Fall

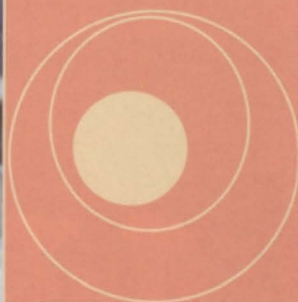

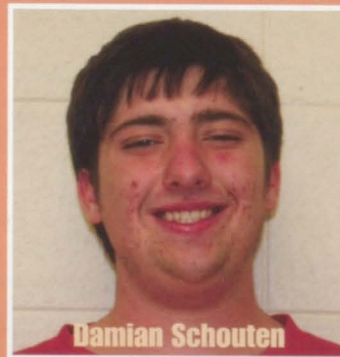

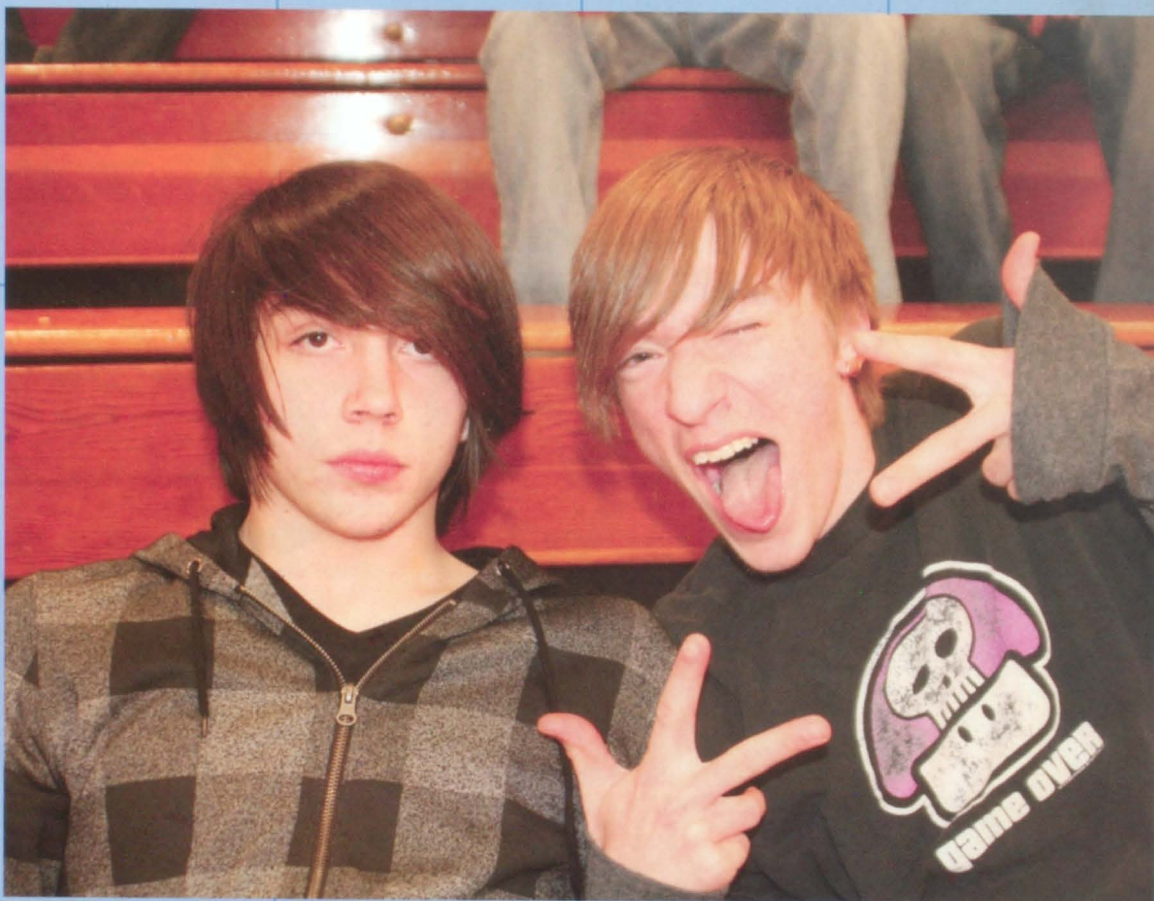

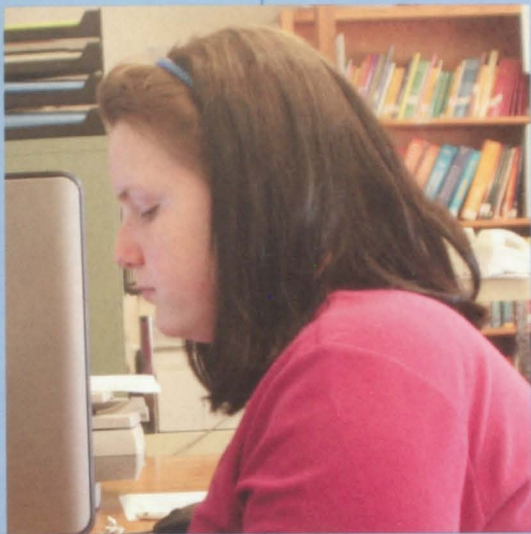
Winter

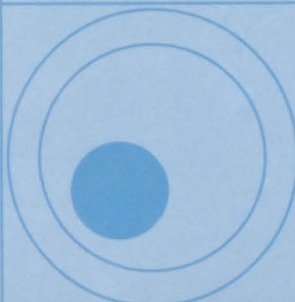

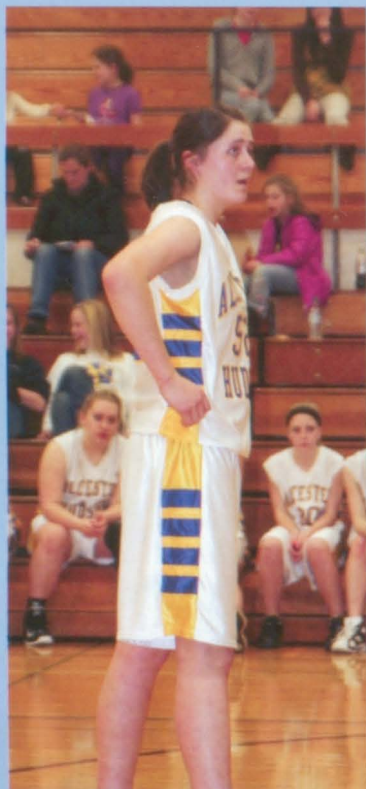

The Lady Cubs 09-10 season consisted of one lone senior, two juniors, four sophomores and two freshmen. During the season, nine eighth graders were moved to Varsity. Coach Shannon Hames returned for a second year of head coaching being assisted by Joni Schempp.

Because of the weather, half of their games were postponed and the Dell Rapids St. Mary's game was rescheduled three times. The Cubs participated in the Tri-Valley Conference Tournament and took seventh in Centerville.

After their regular season the girls headed to Centerville for Districts. They had a bye the first round but finished the season, with the most intense game of the year, falling to Centerville 57-50 in the last minute. By only losing one senior, the girls plan to come back next year with a state title.

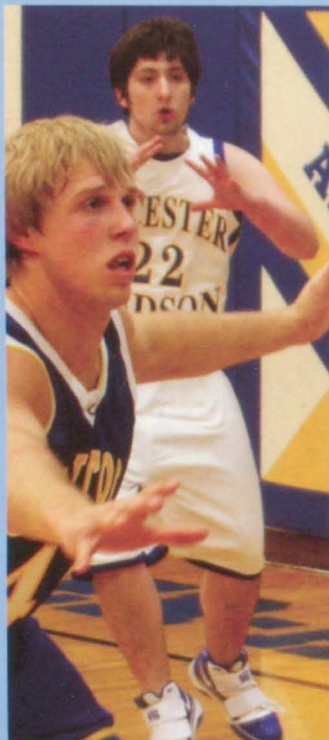

Anderson, Busch and Damian Schouten will be missed next season. This will mean that the Cubs have to rely on the juniors to make the record one to remember.



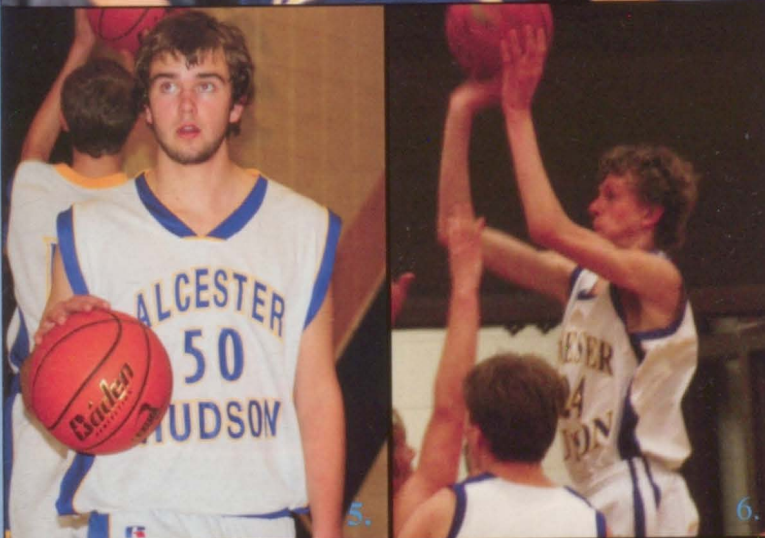
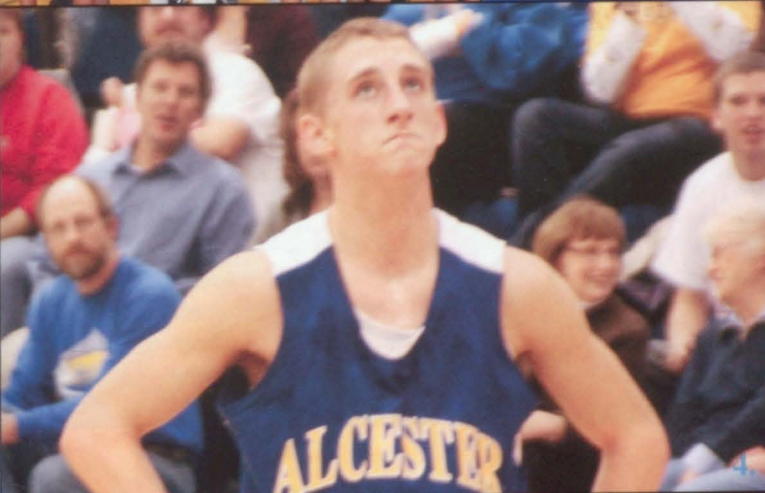

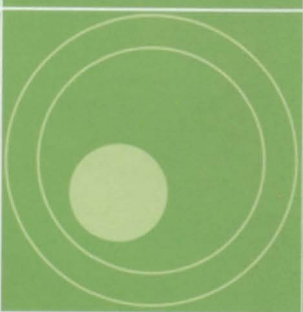
Spring Divider

With spring students prepared to depart for the much-awaited summer, but also said goodbye to Mr. Rhead and Mr. Bergland.

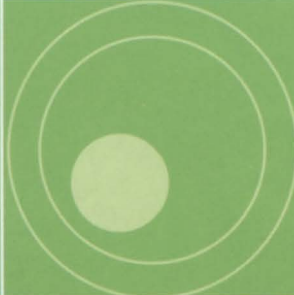

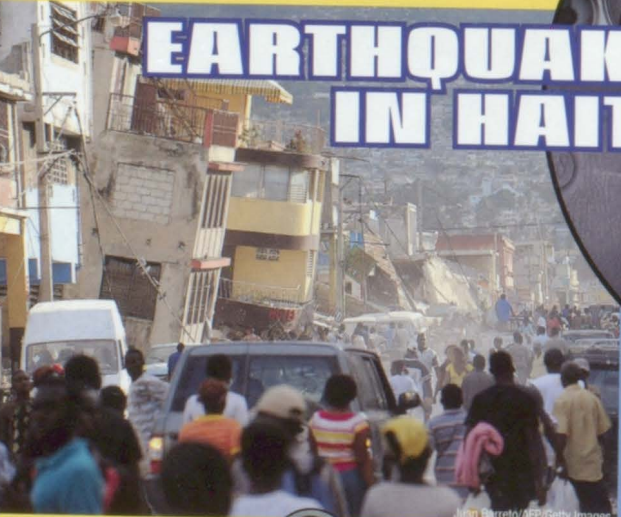

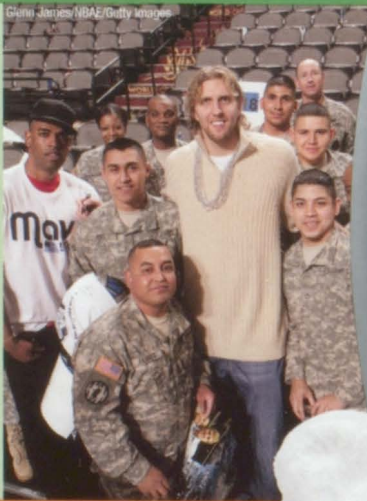

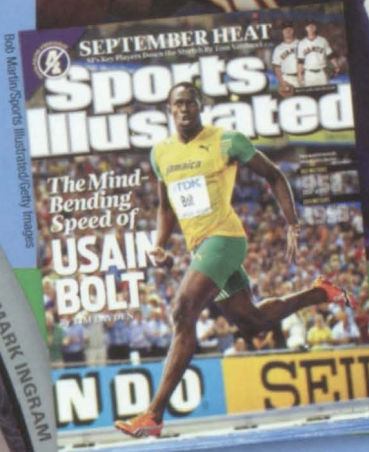

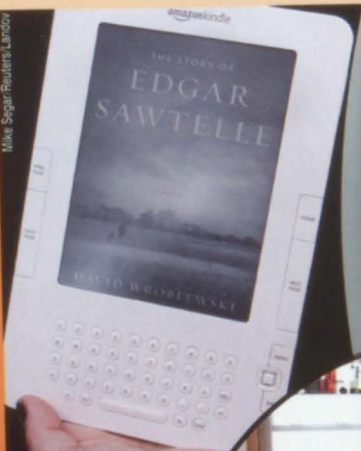
