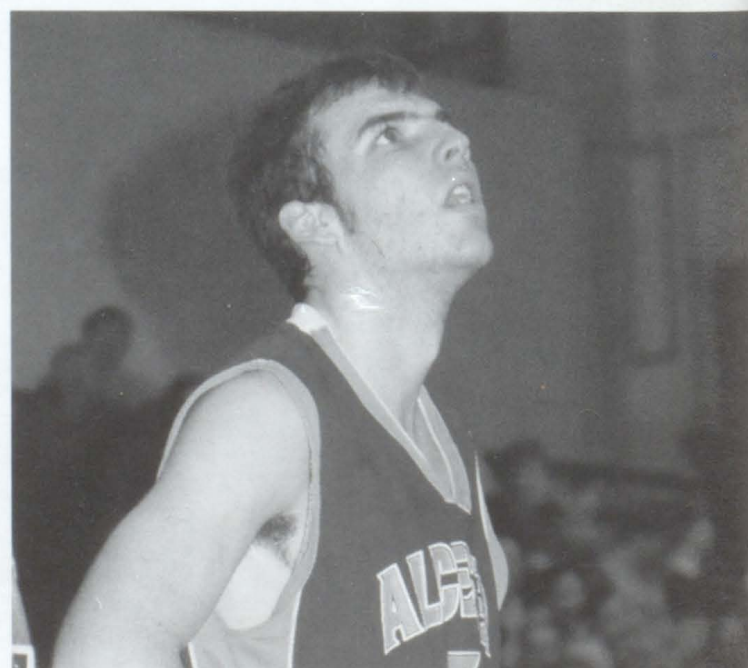

Continuing on with their success in Regions, Nathan Sigman, Carl Serck and Zach DeBruin traveled to the state tournament in Sioux Falls.

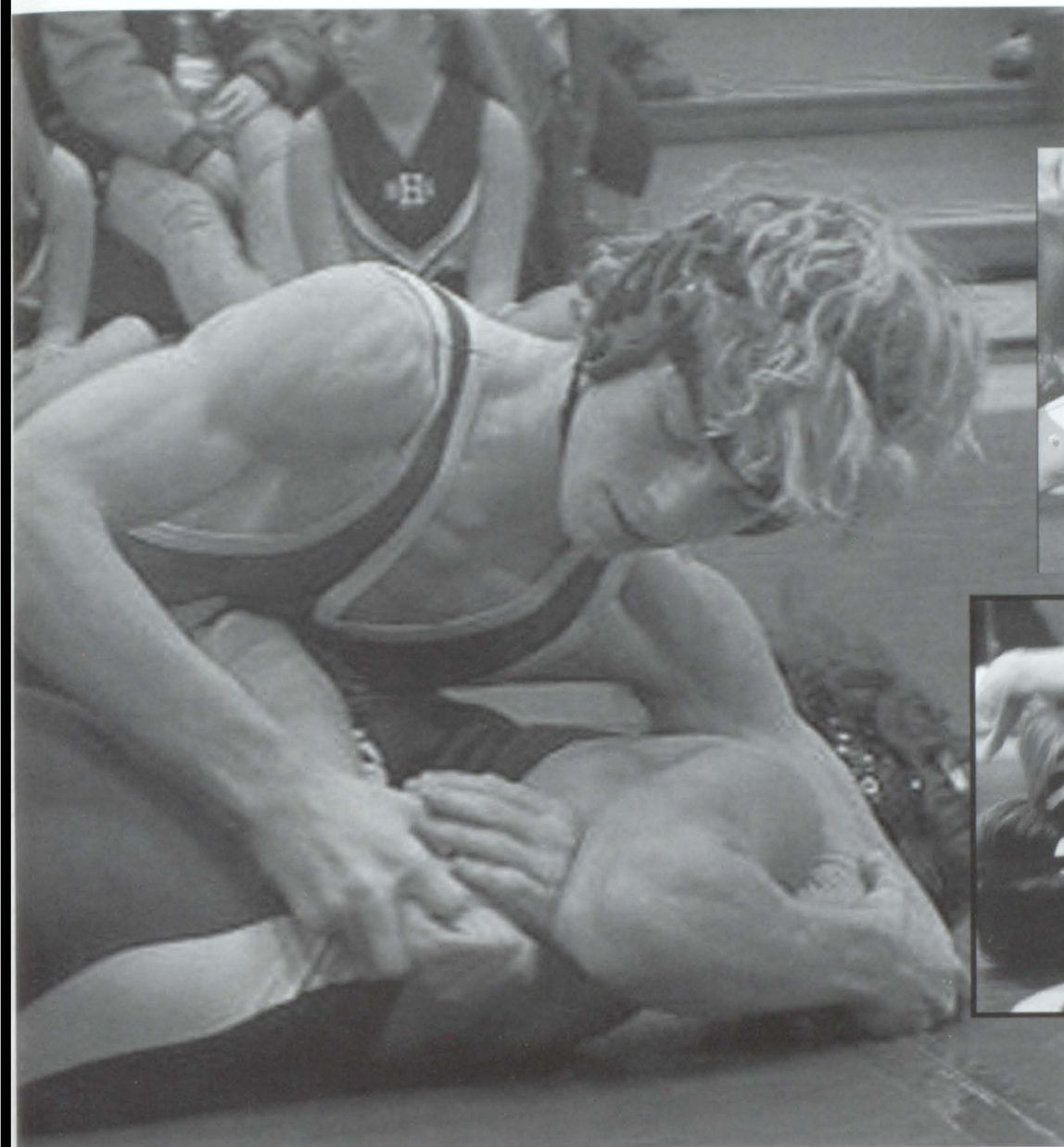
Sigman placed 5th and both Serck and DeBruin were defeated in second round wrestlebacks. Having only one senior finish out the year, the team did very well.



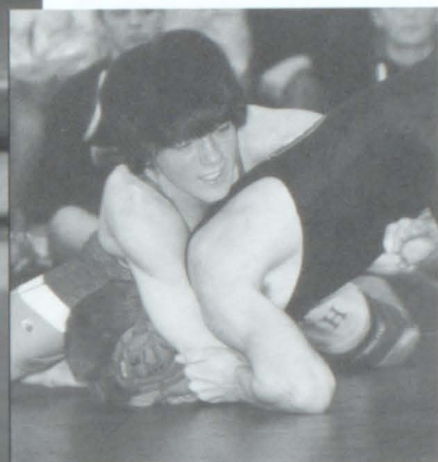

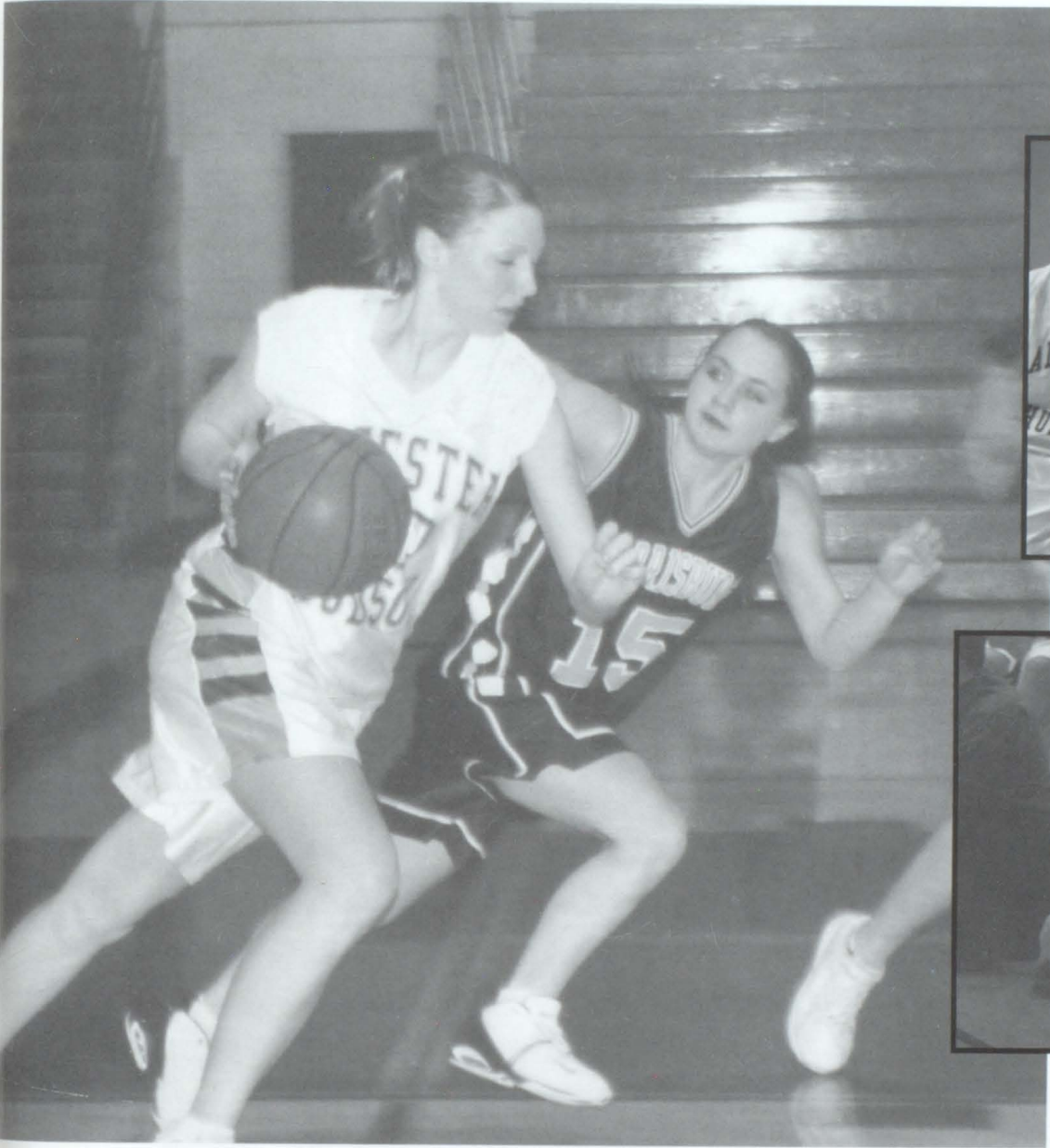

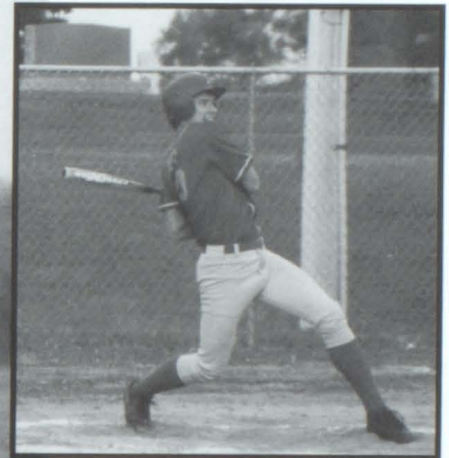

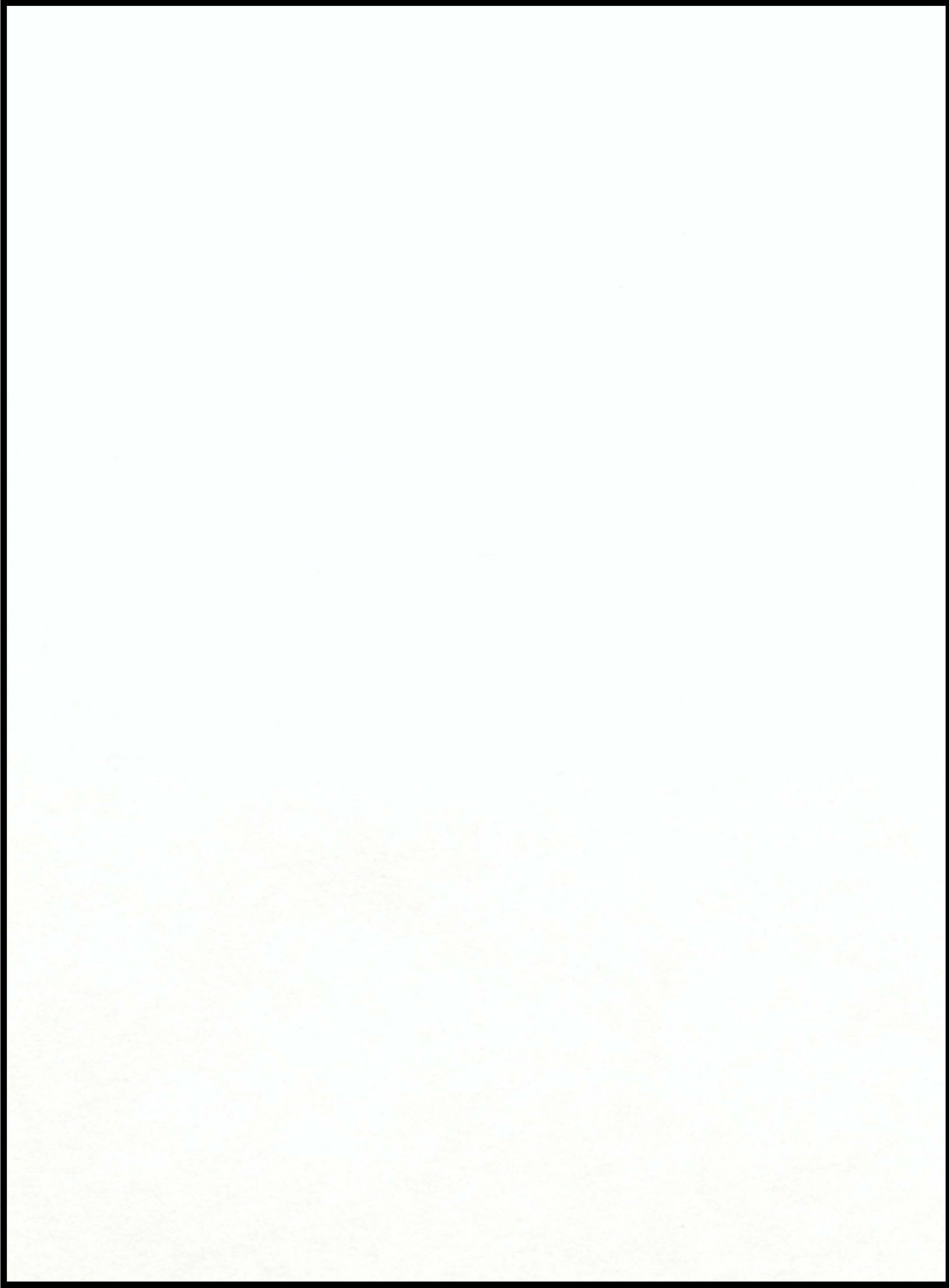
ROAD TRIP

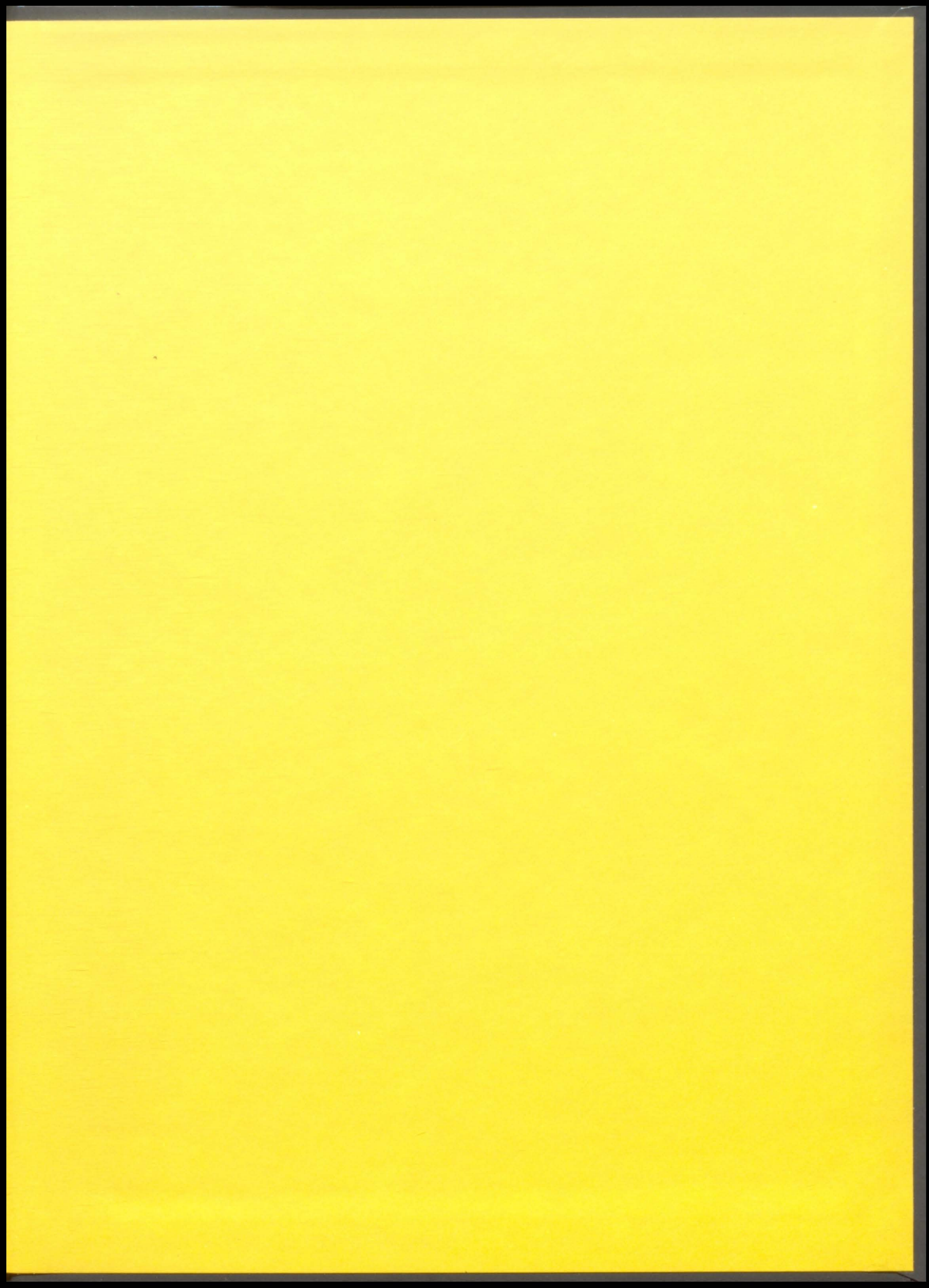
