









Under the direction of Mrs. JoAnn Rozell, the Drama Class gained valuable experience.










Sophomores Face New Responsibilities



Cubs See Best Season



Highlights of the year were winning the Holiday Tournament, placing 3rd in the Conference, and 3rd in the District 23 Tourney.






Wrestlers Have Good Year
























Boys Send 5 to State








