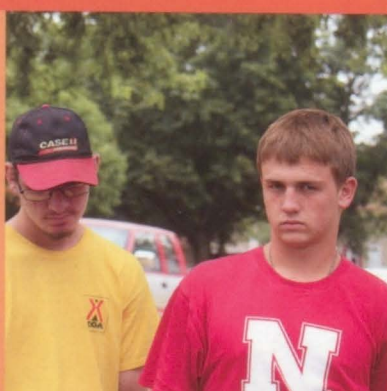

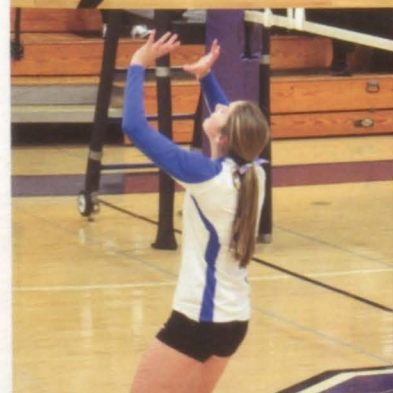

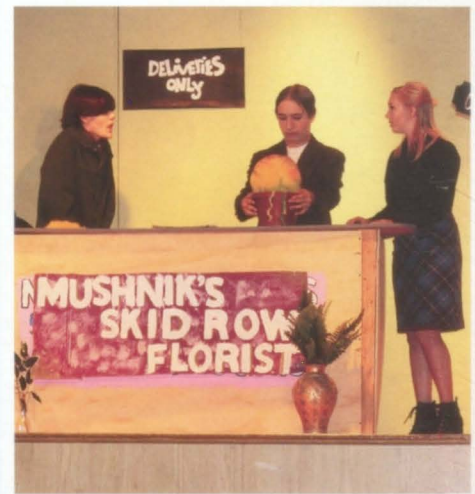

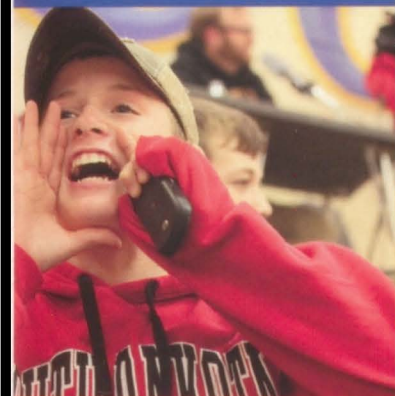

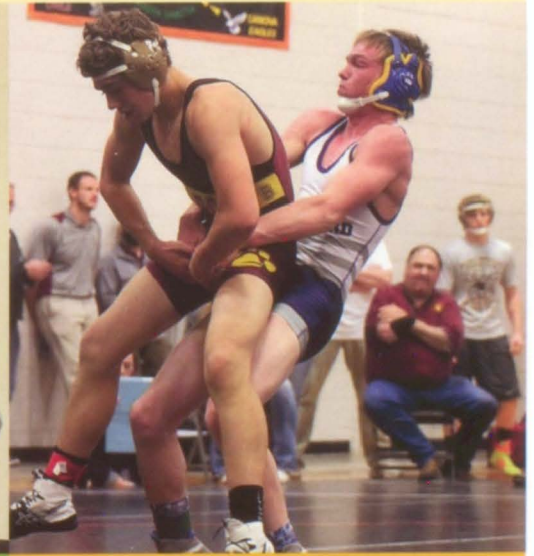

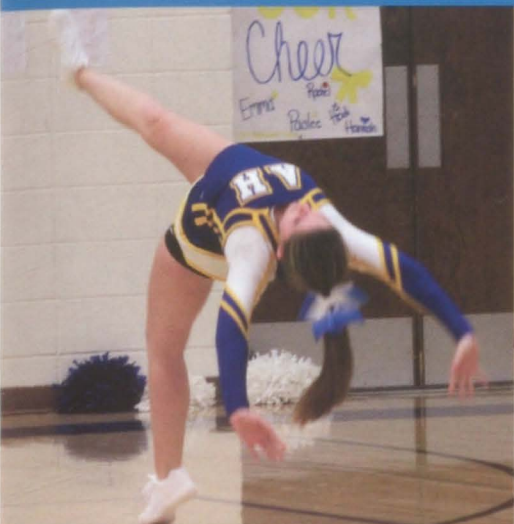

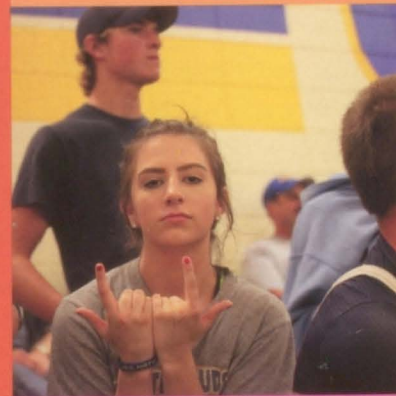

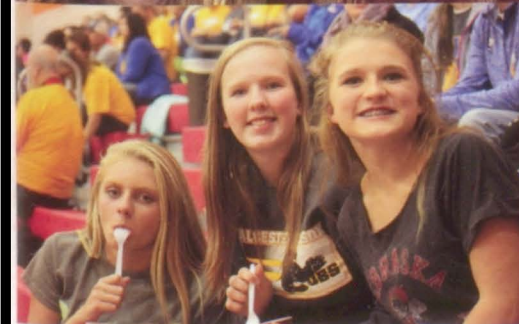

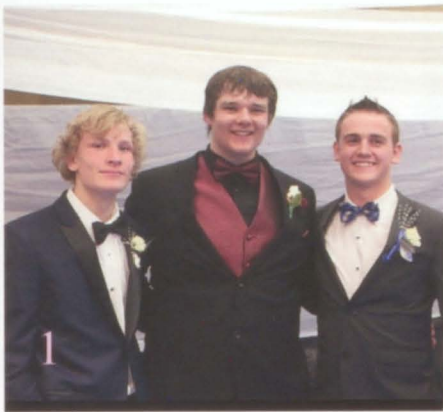
Prom: I Could Not Ask for More
