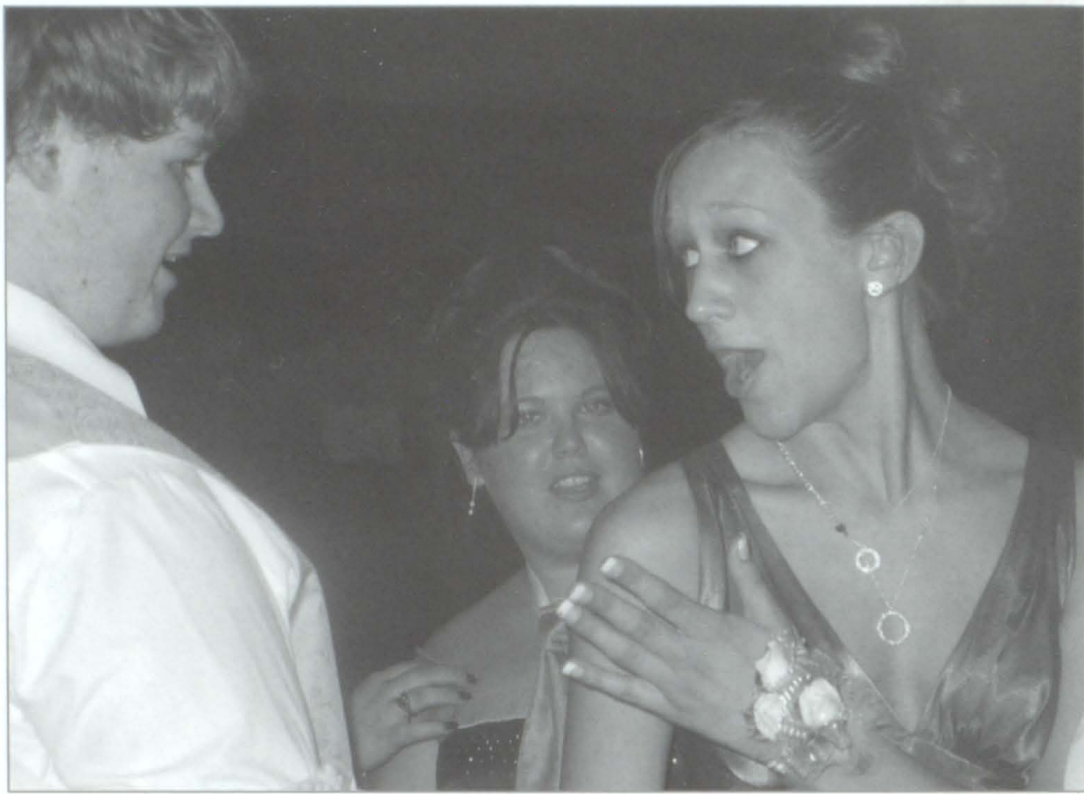

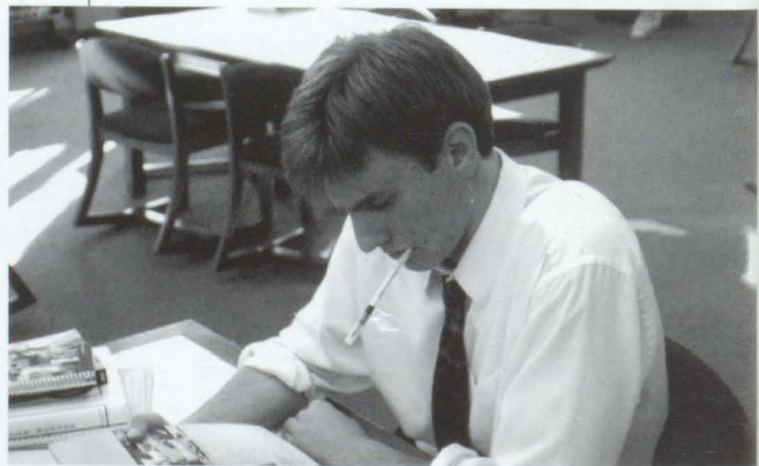
Catapults, pottery and pig dissections, oh my! The balls flew, the clay stuck and the guts drooped as the students survived it all.

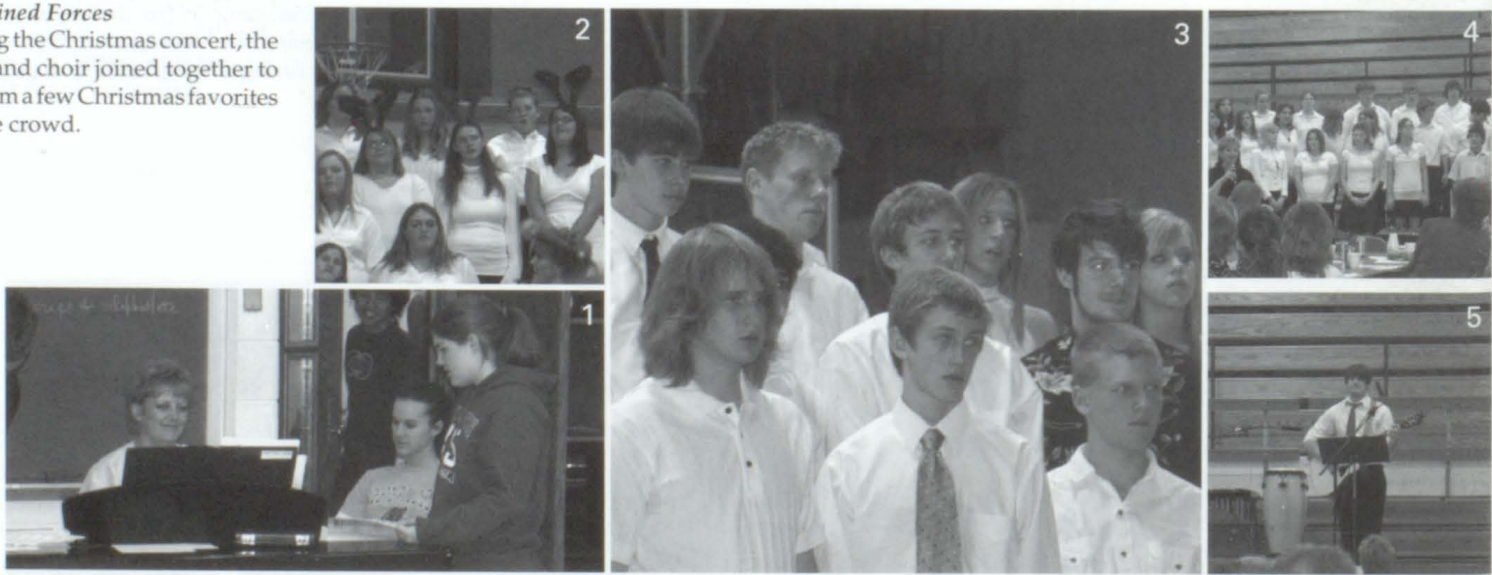

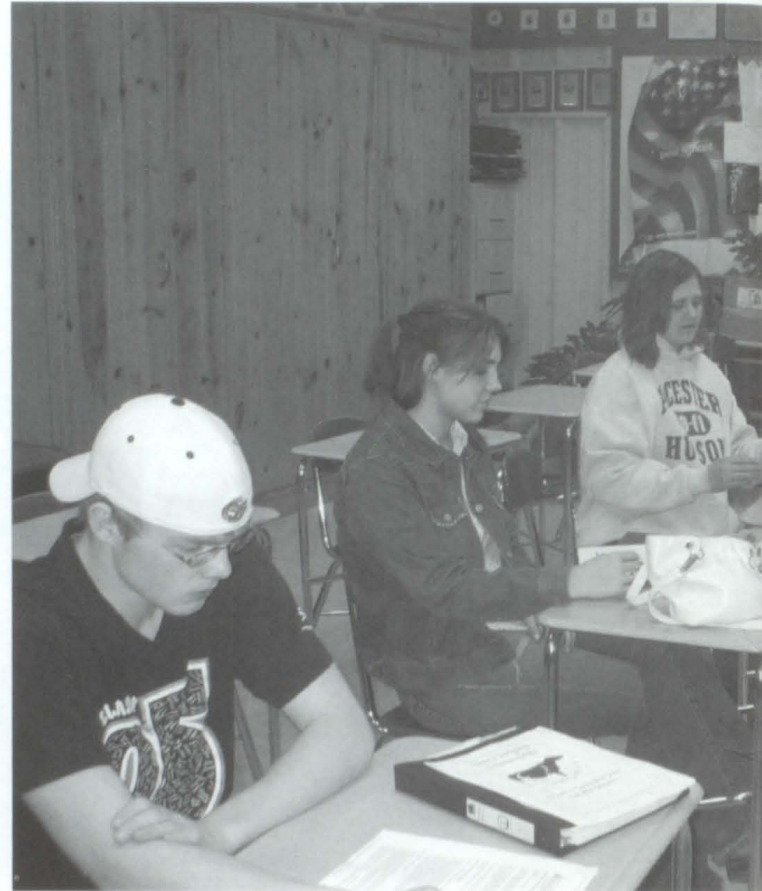
# This Group Nose Farming

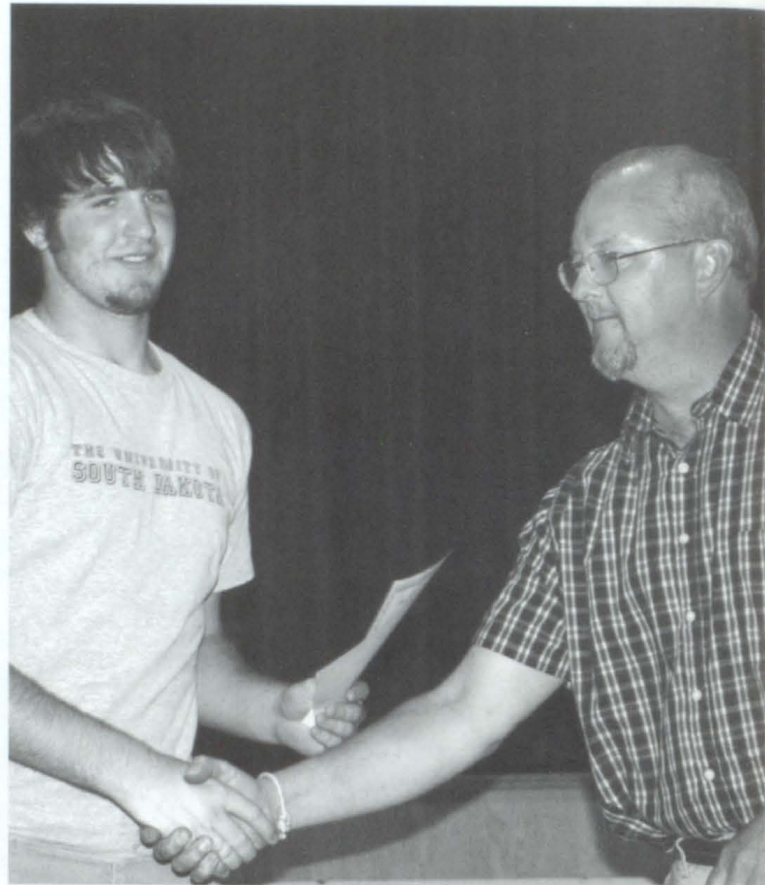

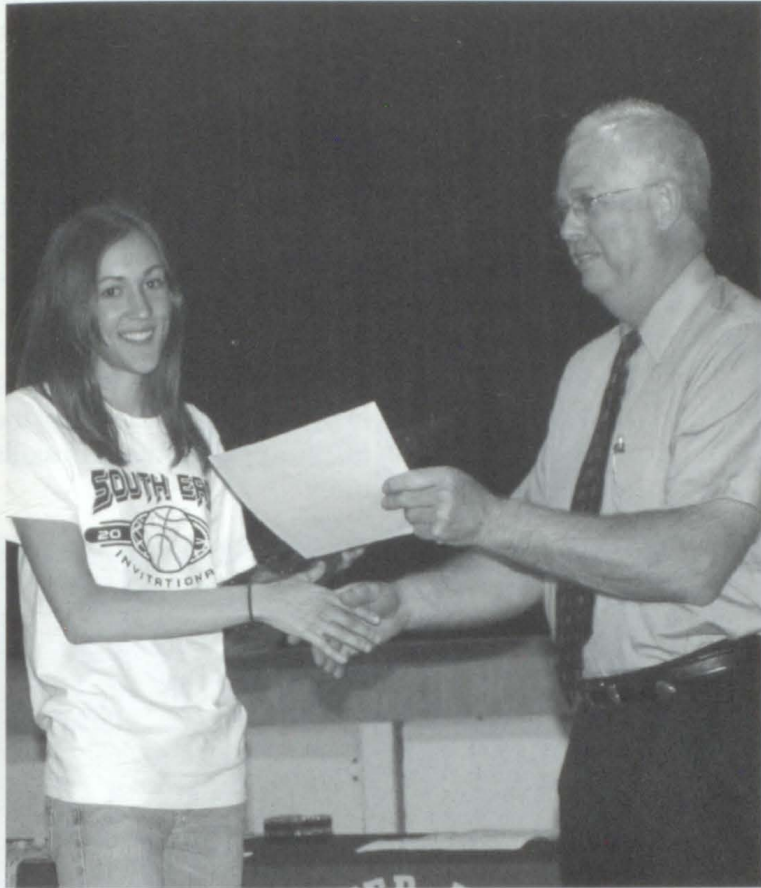

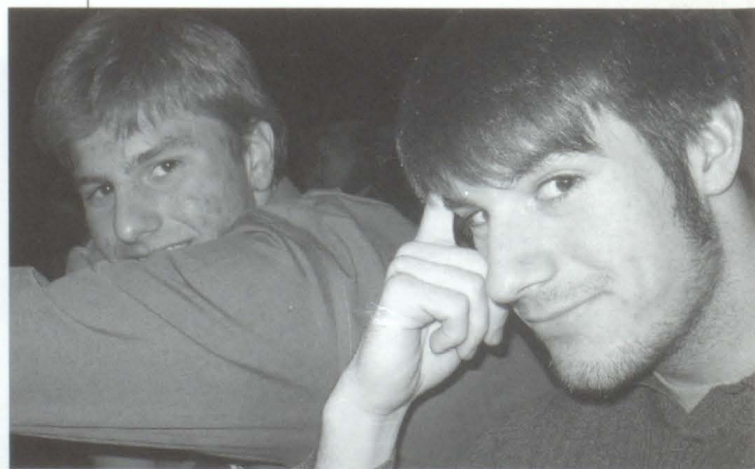

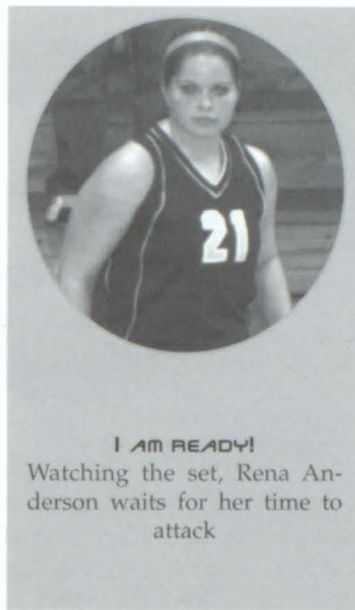

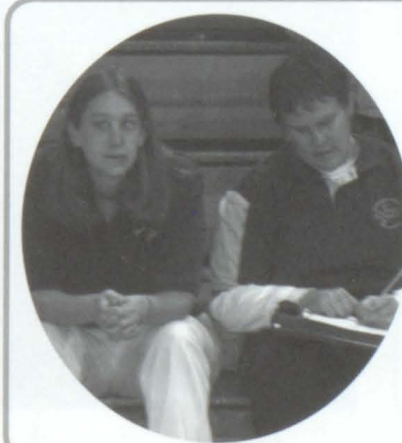

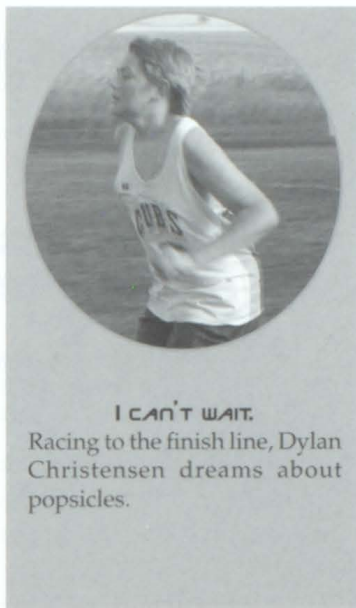

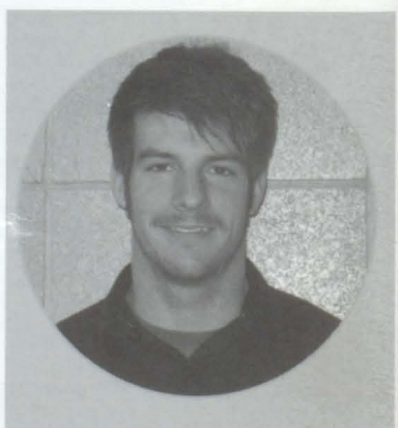

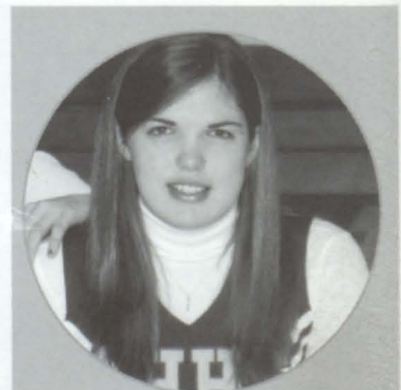

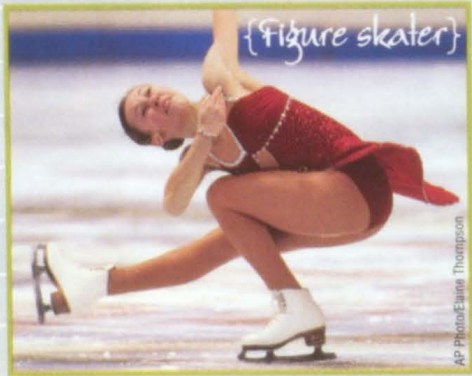

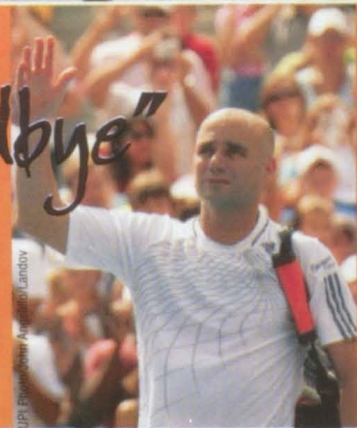

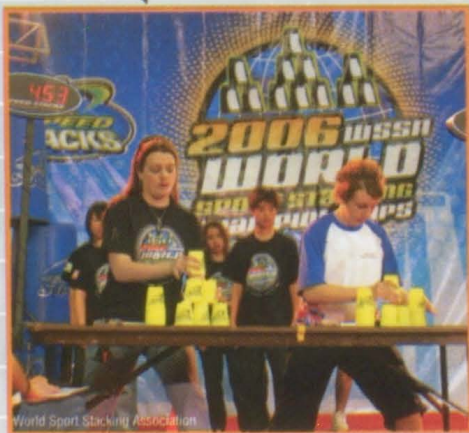

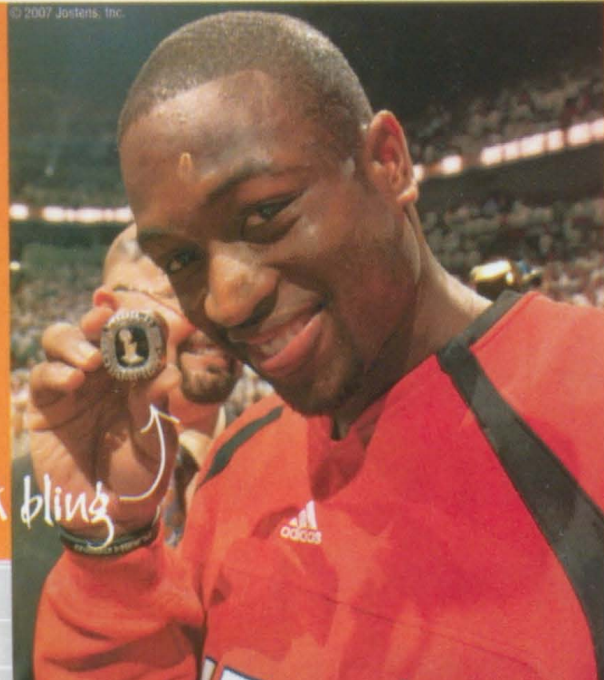






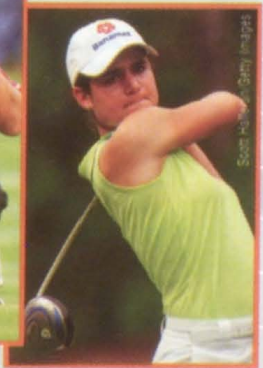

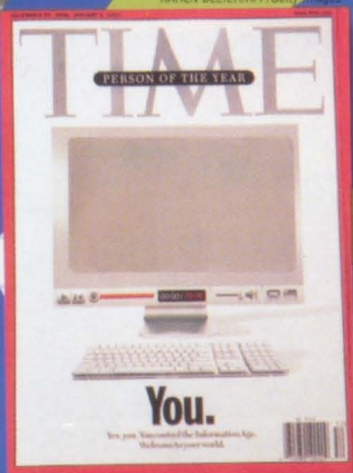
