a tongue and racing to the vending machines before they turned off.




































Same old faces, but way more fun. The year has been filled with the same groups with exciting new adventures of State Conventions and contests.






Being part of the midwest means lots of open fields and very little city life. Those open fields need to be worked by somebody, and there arises our own chapter, the Future Farmers of America.






