Landon Nygard

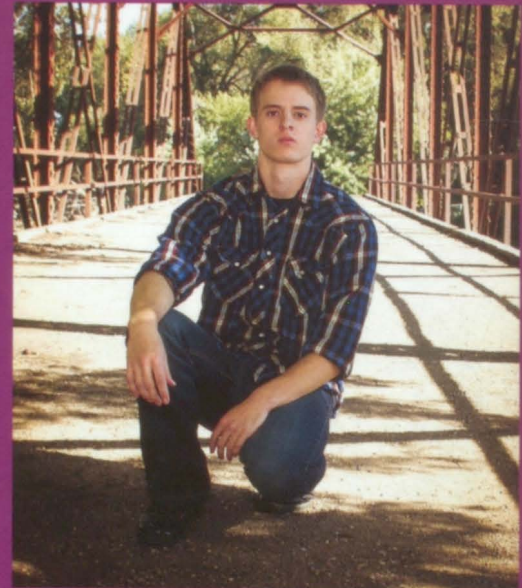

Jesse Osterloh

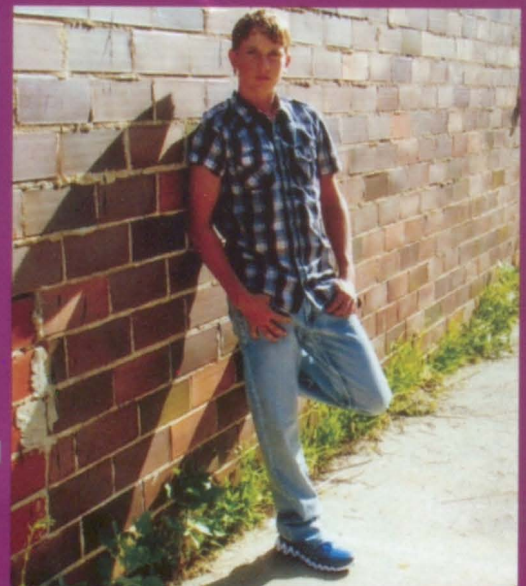

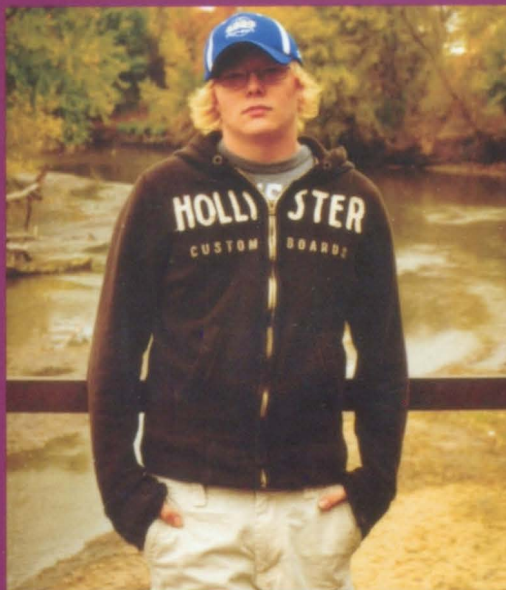


Lindsey Terpstra

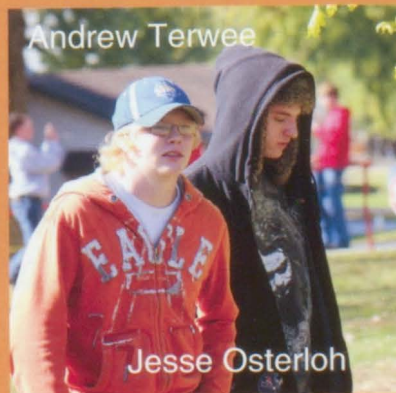

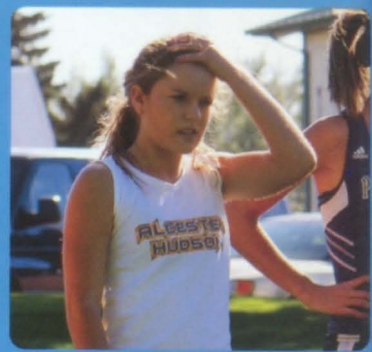
