







A few of students commented on the musical. Mark Smith said, "It was the best performance I have ever seen." Brian Larson commented, "I felt moved emotionally and


physically." Märit Serck, who played the part of Mrs. Macafee, said, "I never had to worry about entrances; all I had to do was follow Trace around."


















